

county of Norfolk; (3.) the parish of Swardeston with Mangreen, and the adjoining parishes of East Carlton, Ketteringham, Intwood, Keswick, and Dunston, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk; (4.) the parish of Bintry, and the adjoining parishes of Twyford, Foulsham, Foxley, North Elmham, Billingford, and Bawdeswell, in the Northern Division of the county of Norfolk;—which were declared by Order of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The hundred of Gallow, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk, which was declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is, except the parishes of Helhoughton, Tatterford, West Rudham, and East Rudham, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth-disease.

5.—(1.) The hundred of Freebridge Marshland, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk; (2.) the hundred of Freebridge Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk; (3.) the hundred of Smithdon, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk; (4.) the parishes of Helhoughton, Tatterford, West Rudham, and East Rudham, in the hundred of Gallow, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk; (5.) the borough of King's Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk; and (6.) the parish of Reedham, and the adjoining parishes of Limpenhoe, Freethorpe, and Wickhampton, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk; shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

An area comprising the hundred of Clackclose, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk, with the exception of the parishes of Denver, Ryston, West Dereham, Eastmore, Barton Bendish, Beachamwell, Werekham, Boughton, Stoke Ferry, Wretton, Roxham, Fordham, Hilgay, and Southery.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parish of Yardley, in the county of Worcester, as lies south of the main-road from Birmingham to Coventry, and the borough of Dudley; (2.) the parish of Stockton, the chapelry of Orleton, so much of the parish of Stanford as lies on the Orleton side of the main-road from Stanford Bridge to the High House, and so much

of the parish of Lindridge as lies east of the road from Meadows Mill to the junction with the main road from Eardiston to Stockton and south of the last-mentioned road between the said junction and the parish of Stockton, in the county of Worcester; and (3.) the parish of Frankley, and so much of the parish of Kingsnorton as lies on the Frankley side of the main-road from the boundary of the parish of Bromsgrove at Rubery Hill to Long Bridge, and thence to the boundary of the parish of Northfield at Pigeon House Hill, in the county of Worcester;—which were declared by Orders of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Bedfordshire.—The parishes of Biggleswade, Potton, and Sutton, in the petty sessional division of Biggleswade, in the county of Bedford.

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) The whole of the parishes of Cholesbury, and Hawridge, and such portions of the parishes of Buckland, and Drayton Beauchamp, as lie to the south-east of the bridle-way leading from Leylands Farm in the parish of Buckland to Oaken Grove Farm, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) The parish of Wotton Underwood, in the county of Buckingham.

Cambridgeshire.—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, in the county of Cambridge.

(2.) The parishes of Chesterton, Histon, Milton, Waterbeach, Landbeach, Impington, and Cottenham, in the petty sessional division of Cambridge, in the county of Cambridge.

(3.) The parishes of Caxton, and Little Gransden, in the petty sessional division of Caxton, in the county of Cambridge.

(4.) The parish of West Wrattling, and so much of the adjacent parish of Balsham as is in the occupation of Thomas Burkis, in the petty sessional division of Linton, in the county of Cambridge.

(5.) The parishes of Burwell, and Wicken, and the hamlet of Burwell Reach, in the petty sessional division of Newmarket, in the county of Cambridge.

Carnarvonshire.—The parishes of Llanbeblig, and Llanfairisgaer, in the county of Carnarvon, and the borough of Carnarvon.
