## BOROUGH OF GLASTONBURY (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

At the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 8th day of *July*, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### *Preliminary.*

1. This Order may be cited as THE BOROUGH OF GLASTONBURY (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.
2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.
3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

### *Restriction on Movement.*

4. No animal shall be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Glastonbury from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, except as expressly authorized by this Order.
5. Animals may be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Glastonbury from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, with a licence in writing of the Local Authority of the borough of Glastonbury.
6. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Glastonbury by railway, without untrucking.

### *Offences.*

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for

the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
