

Treasury Chambers, July 13, 1881.

THE Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that, with the consent of the Lords of the Treasury, the following employments in Prisons in England and Wales under the jurisdiction of the Prison Commissioners, are added to Schedule B of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.

Employment as temporary or occasional Substitutes for any established Officers, and temporary Supernumerary Officers; provided such employment be on weekly or daily wages and be sanctioned by the Treasury.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 105.)—MEDITERRANEAN—SICILY—NORTH COAST.

(1.) *Port of Palermo—Extension of Southern Breakwater.*

INFORMATION has been received from Commander Selby, H.M.S. "Falcon," that the new breakwater fronting Castellamare, Port of Palermo, now extends south $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables from its northern extremity, and thence S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. one cable towards Health Office Point—thus closing the channel that previously existed southward of this breakwater.

A fixed green light, visible 2 miles, is exhibited from the north end of the breakwater.

(2.) *Buoy Marking Civran Shoal.*

The Austrian Government has given notice, dated 21st May, 1881, that a buoy, painted white, surmounted by a staff and frame ball, has been moored in $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water, to mark the seaward extremity of Civran Shoal, southward of Port Cervera, with the following bearings, viz.:—

Verteneglio church steeple, N.E. by N.; Torre church steeple, E.N.E.; Parenzo church steeple, S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.
