HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased to appoint the Lord President of the Council, the Most Noble the Duke of Argyle, K.T., the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, the Right Honourable William Edward Baxter, the Right Honourable Lyon Playfair, and the Vice-President of the Committee of Council on Education, to be a Committee of Council on Education in Scotland.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter fourteen, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words and figures following, that is to say;

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and

four and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of your Majesty chapter fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the new parish of All Saints Crawley Down and partly out of the parish of Worth both in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester and partly out of the parish of Burstow and partly out of the parish of Horne, both which last named parishes are in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of All Saints Crawley Down, of the said parish of Worth, of the said parish of Burstow, and of the said parish of Horne which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of Divine worship.

"And whereas a sum of two thousand five hundred pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Highland Railway Company has been transferred into our name in the books of the same Company by Sir Curtis Miranda Lampson of Rowfant in the said county of Sussex Baronet acting on behalf of his wife Dame Jane Walter Lampson to be held in trust by us as and for a permanent endowment for the minister for the time being of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act then for the incumbent of the said new parish the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed according to the provisions of the said thirdly mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said sum of two thousand five hundred pounds four pounds per centum debenture stock of the Highland Railway Company aforesaid has been so provided as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act pay to the minister or

incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned to the said Dame Jane Walter Lampson, wife of Sir Curtis Miranda Lampson aforesaid and to her heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said annual grant of fifty pounds will be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester and with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof they have signed this scheme and sealed the same with their respective episcopal seals) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of All Saints Crawley Down, of the said parish of Worth of the said parish of Burstow and of the said parish of Horne, which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John the Evangelist Copthorne' and that such district shall be included in and shall form part of the Lewes Rural Deanery, No. 3, of the Archdeaconry of Lewes, and of the diocese of Chichester aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly Gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dame Jane Walter Lampson wife of Sir Curtis Miranda Lampson aforesaid and by her heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint John the Evangelist Copthorne, being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the new parish of All Saints Crawley Down and of

the parish of Worth both in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester and of the parish of Burstow and of the parish of Horne both in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester which said portions of such new parish and of such parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the county boundary which divides the said parish of Horne from the new parish of All Saints Crawley Down aforesaid at a point in the middle of the London and Brighton turnpike road at its junction with the road leading to the house called or known as Effingham and extending thence southward along the middle of the said turnpike road for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. D. St. J. 1881. No. 1' and placed on the western side of the said turnpike road immediately opposite to the middle of the western end of the roadway leading to Sheperd's Farm and extending thence that is from the middle of the said turnpike road due westward to the said boundary-stone and continuing thence due westward and in a direct line for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing Westlands Wood, the wood called Chart's Plain, and part of Bashford's Wood), to a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. D. St. J. 1881 No. 2' and placed on the eastern side of the public road or way which leads from Copthorne Common through Bashford's Wood aforesaid and past the Rowfant Farm and Rowfant into Wallage lane and extending thence that is from the last-described boundary-stone first westward to and then southward along the middle of the last-described road or way for a distance of one mile and four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wallage-lane aforesaid at a point distant about two and a quarter chains to the east of the bridge which carries the same lane over the stream which flows from the wood called or known as the Gill into the fish ponds in Rowfant Park at or near to which said point of junction a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. D. St. J. 1881 No. 3' has been placed and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said Wallage-lane for a distance of forty-three and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the line of the East Grinstead and Tunbridge Wells Branch of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway at Rowfant Station) to the point at Compasses Corner where the said Wallage-lane joins the road leading from Turner's Hill past Hayheath to Three Bridges such point being upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints Crawley Down from the parish of Worth aforesaid and extending thence first westward and then north-westward and then northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and thirty-six and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following in one part the course of the last-described road and in another part the course of the road leading from the said last-described road to Pot Common to a point at the southern end of the said common and extending thence that is from the said last-mentioned boundary north-westward to and along the fence forming the western boundary of the same common for a distance of ten-and-a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the fence forming the western boundary of a certain enclosure with a cottage thereon and situate on the western side of the said common and continuing thence still north-westward along the last-described fence for a distance of three-and-a-half chains or thereabouts to its northern end where it rejoins the fence forming the western boundary of the common aforesaid

and continuing thence still north-westward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. D. St. J. 1881 No. 4' and placed at the northern end of the same fence on the southern side of the turnpike-road leading from East Grinstead to Three Bridges and extending thence first northward to and then south-westward along the middle of the last-described turnpike-road for a distance of twenty-six-and-a-half chains or thereabouts to the bridge which carries the same turnpike-road over the stream flowing from Crabbet Park along the western side of Heathyground Wood and along the eastern side of the house and grounds called or known as Courtland towards Burstow and extending thence generally northward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of one mile and fifty-two chains or thereabouts thereby passing through Heathyground Pond and crossing the county boundary which divides the said parish of Worth from the parish of Burstow aforesaid to a point at the centre of Shipley Bridge which carries Antland-lane over the same stream and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of seventy-five and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction at Keepers Corner with Redehall-road and with the road leading past Laurel Cottage and Copthorne Farm into the London and Brighton turnpike-road aforesaid and extending thence that is from Keepers Corner aforesaid south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of one mile and four chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said parish of Burstow from the parish of Horne aforesaid) to the junction of the same road with the London and Brighton turnpike-road aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to the first-described point on the county boundary which divides the said parish of Horne from the new parish of All Saints Crawley Down aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the several cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester and by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

BOROUGH OF WELLS (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of July, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE BOROUGH OF WELLS (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Wells from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

5. Animals may be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Wells from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, with a licence in writing of the Local Authority of the borough of Wells.

6. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Wells by railway, without untrucking.

Offences.

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following area (that is to say),—so much of the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—the Great Northern Railway on the west, Connington brook—“Baouch's Drain,” on the north, and the parish boundaries of Woodwalton adjoining Higney fen on the east and south,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Bedfordshire.—The parishes of Biggleswade, Potton, and Sutton, in the petty sessional division of Biggleswade, in the county of Bedford.

Derbyshire.—(1.) The petty sessional division of Derby, except the parish of Osmaston, in the county of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional divisions of Ashbourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(3.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The petty sessional division of Swadlincote, in the county of Derby.

(5.) The petty sessional division of Repton and Gresley, in the county of Derby.

Dorsetshire.—(1.) The parishes of Turnworth, Winterbourne Clenston, Winterbourne Houghton, and Winterbourne Stickland, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The parishes of Tarrant Keinston, and Tarrant Rawston, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, and the parishes of Preston-cum-Crawford, Tarrant Rushton, and Witchampton, in the petty sessional division of Wimborne, in the county of Dorset.

(3.) The parishes of Chaldon Herring, West Lulworth, and Winfrith Newburgh, in the petty sessional division of Wareham, and Ower-

moigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

Gloucestershire.—The parishes of South Cerney, Siddington, and Preston, the tything of Cherterton in the parish of Cirencester, and the district of the Local Board of Cirencester, in the county of Gloucester.

Huntingdonshire.—So much of the petty sessional division of Ramsey as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—the Great Northern Railway on the west, Connington brook—“Baouch's Drain,” on the north, and the parish boundaries of Woodwalton adjoining Higney fen on the east and south.

Lancashire.—The townships of Barton-upon-Irwell, Stratford, Heaton Norris, the hamlet of Mossley, the townships of Tonge, Royton, Chatterton, Thornham, Butterworth, the hamlet of Whitworth lower end, in the hundred of Salford, in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Accrington, and Burnley.

Leicestershire.—The county of Leicester, and the borough of Leicester.

Lincolnshire (Lindsey).—So much of the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, as is bounded on the north by the road leading from Burgh to Ingoldmells Mill, commencing at the north-west corner of a field called the Far Meadow, the property of Mr. R. S. Stephenson, and proceeding eastwardly so far as the road leading from Ingoldmells Mill to Winthorpe, on the east by the last-named road so far as a cottage in the occupation of Henry Coupland, on the south by a line drawn from such cottage to the south-west corner of a field belonging to Mr. Robert Wright, (adjoining a field called the Far Four Acres belonging to Mr. Samuel Raithby,) and on the west by the fences on the west sides of the following fields all adjoining, namely,—a field belonging to Mr. Ashlin Outforth, two fields called respectively the Six Acres and Seg Close belonging to Mr. Henry Searby, a field called the Seven Acres belonging to Mr. William Coupland, a field called Guide Post Three Acres belonging to Mr. Charles Acred, and the before-named field called the Far Meadow belonging to Mr. R. S. Stephenson, exclusive of the above-named boundary roads, and which area includes portions of the parishes of Addlethorpe, Ingoldmells, and Winthorpe.

Norfolk.—(1.) The hundred of Freebridge Marshland, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(2.) The hundred of Freebridge Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(3.) The hundred of Smithdon, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(4.) The parishes of Helhoughton, Tatterford, West Rudham, and East Rudham, in the hundred of Gallow, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(5.) The borough of King's Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(6.) The parish of Reedham, and the adjoining parishes of Limpenhoe, Freethorpe, and Wickhampton, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk.

(7.) The hundred of Clackclose, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk, with the exception of the parishes of Denver, Ryston, West Dereham, Eastmore, Barton Bendish, Beachamwell, Wexham, Boughton, Stoke Ferry, Wretton, Roxham, Fordham, Hilgay, and Southery.

Northamptonshire.—(1.) The parishes of Kelmarsh, Clipston, Great Oxendon, Little Oxendon, and Little Bowden, in the county of Northampton.

(2.) The parishes of Crick, and Yelvertoft, in the county of Northampton.

(3.) The parish of Stanford, in the petty sessional division of Daventry, in the county of Northampton.

Oxfordshire.—(1.) So much of the Bullingdon petty sessional division, in the county of Oxford, as is bounded on the west by the Oxford and Henley main-road, and on the south by the high-road leading from the Golden Ball to Chislehampton, and on the east by the high-road leading from Chislehampton to Temple Cowley, and on the north by the high-road leading from Temple Cowley through Church Cowley to the junction of that road with the Oxford and Henley main-road near Rose Hill.

(2.) So much of the Watlington petty sessional division, in the county of Oxford, as is bounded on the south by the road leading from Cut Mill through Cuxham and along Brook-street, Watlington, up Watlington Hill to Christmas Common cross roads, and thence on the east by the road leading past Shirburn Lodge to the top of Lewknor Hill, and thence on the north-east by the road leading through Lewknor and South Weston up to the Thames main-road, and then on the north-west by the Thames main-road to Cut Mill.

Rutland.—So much of the parish of Stoke Dry, as is situate in the county of Rutland.

Staffordshire.—(1.) The townships of Tatenhill, and Branstone, in the county of Stafford, and the borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

(2.) The parish of Alrewas, in the county of Stafford.

Suffolk.—The parish of Dennington, in the union district of Hoxne, in the county of Suffolk.

Surrey.—The petty sessional division of Wandsworth, in the county of Surrey.

Warwickshire.—The petty sessional divisions of Atherstone, Coventry, Rugby, and Southam, in the county of Warwick.

Wiltshire.—(1.) From Chilvester Hill along the east side of the road to the Dumb Post at Bremhill, thence along the south side of the road through Bremhill to Lowbridge, from Lowbridge along the south bank of Fisher's brook to the south-east point of an inclosure called Leech Mead, and thence by a straight line to the point at which the boundary of the borough of Calne crosses the road from Calne to Hillmarton, and from such last mentioned point along the inner side of the highway (parts of which are known by the names of Frog Lane, Wood Street, and Curzon Street, respectively) to Chilvester Hill aforesaid, in the county of Wilts.

(2.) So much of the hamlet or tithing of Broad Blunsdon, in the parish of Highworth, in the county of Wilts, as lies to the north-east of the main-road there from Coldharbour to Cricklade and north of Hyde-lane; so much of the parish of Stanton Fitzwarren, in the same county, as lies between Stanton Water and the boundary of the hamlet or tithing aforesaid; and so much of the parish of Hannington, in the same county, as is in the occupation of Mr. Joseph Painter.

(3.) The petty sessional division of Calne, in the county of Wilts, and the borough of Calne.

(4.) The urban sanitary district of Trowbridge, the parishes of North Bradley, West

Ashton, Steeple Ashton, Keevil, Hinton, Semington, Whaddon, and Hilpertton, the tything of Staverton, so much of the parish of Melksham as lies to the south of the railway from Trowbridge towards Devizes, and west of the Wilts and Berks Canal, and of a line drawn due south to the boundary of the said parish of Melksham, from the point at which the said Wilts and Berks Canal joins the Kennet and Avon Canal, and so much of the parish of Broughton Gifford, and of the tything of Holt respectively, as lies to the south or south-east of the said railway, in the county of Wilts.

(5.) So much of the parish of Purton as lies to the east of the road there from Cricklade to Liddiard Millicent church; the hamlets of Haydon, and Moreton, in the parish of Rodborne Cheney; and Tadpole farm in the parish of Blunsdon Saint Andrew, in the county of Wilts.

(6.) The parishes of Kemble, Crudwell, Oaksey, Minety, Ashton Keynes, Shornote, Somerford Keynes, and Poole Keynes, in the county of Wilts.

(7.) The parish of Lacock, in the county of Wilts.

(8.) The parish of Poulshot, and so much of the parish of Seend as is bounded towards the north and north-west by the road from Devizes to the east end of Seend village, and by the lane from the east end of the said village through Inmarsh Farm to its junction with the Worton road south of the said village, towards the west by the road from Seend to Worton from the point of junction last mentioned to the boundary of the parish of Bulkington, and towards the south, south-east, and east by the boundaries of the said parishes of Bulkington, and Poulshot respectively, in the county of Wilts.

Yorkshire (East Riding).—(1.) The borough of Beverley, in the East Riding of the county of York.

(2.) The parish of Preston, in the petty sessional division of Middle Holderness, in the East Riding of the county of York.

Yorkshire (North Riding).—The township of Cargo Fleet, Ormesby, and the adjoining townships of Normanby, Marton, Upsall, and Nunthorpe, in the North Riding of the county of York.
