WHEREAS by section 3 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds were prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the 8th section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices for the county of Lincoln, in the Parts of Lindsey, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Lincoln, in the Parts of Lindsey, so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 31st day of August, in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild birds is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Lincoln, Parts of Lindsey, so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 31st day of August, in each year.

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild birds is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Lincoln, Parts of Kesteven, so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 31st day of August, in each year.

TREASURY WARRANT.

In lieu thereof the limits of weight, length, breadth, and depth for all such packets shall, in future, be respectively as follows, that is to say:—The limit of weight shall be twelve ounces, the limit of length twelve inches, the limit of breadth eight inches, and the limit of depth four inches.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 5th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Clerk in the Solicitor's Office of the Treasury, Post Office, Inland Revenue and Customs Departments, and in the Office of the Examiner of Criminal Law Accounts.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Examination is less than 20 or more than 30.

II. No Candidate will be eligible who has not within the last five years had at least three years' experience as a Solicitor, or as an Articled Clerk,

or as a Clerk who has previously served under Articles in a Solicitor's Office. For the Solicitor's Office of the General Post Office, Dublin, no Candidate will be eligible to compete who has not been, or is not qualified to be, admitted to practise as a Solicitor in Ireland; and no Candidate will be eligible for appointment until he has actually been so admitted.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

Obligatory Subjects:

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
3. English Composition.
4. Criminal Law, and Proceedings before Justices of the Peace.
5. Law of Evidence.

Optional Subjects:

8. Geography.
9. English History.
10. Latin.
11. French or German.
12. Mercantile Book-keeping.
13. Equity and Practice of the Courts.
14. Bankruptcy and Practice of the Courts.

IV. A fee of £2 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

(No. 139.)—BAL TIC—SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN.

(1.) *Kiel Fiord—Buoyage.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 86 (1), of 30th May, 1881, on intended alterations in the buoyage of Kiel Fiord:—

The German Government has given notice, that an automatic signal buoy, coloured black, with Kiel A painted in white letters on both sides, has been laid down at the northern side of the entrance to Kiel Fiord, off Kleverberg Shallow, in the position formerly occupied by the black buoy with staff and ball, which has been removed.

Also, that the conical buoy Kiel B has been removed in its former position on western side of the channel.

SWEDEN—SOUTH COAST.

(2.) *Intended Exhibition of a Light on Utlängen Island.*

Information has been received, that it is intended in the course of the summer to exhibit a light from the side of a wooden building on the south extreme of Utlängen Island, east side of approach to Carlskrona.

The light will be a fixed white light, visible seaward over an arc of 240°, or from the direction of Spanstakulle Shoal to a line passing northward of Hermanskullen Shoal.

The illuminating apparatus will be catoptric, or by means of reflectors.

GULF OF BOTHNIA.

(3.) *Intended Establishment of Steam Fog Signal at Understen Island.*

Also, that in the course of this summer, a steam fog signal will be established near the lighthouse on Understen Island, South Quarken Channel.

(4.) *Intended Stationing of Light-Vessels on West Finngrund Bank.*

Also, that in the course of this summer, a light-vessel will be stationed S.W. of West Finngrund Bank.

From the light-vessel a fixed red light will be exhibited.

The illuminated apparatus will be dioptric or by means of lenses.

(No. 140.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—COAST OF TUNIS.

(1.) *Fixed Light at Tabarca Island.*

THE French Government has given notice, dated 1st July, 1881, that a light is exhibited from the fort on Tabarca Island.

This light is a fixed white light, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 3 or 4 miles.

(2.) *Fixed Lights at Benzert Road.*

Also, that the following lights have been established at Benzert Road:—

A fixed red light, elevated 46 feet, and visible seaward between the bearings of S. 32° W. through west to N. 35° W., is exhibited from a position 90 yards within the outer extreme of the pier at Benzert.

A fixed green light, elevated 23 feet, and visible seaward between the bearings of S. 34° W. through west to N. 33° W., is exhibited from a position 27 yards within the outer extremity of the same pier.

NOTE.—The green light bearing S. 34° W. leads about a quarter of a mile seaward of Boberah Bank.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1880-81.
