Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

Lincolnshire (Holland) .- Sutton St. Edmunds Commons, and Inkerson Fen, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire.
