By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following area (namely),—the borough of Beverley, in the East Riding of the county of York,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

(PORT OF ARDROSSAN.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Ardrossan, in the county of Ayr, as a foreign animals quarantine station:

All that space situate at the south-east quay of the Ardrossan Wet Dock, in the parish of New Ardrossan, in the county of Ayr, included within a line commencing at a point at the edge of the quay wall of the said Dock about one hundred and sixty-eight feet west of the east corner of the said Dock, thence at a right angle in a southerly direction for about fifty-two feet, thence at a right angle in a westerly direction for a distance of about twenty-one feet, thence at a right angle in a northerly direction for a distance of about fifty-two feet, thence along the edge of the quay wall of the said Dock in an easterly direction for a distance of about twenty-one feet

to the point aforesaid situate one hundred and sixty-eight feet west of the east corner of the said Dock.

SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS)
No. 5 ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 5 ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwick-upon-Tweed.

4. Notwithstanding anything in Article 4 of The Scotland (Movement of Animals) No. 5 Order of 1881, animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the District of the Local Authorities of the counties of Northumberland or Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a place or area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, to a farm or premises in Scotland, with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved, which licence shall not be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

(i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved,
