

or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and

- (ii.) have not been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and
- (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

Offences.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(PORT OF FALMOUTH.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of August, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Falmouth, in the county of Cornwall, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that piece of land within the borough of Penryn, in the county of Cornwall, situate between Commercial-road and the Penryn River, and included within a line commencing at a point on the southern end of the said river, and extending from the edge of the said river for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet six inches in a south-westerly direction bounded partly by a wooden fence and partly by a stone wall, thence in a north-westerly direction along the said Commercial-road for a distance of sixty-nine feet six inches bounded by the wall and door of the newly erected sheds, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and two feet to the water's edge bounded by a stone wall separating the said piece of land from the newly erected quay of Mr. James Mead, and thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of seventy feet six inches along the quay wall to the point first above-mentioned, all which space is edged pink on the plan of the said foreign animals wharf deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Penryn.
