THE Board of Trade have received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Vice-Consul at Nantes, reporting that in future all vessels arriving at the Island of Aix bound to Rochfort or to Tonnay-Charente, and having cases of contagious or infectious disease on board, will be ordered to the lazaretto at St. Nazaire or to that at Pauillac (Gironde), for the purpose of landing the sick and obtaining free pratique.
