THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 6 ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and, except as otherwise expressed, shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwick-upon-Tweed.

5.—(a.) Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the District of the Local Authorities of the counties of Northumberland or Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a place or area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, to a farm or premises in Scotland, with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved, which licence shall not be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

- (i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and
- (ii.) have not been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and
- (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

(b.) This Article shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the tenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, except as regards the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying

the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878, *C. L. Peel.*

W. Adams rushed into the water (which filled the ditch), dragged the horses from off the men upon whom they were lying, and extricated them, he being at the time under a heavy fire, and up to his waist in water. At this time the Afghans were pressing on very rapidly, the leading men getting within a few yards of Mr. Adams, who having let go his horse in order to render more effectual assistance, had eventually to escape on foot.

CIRCULAR relating to places infected with cholera and to the consignment of vessels with cholera patients on board to the Port of Christiansand.

From the Royal Norwegian Department of Justice and Police.

The following foreign places shall, until further

notice, be considered as infected with cholera, viz. :—Fez, Meguinez, and Dar el Beida, in Morocco, and Uruguayana, in Brazil.

Vessels with cholera patients on board, and bound for Norwegian ports, shall be directed by the pilots to repair to the quarantine establishment at Christiansand. In other ports the masters of vessels will be required to keep their sick on board and to remain meanwhile in quarantine.

The light is exhibited from an open wooden structure, painted black, and situated about 190 feet within the outer extremity of the eastern pier.

NOTE.—Vessels approaching Port Napier from the southward should have the white sector of this

light well open before rounding Ahuriri Bluff, in order to avoid Auckland Rock.
