**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 24th day of September, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The limits of the following area which is declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the petty sessional divisions of Accrington, Blackburn Lower, and Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster, and the borough of Clitheroe,—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

## SCHEDULE.

An area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Accrington, Blackburn Lower, and Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Blackburn, and Clitheroe.

## THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Buckinghamshire.**—(1.) The whole parish of Chesham, (including the hamlets of Ashley Green, Asheridge, Bellingdon, Botley, Charteridge, Hundridge, Latimer, and Waterside,) the parish of Chesham Bois, and the parish of Chenies, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Marsworth, in the county of Buckingham.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Beaconsfield, in the county of Buckingham.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Hambleden, in the county of Buckingham.

**Cambridgeshire.**—The parishes of Waterbeach, Landbeach, and Cottenham, in the petty sessional division of Cambridge, in the county of Cambridge.

(*Liberty of the Isle of Ely.*)—The whole of the parish of Thorney, and that part of the parish of Wisbech, which is situate to the west of the Old South Eau Bank, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

**Derbyshire.**—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Derby, in the county of Derby, and the borough of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional divisions of Ashbourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(3.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The petty sessional division of Swadlincote, in the county of Derby.

(5.) The petty sessional division of Repton and Gresley, in the county of Derby.

(6.) The park, grounds, and premises known as Egginton Hall, in the parish of Egginton, in the county of Derby.

**Dorsetshire.**—(1.) The parish of Owermoigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The tything and hamlet of Plush in the parish of Buckland Newton, and the higher tything of Piddletrenthide in the parish of Piddletrenthide, in the petty sessional division of Cerne, in the county of Dorset.

**Hampshire.**—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) That portion of the parish of Millbrook, in the petty sessional division of Southampton, in the county of Southampton, which is bounded on the south by the Southampton Water, on the east by the Shirley-road and the Romsey-road as far as the Old Toll Bar, on the north by Brownhill-lane and Redbridge-lane to the River Test, and on the west by the River Test.

(3.) The parish of North Baddesley, in the county of Southampton.

(4.) All those fields on the north side of the Stockbridge-road below the cottages called the Barracks to the end of Triendley's Wood, extending north to the Warren Bottom Close part of Itchens Fields and part of the Glebe, including the bye-lane called Harridge Grove, and thence to the Stockbridge-road, in the parish of North Waltham, in the county of Southampton.

*Hertfordshire.*—The petty sessional division of Watford, in the county of Hertford.

(3.) The hundred of Smithdon, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(4.) The borough of King's Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(5.) The hundred of Clackclose, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk, with the exception of the parishes of Denver, Ryston, West Dereham, Eastmore, Barton Bendish, Beachamwell, Wereham, Boughton, Stoke Ferry, Wretton, Roxham, Fordham, Hilgay, and Southery.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Council Office a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Charleston, South Carolina, enclosing the following copy of a Quarantine Notice issued by the South Carolina State Board of Health, viz.:—

QUARANTINE NOTICE.

*To Pilots and Masters of Vessels.*

Pilots will, in all cases, before boarding, make inquiry as to the sanitary condition of vessels bound for this port, or calling for orders.

Vessels from infected or suspected ports, with sickness on board, or on which cholera, smallpox, yellow or typhus fever has occurred, either during voyage, or in the port of departure, will be directed to proceed at once to the National Quarantine Station at Sapelo. In such cases the pilot or pilots will not board. Cases of doubt to be decided by the health officer.

All vessels from Sapelo, bound for this port, having the certificate of the National Inspector, will be brought to anchor at the Quarantine Station of this port, and there remain until released by proper permit from the Health Officer.

Pilots, captains, and masters of vessels will be held strictly responsible for violations of these orders, and the penalties will be enforced by the Health Officer.

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Clerk in the Departments of Her Majesty's General Register House, Edinburgh.

*N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 23, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Competitive Examination.

2. No Candidate will be eligible who has not within the last five years served for at least two years in the office of a Writer to the Signet, a Solicitor, or a Law Agent.

3. The Competitive Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- Handwriting.
- Orthography.
- Arithmetic.
- Copying MS. (to test accuracy).
- Indexing or Docketing.
- Digesting Returns into Summaries.
- English Composition.
- Geography.
- English History.
- Book-keeping.

Candidates will be at liberty to offer themselves for examination in any or all of these subjects. No subjects are obligatory.

4. No Candidate can be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that he possesses the requisite amount of proficiency in the following subjects:—

- 1. Handwriting.
- 2. Orthography.
- 3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
- 4. Elements of Conveyancing, as practised in Scotland.

With this view, Preliminary Examinations in

these subjects will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.

5. Application for permission to attend a Preliminary Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

6. A fee of 10s. will be required from every Candidate attending a Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of £1 10s. from every Candidate who may be admitted to the competition.

Messrs. Laird Brothers, of the Birkenhead Iron Works, Birkenhead, carrying on business as Ship-builders and Engineers, intend to construct an extension of one of their building slips of timber piles fixed in the rock of the foreshore, and supported by diagonal bracing to the river-wall of their premises.

The projection beyond the river-wall in this extension of the slip to be 20 feet, with a width of about 50 feet, and the object of such extension is to carry the stern of a large ship which is to be built on said slip.

The timber piles of which it is to be constructed will allow a free passage for the flow of the tidal water both up and down, and will obstruct it only so far as the girth of the piles forming the structure, and not in any way exclude or impede the tidal flow.

It is proposed to commence this structure in about two months from the date hereof, and it is intended to be permanent until the Mersey Conservancy Board see sufficient reason for requiring its removal, in which case it is to be removed.
