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## DERBYSHIRE (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 7th day of October, 1881.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as THE DERBYSHIRE (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881, AMENDMENT.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

4. Notwithstanding anything in Article 4 of The Derbyshire (Movement of Animals) Order of 1881, fat animals exposed at the market held in the borough of Derby by licence of the Local Authority may be moved out of that market and then into the District of the Local Authority of the county of Derby on the conditions applicable to movement from public sales of fat animals held by licence of a Local Authority, named in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, but not otherwise.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect

of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(PORT OF PORTSMOUTH.)

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Portsmouth, in the county of Southampton, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space and premises at the Camber Dock, in the borough of Portsmouth, in the county of Southampton, situate on the north side of the Outer Camber, bounded by a line commencing at the north quay wall of the said Outer Camber at a point twenty-three feet west from the north-west corner of the Camber Dry Dock, thence in a north-east direction for a distance of thirty-four feet three inches, thence eastward one hundred and sixty-two feet ten inches, thence northward six feet, thence eastward forty-three feet seven inches, thence northward thirty feet seven inches, thence westward two hundred and two feet seven inches, thence south-westward seventy-one feet nine inches, thence north-westward seven feet two inches, thence south-westward one hundred and nine feet to the before-named north quay wall, thence south-eastward thirty-eight feet six inches, and thence eastward one hundred and nineteen feet seven inches along the edge of the said north quay wall to the point aforesaid, all which space and premises are coloured pink on the plan of the said foreign animals wharf deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Portsmouth.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within

those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Buckinghamshire.**—(1.) The whole parish of Chesham, (including the hamlets of Ashley Green, Asheridge, Bellingdon, Botley, Charteridge, Hundridge, Latimer, and Waterside,) the parish of Chesham Bois, and the parish of Chenies, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Marsworth, in the county of Buckingham.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Beaconsfield, in the county of Buckingham.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Hambleden, in the county of Buckingham.

**Dorsetshire.**—(1.) The parish of Overmoigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The tything and hamlet of Plush in the parish of Buckland Newton, and the higher tything of Piddletrenthide in the parish of Piddletrenthide, in the petty sessional division of Cerne, in the county of Dorset.

**Hampshire.**—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) That portion of the parish of Millbrook, in the petty sessional division of Southampton, in the county of Southampton, which is bounded on the south by the Southampton Water, on the east by the Shirley-road and the Romsey-road as far as the Old Toll Bar, on the north by Brownhill-lane and Redbridge-lane to the River Test, and on the west by the River Test.

## OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.

*Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.*

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M. and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

(1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and

(2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than 5 days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months.

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the class of workshops mentioned in the schedule hereunder, it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby;

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly. Provided that nothing in this Order shall be taken to apply:

(a.) Where persons are employed at home, that is to say, to a private house, room, or place which, though used as a dwelling, is, by reason of the work carried on there, a factory or workshop within the meaning of this Act, and in which neither steam, water, nor other mechanical power is used, and in which the only persons employed are members of the same family dwelling there; or

(b.) To a workshop, or part thereof, which is conducted on the system of not employing any child or young person therein.

This Order shall come into effect on Tuesday, the 11th of October, 1881; and shall, unless previously revoked, continue in force until 31st December, 1882, and no longer.
