By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 56 of The Animals Order, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Stafford to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this licence, the carcass of a certain cow which was slaughtered on or about the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in consequence of being affected with pleuro-pneumonia, and was buried in the yard of a certain Inn known as the Red Lion Inn, situate in the Market Place, at Uttoxeter, in the county of Stafford, subject to the following conditions:

1. The carcass shall be dug up in the presence of, and under the superintendence of, an officer specially appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority.

2. The carcass dug up shall be, as far as practicable, covered with quick lime, and shall then be removed from the said yard, and shall be re-buried in the presence of, and under the superintendence of, the said

officer, as soon as possible in some proper place, and shall be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.

3. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, removal, and burial of the carcass shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
4. This licence is revocable by the Privy Council.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Turkish Government of which the following is a translation, viz:—

In consequence of the prevalence of cholera at Mecca and Aden, the Council of Health have decided as follows:—

1. Vessels arriving from the Egyptian Mediterranean ports will be subjected to medical inspection in Ottoman ports.
2. Vessels from the Red Sea, which have undergone quarantine in Egypt, will be subjected to a quarantine of observation of eight hours.
3. Vessels from the Red Sea which have not undergone quarantine in Egypt will be subjected to the usual quarantine for cholera in the lazaretto ports of Beyrout, Smyrna, Salonica, or the Dardanelles.
