The following area declared by Order of Council dated the eleventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the parish of Preston, in the petty sessional division of Middle Holderness, in the East Riding of the county of York,—is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
