3.—The following areas (namely), (1.) the parish of Bowden Magna ; (2.) the parish of Lubenham ; (3.) the parishes of Langton Tur, and Langton West ; and (4.) the parish of Slawston ; in the petty sessional division of Market Har-

borough, in the county of Leicester, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease. *C. L. Peel.*

The following areas (namely),—(1.) the borough of Accrington; (2.) the borough of Burnley; (3.) the petty sessional divisions of Accrington, Blackburn Lower, and Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Blackburn, and Clitheroe; and (4.) the townships of Alston, Elston, Grimsargh with Brockholes, and Hothersall, in the county of Lancaster;—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Bedfordshire.—The whole of the parish of Northill, and that portion of the parish of Sandy lying to the west of the river Ivel, in the petty sessional division of Biggleswade, in the county of Bedford.

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) The whole parish of Chesham, (including the hamlets of Ashley Green, Asheridge, Bellingdon, Botley, Charteridge, Hundridge, Latimer, and Waterside,) the parish of Chesham Bois, and the parish of Chenies, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Marsworth, in the county of Buckingham.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Beaconsfield, in the county of Buckingham.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Hambleden, in the county of Buckingham.

(5.) The whole of the parish of Ellesborough, in the county of Buckingham.

(6.) The whole of the parishes of Swanbourne, and Mursley, in the county of Buckingham, except the hamlet of Salden in the parish of Mursley.

(*Liberty of the Isle of Ely*).—The whole of the parish of Thorney, and that part of the parish of Wisbech, which is situate to the west of the Old South Eau Bank, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cornwall.—(1.) The parishes of Mabe, Constantine, Mawnan, Budock, St. Gluvias, and Mylor, in the county of Cornwall, and the boroughs of Falmouth, and Penryn, except the foreign animals wharf at Penryn Wharf, in the borough of Penryn.

(2.) The parishes of Gwennap, Redruth, Stithians, Perranarworthal, and Kenwyn, in the county of Cornwall.

(3.) The parishes of Kea, and Feock, in the county of Cornwall.

Derbyshire.—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Derby, in the county of Derby, and the borough of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional divisions of Ashbourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(3.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The petty sessional division of Swadlincote, in the county of Derby.

(5.) The petty sessional division of Repton and Gresley, in the county of Derby.

Dorsetshire.—(1.) The parish of Owermoigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The tything and hamlet of Plush in the parish of Buckland Newton, and the higher tything of Piddletrenthide in the parish of Piddletrenthide, in the petty sessional division of Cerne, in the county of Dorset.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) (3.) The hundred of Smithdon, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(4.) The borough of King's Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(5.) The hundred of Clackclose, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk, with the exception of the parishes of Denver, Ryston, West Dereham, Eastmore, Barton Bendish, Beachamwell, Wereham, Boughton, Stoke Ferry, Wretton, Roxham, Fordham, Hilgay, and Southery.

(6.) The parishes of Feltwell St. Mary, and Feltwell St. Nicholas, including Feltwell Fen, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

| Bengal Staff Corps ... | Captain (now Brevet Major) William John Vousden | For the exceptional gallantry displayed by him on the 14th December, 1879, on the Koh Asmai Heights, near Kabul, in charging, with a small party, into the centre of the line of the retreating Kohistani force, by whom they were greatly outnumbered, and who did their utmost to close round them. After rapidly charging through and through the enemy, backwards and forwards, several times, they swept off round the opposite side of the village and joined the rest of the Troop. |
| Bengal Staff Corps ... | Captain (now Major) Arthur George Hammond | For conspicuous coolness and gallantry at the action on the Asmai Heights, near Kabul, on the 14th December, 1879, in defending the top of the hill with a rifle and fixed bayonet, against large numbers of the enemy, while the 72nd Highlanders and Guides were retiring; and again, on the retreat down the hill, in stopping to assist in carrying away a wounded Sepoy, the enemy being not sixty yards off, firing heavily all the time. |
| The Gordon Highlanders | Lieutenant William Henry Dick Cunyngnam | For the conspicuous gallantry and coolness displayed by him on the 13th December, 1879, at the attack on the Sherpur Pass, in Afghanistan, in having exposed himself to the full fire of the enemy, and by his example and encouragement rallied the men who, having been beaten back, were, at the moment, wavering at the top of the hill. |
| Seaforth Highlanders (Ross-shire Buffs) | Lance - Corporal George Sellar | For conspicuous gallantry displayed by him at the assault on the Asmai Heights, round Kabul, on the 14th December, 1879, in having in a marked manner led the attack, under a heavy fire, and, dashing on in front of the party up the slope, engaged in a desperate conflict with an Afghan who sprang out to meet him. In this encounter Lance-Corporal Sellar was severely wounded. |

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the "Albert Medal of the Second Class" on—

WILLIAM HENRY BURT, of Devizes.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred :—

At two o'clock on the afternoon of the 15th July last, a fire broke out on the premises of Mr. Ernest Wellings, Italian Warehouseman, Market Place, Devizes. After the fire had been raging some time, and all the inmates of the house had effected their escape, it was reported that there was a certain quantity of gunpowder stored in the shop, and MR. BURT at once volunteered to enter the burning premises and remove the case containing the gunpowder. At this time a great body of flame was distinctly visible on the other side of the shop counter only a few feet distant from the spot where the gunpowder was deposited.

It was under these circumstances that MR. BURT made his way into the shop, effecting his entrance through the window; and eventually succeeded in finding and removing the box containing ten or twelve pounds of gunpowder, thereby preventing an explosion, which might have been attended with serious loss of life amongst those necessarily engaged in dealing with the fire, as well as amongst the crowd of onlookers.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome enclosing a copy of a quarantine notice issued by the Italian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

1881. *Ordinance of Maritime Health. No. 3.*

The Minister of the Interior having ascertained that cholera exists in Aden and at Mecca, considering for ships devoted to the transport of travellers, the passage of the Suez Canal is forbidden if they have not undergone regular quarantine.

DECREES.

ART. 1. Ships which from this day forward shall arrive at the coasts of the kingdom coming from Ottoman ports and docks on the Red Sea, without having undergone a regular quarantine in Egypt or in some port of the Mediterranean, shall be subjected to a quarantine, to be kept for three days, in every case where they shall have made the passage safely, without cases of illness. If they shall have had cases of cholera on board, or have them at the time of arrival, they shall be subjected to a strict quarantine for ten days, to be expiated in a plague house.

ART 2.—Merchandise carried by such ships coming from the above-mentioned place shall be treated in accordance with the rules of quarantine of the table of the 29th April, 1867, with the exception of rags, tatters, and old unwashed clothes, the importation of which is forbidden till further notice.

The Prefects of the maritime provinces are charged with the execution of this present Ordinance.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Greek Government, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

21st September, 1881, o.s.

To the Nomarchs and Eparchs of the Kingdom.

Having heard the opinion of the Royal Medical Board, convoked to-day to an extraordinary sitting, it has been directed that, besides the quarantine of eleven full days imposed by the Royal Decree of the 10th instant, upon arrivals from Aden and from places on the Asiatic and African Coasts of the Red Sea where cholera

prevails, which have not performed quarantine in Egypt, all arrivals from the above-mentioned places, which have performed quarantine beyond the Isthmus of Suez, are to be subjected to five days quarantine of observation, and that all arrivals from Egypt be admitted to pratique after a medical examination.

You are hereby requested to notify the present to all the Sanitary Authorities within your district, and call their strict attention to its fulfilments.
