And on Monday, the 14th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Each of the areas described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
