South Staffordshire Mines Drainage.

(Alteration and Increase of Drainage Rates; Amendment of Acts).

APPPLICATION is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session thereof, by the Commissioners constituted and acting under the authority of the South Staffordshire Mines Drainage Acts, 1873 and 1878, for leave to bring in a Bill for the following or some of the following among other purposes, that is to say:—

To alter and if need be to repeal certain provisions of the said Acts of 1873 and 1878, and

especially to vary and increase the amount of the Mines Drainage Rate as defined in the second schedule of the said Act of 1873, and to vary and if need be to repeal any provisions in the said Acts which may interfere with the proposed alteration and increase of the same rate, and to confer on the said Commissioners further power with reference to the assessment and levy of rates, and to make other provisions relating thereto.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with its objects, and may alter, amend, and explain any provisions of the said Acts, or either of them.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December next.
