And Our further will and pleasure is, that you, or any three or more of you, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, upon the matters referred to you as aforesaid, and that you may have power to certify to Us from time to time your several proceedings in respect of the matters aforesaid, if it may seem expedient for you so to do.

And We do further will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Nathaniel Baker, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Consul at Alexandria upon the subject of quarantine, viz:—

“Alexandria, November 12.—Sanitary Board finding measures of repulsion against arrivals from Arabia impracticable repealed them to-day, adopting the following regulations:—Vessels and pilgrims from Hedjaz must perform 15 days' quarantine at El Wedj, and afterwards ten at Tor. Vessels with foreign pilgrims may pass Suez Canal in quarantine after fulfilling above regulations. Transhipments are not allowed.”
