7 HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday, the seventeenth day of December next, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two: And We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eightytwo, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs : and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

The following area declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-andmouth disease (namely),—the parishes of Crick, Winwick, Watford, West Haddon, Guilsborough, and Nortoft, in the county of Northampton,—is, except the parishes of Crick, and Watford, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The parishes of Crick, and Watford, in the county of Northampton, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
