

arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish (as the case may be) and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said annual grant of fifty pounds will be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, and with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Christ Church Denton and of the said new parish of Saint George Hyde which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Anne Haughton' and that such district shall be included in, and shall form part of, the Rural Deanery of Ashton-under-Lyne, of the Archdeaconry of Manchester, and of the diocese of Manchester aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Joseph Sidebotham and by his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Anne Haughton being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Christ Church Denton within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which consists of the whole of that part of the township of Haughton which is comprised within the limits of the said new parish all which said portion of such new parish is bounded on the south by the new parish of Saint Laurence Denton also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid on the west by that part of the township of Denton which is comprised within the limits of the new parish of Christ Church Denton aforesaid on the north mainly by the new parish of Audenshaw also within the original limits of the parish

of Manchester aforesaid and partly by the new parish of Saint Mark Dukinfield within the original limits of the parish of Stockport in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester and on the north-east and on the east partly by the new parish of Saint Mary Newton in Mottram within the original limits of the said parish of Stockport and partly by the hereinafter described portion of the new parish of Saint George Hyde also within the original limits of the same parish. And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint George Hyde which is bounded on the south-east and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Haughton within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid from the new parish of Saint George Hyde aforesaid at a point in the centre of Clarke's Bridge over the River Tame at the southern end of Mill-lane and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Read-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Alfred-street and with Alma-street and continuing thence still in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of six chains or thereabouts across the open space in front of Barnfield Mill to a point in the middle of the Peak Forest Canal and extending thence first northward and then north-westward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of thirty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint George Hyde aforesaid from the new parish of Saint Mary Newton in Mottram aforesaid all which above described portion of the new parish of Saint George Hyde aforesaid is bounded on the remaining sides other than the south-east and east that is to say upon the north upon the west and upon the south as follows upon the north by the new parish of Saint Mary Newton in Mottram aforesaid, upon the west partly by the hereinafter described portion of the new parish of Christ Church Denton aforesaid, and partly by the new parish of Saint Laurence Denton aforesaid, and on the south by the new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Haughton aforesaid or in other words upon the west and upon the south by the River Tame aforesaid."

"And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the two new parishes, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

"And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester, and by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.
