By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following area declared by Order of Council dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the townships of Kirbymoorside, Welburn, Beadlam, Nawton, Wombledon, Skiplam, Fadmoor, Gillamoore, Hatton-le-Hole, Great Edstone, Little Edstone, and North Holme, in the

North Riding of the county of York,—is, except the townships of Kirbymoorside, and Welburn, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The townships of Kirbymoorside, and Welburn, in the North Riding of the county of York, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following place declared by Order of Council dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the Common at Swardeston, in the Eastern Division of the county of Norfolk, together with the farm premises, buildings, and lands immediately contiguous to or adjoining the said Common,—is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
