THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke The Schleswig-Holstein Order of 1881: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date when this revocation takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
