A PROCLAMATION.

In order to the Electing a Peer of Scotland.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS David Graham Drummond, Earl of Airlie, was duly elected and returned to be one of the sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased: In order to the Electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, at Edinburgh, on Wednesday, the eleventh day of January next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said David Graham Drummond, Earl of Airlie, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross, at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

Given at Our Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, this ninth day of *December*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Our reign.

WHEREAS Alfred Herbert Lush Esquire Barrister-at-Law duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1859 and the Municipal Corporations Act 1859 Amendment Act 1861 for the purpose of determining the boundaries of the Wards of the borough of Portsmouth, and of apportioning the Councillors thereto transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his determination and apportionment in the following terms:—

“Borough of Portsmouth.

“Whereas, Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council and in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act 1859 to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Portsmouth in the county of Southampton shall be divided and to order and direct that the said borough shall be divided into fourteen wards which Order was made on the fifth day of January 1881.

“And whereas on the sixth day of July in the year last aforesaid the Right Honourable Sir Robert Lush, Knight, one of the Lords Justices of Her Majesty's Court of Appeal then being the Senior Judge in the Commission of Assize for the Summer Circuit next after the making of the said Order did duly appoint me Alfred Herbert Lush Esquire Barrister-at-Law for the purpose of determining the boundaries of such wards and apportioning the number of the Councillors of the said borough among such wards, and apportioning the Councillors for the wards altered amongst the new wards as in the said Act and in the Municipal Corporations Act 1859 Amendment Act mentioned.

“Now I the said Alfred Herbert Lush do hereby in pursuance of the powers given me by

virtue of the said appointment under the said Acts determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the fourteen wards into which the said borough is to be divided, which wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows that is to say—

“Ward No. 1 otherwise the Ward of Saint Thomas.

“Ward No. 2, otherwise the Ward of Saint George.

“Ward No. 3, otherwise the Ward of Saint John.

“Ward No. 4, otherwise the Ward of Saint Mathew.

“Ward No. 5, otherwise the Ward of Saint Mark.

“Ward No. 6 otherwise the Ward of All Saints.

“Ward No. 7 otherwise the Ward of Saint James.

“Ward No. 8 otherwise the Ward of Saint Mary.

“Ward No. 9 otherwise the Ward of Saint Barnabas.

“Ward No. 10 otherwise the Ward of Saint Paul.

“Ward No. 11 otherwise the Ward of Saint Luke.

“Ward No. 12 otherwise the Ward of Saint Bartholomew.

“Ward No. 13 otherwise the Ward of Saint Jude.

“Ward No. 14 otherwise the ward of Saint Simon.

“And I do hereby determine, that the said Ward No. 1 otherwise the Ward of Saint Thomas, shall comprise such portion of the old borough of Portsmouth as is contained within a line drawn from the obelisk in front of the Clarence Esplanade Pier in a north-eastward direction along the road leading past the Pier Hotel and Bellevue terrace, Jubilee-terrace and King's-terrace to King's-road along King's-road to a point where it meets Upper Grigg-street along Upper Grigg-street and Grigg-street to Commercial-road along Commercial-road in a north-eastward direction to a point where it meets Park-road, thence along Park-road and along Park-road West to a point where it meets Saint George's-road, thence in a straight line to the north-east corner of the basin in the Gun Wharf, thence along the north-west wall of such basin to the entrance to the said basin thence following the south wall of the Old Gun Wharf to the south-west corner thereof, thence in a straight line due west to the borough boundary and thence following such boundary to the Clarence Esplanade Pier and so to the obelisk aforesaid.

“And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 2 otherwise the Ward of Saint George shall comprise so much of the old borough of Portsmouth as is contained within a line drawn from the entrance to the basin in the Gun Wharf along the north west wall of such basin to the north-east corner thereof, thence in a straight line to a point where Saint George's-road meets Park-road West, thence along Park-road West, and Park-road to Commercial-road, along Commercial-road in a northward direction to a point where it meets Edinburgh-road, along Edinburgh-road and Queen-street past the Dockyard wall to the Dockyard gates on the Hard, thence following the line of the Dockyard to the south-west corner thereof, thence in a straight line due west to the borough boundary, and following such boundary to a point due west of the south-west corner of the Old Gun Wharf continuing in a straight line to such

corner and following the south wall of such Old Gun Wharf to the entrance to the basin aforesaid.

“And I do hereby determine, that the said Ward No. 3 otherwise the Ward of Saint John, shall comprise such portion of the old borough of Portsmouth as is contained within a line drawn from the Dockyard gates on the Hard proceeding past the Dockyard wall along Queen-street, and along Edinburgh-road to a point where it meets Spring-street, along Spring-street to Charlotte-street, and along Charlotte-street in a westward direction to Conway-street, along Conway-street to the Dockyard wall, following the wall to the north-west corner of the Dockyard, thence in a straight line due west to the borough boundary, following the line of such boundary to a point due west of the south-west corner of the Dockyard, thence in a straight line to such corner, and following the line of the Dockyard to the Dockyard gates aforesaid.

“And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 4 otherwise the Ward of Saint Mathew, shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from the Dockyard wall at a point opposite the western end of Regent-street along Regent-street and Sultan-road to Kingston-road, along Kingston-road in a northward direction to a point where it meets Bedford-street thence along Bedford-street and Elm-road to Commercial-road and along Commercial-road and Stanishaw-lane to high water mark at a point due north of Stanishaw-lane, thence following the line of high water mark towards the east to the borough boundary, and following such boundary round the harbour to a point due west of the north-west corner of the Dockyard, thence in a straight line to such corner, and following the Dockyard wall to the starting point above mentioned.

“And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 5 otherwise the Ward of Saint Mark shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth, and of the parish of Portsea, as are contained within a line drawn from high water mark at a point due north of Stanishaw-lane, along Stanishaw-lane and along Commercial-road to a point where it meets Elm-road, thence along Elm-road and Bedford-street to Kingston-road, and along Kingston-road in a southward direction to a point where it meets New-road, along New-road across the railway at Copnor and along Tangier-lane to the borough boundary following the borough boundary round the north-eastern and northern borders till it meets high water mark to the north-west of the borough and then following the line of high water mark to the starting point above-mentioned.

“And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 6 otherwise the Ward of All Saints, shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from the Dockyard wall at a point opposite the western end of Regent-street, along Regent-street, and Sultan-road to Kingston-road, along Kingston-road in a southward direction to a point where it meets Lake-road and along Lake-road, Charlotte-street and Conway-street, to the Dockyard wall following the wall to the starting point above mentioned.

“And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 7 otherwise the Ward of Saint James, shall comprise such portion of the parish of Portsea as is contained within a line drawn from the entrance to the old canal in Langston Harbour, along the bed of the old canal and along the railway to Fratton railway bridge thence along Fratton-road, and along Kingston-road to a point where it

meets New-road, and along New-road across the railway at Copnor and along Tangier-lane to the borough boundary following the borough boundary towards the south to a point due east of the aforesaid entrance to the old canal thence in a straight line to such entrance as aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine, that the said Ward No. 8 otherwise the Ward of Saint Mary shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from a point where Lake-road meets Kingston-road in a southward direction along Kingston-road and along Fratton-road, to a point where it meets Fitzroy-street along Fitzroy-street, Harley-street, Waltham-street and Crasswell-street to a point where Church-path intersects the latter, thence along Church-path in a south-westward direction, and along Lower Church-path to Commercial-road, across Commercial-road and along Edinburgh-road to a point where it meets Spring-street along Spring-street to Charlotte-street along Charlotte-street in an eastward direction, and along Lake-road to the starting point above-mentioned.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 9 otherwise the Ward of St. Barnabas shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from the south-west corner of the town railway station in a northward direction along Commercial-road to a point where it meets Lower Church-path, thence along Lower Church-path, and along Church-path to a point where it intersects Crasswell-street thence along Crasswell-street, Waltham-street, Harley-street and Fitzroy-street to Fratton-road, and along Fratton-road, in a southward direction to Fratton railway bridge thence along the south wall of the railway to the aforesaid corner of the railway station.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 10 otherwise the Ward of Saint Paul, shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from the obelisk in front of Clarence Esplanade Pier in a north-eastward direction along the road leading past the Pier Hotel, Belle Vue-terrace, Jubilee-terrace and King's-terrace to King's-road, along King's-road to a point where it meets Upper Grigg-street, along Upper Grigg-street and Grigg-street, to Commercial-road, thence in a north-eastward direction along Commercial-road to a point where it meets Brunswick-road thence along Brunswick-road and along Hyde Park-road to a point where it meets Grosvenor-street, along Grosvenor-street, Green-road, Park-lane and Castle-road, to the Cross-roads opposite the Castle Hotel and thence in a straight line to the obelisk aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 11 otherwise the Ward of Saint Luke shall comprise such portions of the old borough of Portsmouth and of the parish of Portsea as are contained within a line drawn from the south-west corner of the town railway station along Commercial-road in a south-westward direction to a point where it meets Brunswick-road along Brunswick-road and along Hyde Park-road to a point where it meets Grosvenor-street thence along Grosvenor-street to Somers-street, along Somers-street and Somers-road to Somers-road railway-bridge thence following the south wall of the railway to the aforesaid corner of the railway station.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 12 otherwise the Ward of Saint Bartholomew shall comprise such portion of the parish of Port-

sea as is contained within a line drawn from the entrance to the old canal in Langston Harbour along the bed of the old canal, and along the railway to Somers-road railway bridge thence along Somers-road in a south-westward direction to a point where it meets Baileys-road, along Baileys-road to Victoria-road North, along Victoria-road North and Victoria-road to a point where the latter road meets Albert-road thence along Albert-road Highland-road and Henderson-road to the south-west corner of the Borough Sewage Pumping Station at Eastney thence following the west wall of such pumping station to high water mark and following the line of high water mark past the causeway and towards the north to the aforesaid entrance to the old canal.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 13 otherwise the Ward of Saint Jude shall comprise such portion of the parish of Portsea as is contained within a line drawn from the obelisk in front of Clarence Esplanade Pier in a straight line to the cross-roads opposite the Castle Hotel, thence along Castle-road, Park-lane and Green-road to Somers-street, along Somers-street and along Somers-road, to a point where it meets Baileys-road, thence along Baileys-road to Victoria-road North and along Victoria-road North and Victoria-road to Marmion-road, along Marmion-road to Palmerston-road thence along Palmerston-road continuing in a straight line due south to the borough boundary and following the line of such boundary round towards the Clarence Esplanade Pier and so on to the obelisk aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 14 otherwise the Ward of Saint Simon shall comprise such portion of the parish of Portsea as is contained within a line drawn from the borough boundary at a point due south of Palmerston-road directly to and along Palmerston-road to Marmion-road, along Marmion-road to Victoria-road, along Victoria-road to a point where it meets Albert-road, thence along Albert-road Highland-road and Henderson-road to the south-west corner of the Borough Sewage Pumping Station at Eastney thence following the west wall of such pumping station to high water mark and following the line of high water mark past the causeway and towards the north to the entrance to the old canal in Langston Harbour, thence in a straight line due east to the borough boundary and following such boundary round the southern borders of the borough to the starting point above mentioned.

"And I do hereby declare that whenever in the description of the boundary lines of the several wards so set out as aforesaid any line is said to be drawn along or to or from any street, road, lane path or line of railway, or canal such line shall be considered to be drawn along or to or from the middle of such street, road, lane, path, line of railway, or canal, and whenever in such description any line is said to be drawn to or from a point where any street, road, lane or path meets any other street, road, lane, or path, that point shall be considered to be described at which a line drawn along the middle of the one street, road, lane or path would intersect a line drawn along the middle of the other street, road, lane or path if both lines were prolonged sufficiently far.

"And I the said Alfred Herbert Lush do hereby in further pursuance of the said Acts and of the powers given me under the same by virtue of the said appointment, assign and apportion three Councillors to each and every of the said several wards as follows, that is to say:—

"To Ward No. 1.—Councillors William Henry Saunders, Richard Ward Beale, and Barnard Charles Miller.

"To Ward No. 2.—Councillors George Scarrott, George Frederick Sherman, and John Dunning.

"To Ward No. 3.—Councillors George Wilkins, Harry Pilworth Foster, and William Abraham Bone.

"To Ward No. 4.—Councillors George Wendover, George Henry Dean, and Charles Moorshead.

"To Ward No. 5.—Councillors Richard John Murrell, George Jenkins, and James Hippett Allen.

"To Ward No. 6.—Councillors William James Tuck, William Tuck, and William Kimber.

"To Ward No. 7.—Councillors George Ashdowne, George Hall King, and Henry Kempster.

"To Ward No. 8.—Councillors John Kennedy, John Arnold, and John Edwards.

"To Ward No. 9.—Councillors Thomas Scott Foster, Monoah Jepps, and Joseph McAskie.

"To Ward No. 10.—Councillors James Moody, Henry Bainton, and William Ward.

"To Ward No. 11.—Councillors George Thomas Cunningham, Thomas Good, and Edward Hanham.

"To Ward No. 12.—Councillors James Gieve, Frederick Power, and William Gannell.

"To Ward No. 13.—Councillors Richard Marvin, Charles Townsend, and Albert Addison.

"To Ward No. 14.—Councillors George Ellis, Daniel West, and Alfred Starling Beake.

POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 AND 1880.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 AND 1880.

WHEREAS the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, provides that, subject to the Post Office regulations, the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, may, for the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office, authorize his officers, or any of them, to issue orders in the form set forth in the Schedule to that Act, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions contained in the said Act :

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorized, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to make Post Office regulations relating to money orders, and to the persons by or to whom money orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid :

And whereas by Post Office regulations, dated the 11th day of October, 1880, made by me, the Right Honourable Henry Fawcett, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, provision was made for the issue and payment by certain officers of the Post Office in the United Kingdom, including therein the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, of money orders in the form set forth in the Schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, which orders were in the said regulations referred to as postal orders :

And whereas it is expedient to make similar provision for the issue and payment of postal orders by officers of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General in charge of money order offices in Malta and Gibraltar, and for that purpose to repeal the said regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Henry Fawcett, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance of the said Acts, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order as follows :—

1. These regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, on and from which date the said regulations dated the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, are hereby repealed, without prejudice never-

theless to anything already done in pursuance thereof.

2. Such officer or officers for the time being of the Post Office as the Postmaster-General from time to time directs, shall superintend the execution of these regulations, and, subject to the Post Office regulations, and to such directions as may be from time to time issued by the Postmaster-General, may exercise any authority given by these regulations to the Postmaster-General, and exercise such powers and give such directions as may seem necessary or proper for carrying into effect these regulations.

3. An officer in charge of a money order office in the United Kingdom, or in Malta or Gibraltar, and any such officer as may from time to time be authorized in this behalf by the Postmaster-General (which officers are in these regulations referred to as postmasters), may issue and pay money orders in the form set forth in the schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, which orders are in these regulations referred to as postal orders.

A postmaster may, subject to any restrictions or directions from time to time given by the Postmaster-General, do by deputy anything under these regulations.

4. Every such postal order shall be for one of the following amounts, and in respect thereof the following poundage shall be paid:—

5. Before a Postmaster issues a postal order, the amount of the order and the poundage thereon shall be paid to him; and he shall sign the order and stamp it with the proper stamp, specifying the day of the month in which the order is issued.

6. The postal order shall be printed on such paper and in such characters and with such distinctive marks whether on the face of it or in the paper or otherwise, and the amount of the poundage shall be denominated by means of such stamp or mark as the Postmaster-General, with the concurrence of the Commissioners of the Treasury, from time to time directs.

7. (a.) The blanks in a postal order for the name of the person entitled to the money (in these regulations referred to as the payee) and for the name of the money order office at which it is to be paid may be filled in before or after issue.

(b.) If the blanks are not filled in before issue the person to whom the order is issued must before parting with it fill in the name of the payee, and may fill in the name of the money order office at which the amount is to be paid.

(c.) The payee must sign the receipt at the foot of the order, and must also fill in the name of the money order office if that has not been already done.

(d.) No alteration can be made in the name of the payee, or of the money order office when once filled in, except by the direction of the Postmaster-General.

8. A postal order presented by or through a banker for payment will not (in the absence of an express arrangement between such banker and the Postmaster-General to the contrary) be paid

until after such order has been examined at the chief office in London.

9. (a.) When a postal order is presented for payment otherwise than through a banker, the postmaster shall require the receipt for the amount of the Order to be first signed, and may refuse payment until he is satisfied that it is signed by or under the authority of the person appearing to be the payee.

(b.) He may also, if the receipt is not signed in his presence, take reasonable means to satisfy himself that the person presenting the order is either the payee or his agent.

(c.) He shall also require the person presenting the order to sign his name on the order before its payment, although the receipt has been already signed.

(d.) Nevertheless, the signature to the receipt shall in all cases be a sufficient authority to the postmaster for the payment of the amount of the order if that signature purports to be the signature of the payee; and it shall not be necessary to prove that the receipt was signed by or under the authority of the payee.

10. (a.) A postal order may be crossed; it may be crossed generally by the addition on its face of the words "and Company," or any abbreviation thereof, between two parallel transverse lines, or of two parallel transverse lines simply; it may be crossed specially by the addition on its face of the name of a banker, in which case the order shall be deemed to be crossed to that banker.

(b.) A postal order which is crossed generally may be crossed specially.

(c.) A banker to whom a postal order is crossed may again cross it specially to another banker as his agent for collection.

(d.) Where a postal order is crossed generally a postmaster shall refuse to pay it except to a banker.

(e.) Where a postal order is crossed specially a postmaster shall refuse to pay it except to the banker to whom it is crossed, or to his agent for collection.

(f.) Where a postal order is crossed specially to more than one banker, except when crossed to an agent for the purpose of collection, a postmaster shall refuse payment thereof.

11. If a postal order which is crossed, whether generally or specially, is presented for payment by or through a banker, with the name of such banker written or stamped upon the face thereof, that name may be accepted as a sufficient receipt for the amount of the order, and the order may be paid without any other receipt.

Provided that where the order is crossed specially to a second banker as agent for collection the name of such second banker, written or stamped upon the face of the order, may be accepted as a receipt under this regulation.

An order which is crossed generally or specially, if presented for payment by or through a banker, may be paid at any money order office in the United Kingdom, or in Malta or Gibraltar, notwithstanding that the blank has been filled in with the name of some particular money order office.

12. After the expiration of three months from the last day of the month in which any such order is issued, the order shall be payable only on payment in the manner for the time being directed by the Postmaster-General of a commission equal to the amount of the original poundage, with the addition, if more than three months have elapsed since the said expiration, of the amount of the original poundage for every further period of three months which has so elapsed, and for every por-

tion of any such period of three months over and above every complete period.

13. A postal order will be payable during the hours for the time being appointed for money order business at the money order office at which it is presented for payment.

14. If a postal order presented for payment has any erasure or alteration, or is cut, defaced, or mutilated, the postmaster may refuse payment, and refer the person presenting it to the Postmaster-General.

15. A postmaster may refuse or delay the payment of a postal order, but shall immediately report such delay or refusal, with his reasons for it, to the Postmaster-General.

16. A postmaster upon paying a postal order shall immediately stamp it with the proper stamp specifying the date, and thereby cancel the order.

17. The payment of the amount of a postal order to whomsoever made shall discharge the Postmaster-General and his officers from all liability whatsoever in respect of that order, notwithstanding any forgery, fraud, mistake, or loss which may have been committed or have occurred in reference to such order, or to the procuring thereof, or to obtaining the payment thereof, and notwithstanding any disregard of these regulations, and notwithstanding anything whatsoever.

18. These regulations shall apply to the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and the expression "United Kingdom" shall be deemed to include the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

19. In these regulations—

The expression "Postmaster-General" means the Postmaster-General for the time being.

The masculine includes the feminine, and the plural includes the singular and the singular includes the plural.

The expression "post office regulations" means regulations from time to time made in pursuance of the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880.

(1.) Cape St. Francis Lighthouse—Intended Sector of Red Light.

THE Government of the Cape Colony has given notice, that arrangements having been completed for fixing the necessary red shades within the lantern, it is intended on 1st July, 1882, to exhibit at Cape St. Francis Lighthouse an arc of red light extending from the bearing of S. 30° W. to S. 83° W.

From a vessel to the eastward the light on a bearing of S. 83° W. will show distinctly red, but the mariner is cautioned that, in consequence of want of sharpness in the change, an appearance of red may be observed over a further $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$, so that a slight redness might be observable when bearing N. $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. from a vessel.—The light will continue red over the whole area between that bearing and the shore to the eastward.

The change from red to white, westward (*i.e.* on the bearing of S. 30° W.), occurs over the land. No red light will be visible from any place at sea, except from within the area of the light indicated in the preceding paragraph. The arc of red light includes the sectors of darkness caused by the intervening hillocks on Cape St. Francis, eastward of the lighthouse.

NOTE.—The red light should not be seen at all from a vessel passing on a safe course up or down the coast; and, if seen, warns the navigator of his dangerous approach to the shore.

KOWIE RIVER.

(2.) Beacon on Glendower Peak.

Also, dated 22nd October, 1881, that a beacon has been erected a little on the seaward face of Glendower Peak, about 4 miles westward of Kowie River (Port Alfred), which will serve well to distinguish that monotonous part of the coast.
