## A PROCLAMATION.

William R.

**W**HEREAS We have received Information, That Edmond Ludlow, commonly call'd Colonel Ludlow, who stands Attainted of High Treason by Act of Parliament, for the Horrid and Execrable Murder of Our Royal Grandfather, hath presumed to come into this Our Kingdom, and therein privily lurketh, and is conceal'd; We have therefore thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Proclamation; And do hereby Command and Require all Our Loving Subjects, to Discover, Take and Apprehend the said Edmond Ludlow, where-ever he may be found, and to carry him before the next Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, whom We do hereby Require to Commit him to the next Gaol. And We do hereby Require the said Justice or other Magistrate, immediately to give Notice thereof to Us, or Our Council: And We do promise to him or them, that shall Discover or Apprehend the said Edmond Ludlow, for a Reward, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds. And we do also hereby give Notice to all persons, that shall conceal the said Edmond Ludlow, or be Aiding or Assisting in the Concealing of him, or furthering his Escape, that they shall be proceeded against for such their Offence, with the utmost Severity according to Law.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the 14th day of November, 1689. In the First Year of Our Reign.

*Rome, October 29.* On Sunday last the Pope took possession of St. Jan de Lateran with the usual Solemnity. The next day Don Livio resigned the Place of General of the Ecclesiastical State, which was conferred upon him by the College of Cardinals during the vacancy of this See. The Pope has given two Abbeys, which are worth 20000 Crowns a year, to his great Nephew, who, it's believed will likewise be made a Cardinal. The Cardinal of Bouillon has bought a house in this City, with intention to continue here some time.

*Venice, October 4.* By a Vessel come from Zant we have advice, that our Gallies had met with four Turkish Gallies and two Gallions, which were going with Succors to Napoli di Makvasia, and had taken the two Gallions, in which were 200 Turks, but the Gallies escaped. The Prince Antonio Octoboni will part from hence on Monday next for Rome. The Senate have agreed with a Swiss Officer about a Levy of 10000 men, and are treating with others for the same purpose. They expect great assistance from the Pope for the carrying on the War against the Turks.

*Genoa, Novemb. 1.* On the 27th past the Spanish Envoy residing here had a publick Audience of this Senate; To whom he represented, That the King his Master being informed that the Duke of Mantua had, with the assistance of French Mony, caused Guastalla to be fortified, contrary to the Conditions specified in the Act of the Interference of that Dutchy, which might have very prejudicial consequences to the Quiet of Italy, his Majesty had ordered the Governor of Milan to cause some Troops to advance that way to put a stop to the said Fortifications; That the Governor of Milan had thereupon sent to the said Duke to acquaint him with this resolution; and that he expected his answer at Casalmaggiore. The French Gallies parted from hence the 28th, on their return to Marsailles. The French have taken three Vessels belonging to this Republick, which may occasion the giving out here of Letters of Reprizal.

*Milan, Novemb. 2.* The Duke of Mantua has at the instance of our Governor given orders for the demolishing the Fortifications of Guastalla. Our Governor intends, it's said, to take a Journey towards Sabionetta.

*Vienna, Novemb. 6.* The Turkish Envoys that are here do press that the Treaty of Peace may be renewed, which they have now, as they say, full Power to conclude with the Emperor and his Allies; an account whereof has been sent to Amboy by an Express; and we are expecting

ing his Imperial Majesties Orders thereupon. We have nothing new from the Imperial Army in *Seravia*. Several Troops are appointed to reinforce the Blockade of *Great Waradin*.

*Ausbourg, Novemb. 6.* The Elector of *Bavaria* arrived here the 25th inst; and parted again on the 30th for *Munick*. The same day came to this place the Duke of *Lorraine*; who, on the 2d instant, continued his Journey towards *Inspbruck*. The Imperial Ministers have had several Conferences with the General Officers, and the Deputies of the Circles, about regulating the Winter-quarters.

*Frankfort, Novemb. 9.* The Troops of *Saxony*, which lay near *Hanibron*, have passed the *Necker*, and are gone into their Winter-quarters in the *Bergstræet*. On *Saturday* last a Party of Hussars advanced to the very Gates of *Philipsbourg*; and falling upon their Men that were working on some out Fortifications, kill'd an Engineer, and some others, and took several Prisoners, without any other opposition from the Garrison, than the firing some Cannon, which did not hinder the Hussars from executing their Design.

*Cologne, Novemb. 15.* There are now twelve *Minister* Companies in Garrison here; and we expect a Battalion of *Brandenburghers*, with some Troops of *Neubourg*; which are to continue here the whole Winter. Several Regiments of *Brandenburghers* are likewise quartered in the *Lower Diocese*; and 18 Companies of Foot, with 11 Troops of Horse and Dragoons, of his Electoral Highness's Forces, are lodged at *Aix la Chapelle*. The French Troops, that were encamped at *Echternach* near the *Moselle*, are separated and gone into Quarters: And those commanded by the *Marschal of Duras*, near *Landau*, have done the like. The Queen of *Spain* parted the 13th instant from *Duseldorp* towards *Zealand*; where her Majesty is to embark.

*Hague, Novemb. 18.* The Queen of *Spain* passed by *Dort* on the 16th instant towards *Zealand*. The Meeting of the Electors at *Ausbourg*, for the choosing a King of the Romans, is put off 'till the next month. We hear from *Namur*, that a Party of that Garrison had lately taken eight French Wagon, which were going with Provisions and Ammunition to *Dinant*. Prince *Waldeck* is expected here the beginning of the next week.

*Paris, Novemb. 19.* The Troops are every where gone into Winter-quarters; the *Marschal d'Hannover* is return'd to *Lisse*; and the *Marschal de Lorge* will remain at *Metz* this Winter. On the 8th instant we had the ill News of two of our *East-India* Ships (very richly laden,) being taken by the Dutch: And we are in great pain for another of our Ships, bound home from *Suratte*: These losses fall very heavy upon the *East India* Company here. The French Gallies that carried the Cardinals to *Civita Vecchia* are returned to *Marseilles*. It's expected the next Letters from *Rome* will give an account of a Promotion of Cardinals. We have advice that the Queen of *Portugal* was on the 21 past brought to bed of a Son, who is called Prince of *Brazile*.

*Glasgow, Novemb. 4.* This being His Majesties Birth-day was kept here with extraordinary Solemnity; The Train Bands of the City, consisting of about 1800 Men, appeared in Arms, and fired several Volleys, with repeated Huzzas: The Magistrates, attended by the principal Citizens, expressing at the same time their Satisfaction and Dutiful Affection to Their Majesties Persons and Government. The Regiment of Foot commanded by the Viscount of *Kennure*, joyned with the Citizens in these Demonstrations of their Loyalty. And at night the Streets were fill'd with Bonfires, with ringing of Bells, and all other Expressions of Joy; which were so universal, that the like were never before seen here.

*Dundalk, Novemb. 8.* Our Army is marching into Winter-quarters; Ten Regiments marched from hence yesterday; and the rest this day, except six Regiments of Foot that remain in this Town; His Grace the Duke of *Schomberg* goes away to-morrow for *Lisnegarvey*. The Irish Army decamped the last week; they have left 6 or 7 Regiments at *Ardee*, and as many at *Drugheda*; and the rest are gone into other Quarters.

*Hull, Novemb. 14.* Yesterday arrived here above 60 Sail, with the Danish Forces, bound for *Scotland*, having been forced thither by a violent Storm. Some Vessels that

were separated from the Fleet are, we hear, put into *Tinmouth*, and other Ports on this Coast.

*Plymouth, Novemb. 12.* Yesterday arrived here Their Majesties Ships the *Monk*, Sir *Cloudey Shovel* Commander, the *Tempest*, the *Tyrk*, and the *Adriack*, with five Tenders, from the *Eastward*: We have advice, that a French Ship of 150 Tun, and 60 Men, laden with Tobacco, Indigo, and Sugar, was forced ashore 3 or 4 days ago on the Island of *Scilly*; but the Ship is saved, and all the Men secured.

*Whitehall, Novemb. 16.* His Majesty has been Graciously pleas'd to appoint *Lambert Blackwell* Esq; to be His Consul at *Leghorn*.
