And We do promise to kint or them, that shall Discover ammediately to give Notice thereof to Us, or Our Cernicit: And We do promise to him or them, that shall Discover or Apprehend the said Edmond Livilow, for a Remard, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds. And We do also her by give stocked to all version; that someout are said but mond Livilow, or be diding or Assistance in the Concealing of him, or furthering his Escape, that they shall be proceeded against for such their Offence, with the utmost Severity according to Law.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the 14th day of November, 1689. In the First Year of Our Reign.
