THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome, enclosing a Decree of the Italian Government respecting quarantine, of which the following is a translation, viz:—

"ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH. No. 4.

"The Minister of the Interior in virtue of the Law on Public Health of March 20th, 1865, Art. C, and the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, on the advice of the High Sanitary Commission:

"DECREES:

"That whilst the prohibition of the importation into the kingdom of cattle and sheep from the Bombay Presidency, the Russian ports on the Black Sea and the Sea of Azoff, Bulgaria, Greece, and Egypt remains in force, the Ordinances of Maritime Health, No. 5, of 2nd August, 1875, No. 7, of 20th December, 1877, No. 4, of 14th February, 1878, No. 12, of 12th August, 1878, No. 9, of 3rd March, 1879, are from this date revoked, as far as concerns the treatment and disinfection of undressed skins, wools, horns, hoofs, bones, and other animal remnants from the said places of departure, which articles may therefore be received 'en pratique,' except as regards the examination of undressed skins, according to Arts. 175, et seq., of the above mentioned Ministerial Instructions.

"The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of the above Ordinance.
