PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament, holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after

reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing, (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Chester hath made a Representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of York in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend William by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York.

"Whereas by reason of the great inequality in population of certain of the parishes in the city and my diocese of Chester it is expedient that an alteration of the area of such parishes should be effected in manner hereinafter set forth.

"Now I William by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Chester do hereby represent to your Grace that there is my diocese of Chester the vicarage and parish of Saint Oswald Chester the most populous part of which parish is situate in the city of Chester and consists of two well defined portions or districts known as Saint Oswalds within the Walls and Saint Oswalds without the Walls the former of which is shown on the plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured blue.

"That the south transept of the cathedral church of Chester (also shown on the said plan)

"situate in the said city within the walls was heretofore and for many years past used as the parish church of Saint Oswald aforesaid and in accordance with an arrangement between the Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church patrons of the said vicarage and parish church of Saint Oswald and the vicar of the said parish and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and myself the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners have with all necessary consents by an instrument under their common seal dated the third day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one made under and by virtue of the powers contained in the statutes 8 and 9 Victoria chapter 70 and of the 19th and 20th Victoria chapter 55 transferred all rights emoluments tithes and other endowments of the parish church of Saint Oswald to the church of Saint Thomas theretofore a consecrated chapel of ease in the said parish of Saint Oswald situate in that portion of the said parish known as Saint Oswalds without the Walls to the intent that the said church of Saint Thomas should be from the date of the said instrument in all respects the sole parish church of the said parish of Saint Oswald.

"That in consequence of such transfers as aforesaid the said transept of the said cathedral hath ceased to be available as a church for the said parish.

"That there is now no consecrated church or chapel belonging to the said parish of Saint Oswald situate in that part or district thereof known as Saint Oswalds within the Walls.

"And the said church of Saint Thomas is situate at the distance of six hundred yards at least from any portion of the said last-mentioned district.

"That the population of the said parish of Saint Oswald amounts according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one to six thousand two hundred and fifty persons. That it is estimated that the district known as Saint Oswalds within the Walls contains one thousand two hundred and fifty persons and that the population of the district known as Saint Oswalds without the Walls in the said city contains five thousand persons.

"That there is also within the said city of Chester the rectory and parish of Saint Martin (now united for ecclesiastical purposes to the rectory and parish of Saint Bridget) the parish whereof comprises a district the boundaries of which are well known and defined and which is also shown on the plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured red.

"That the last-mentioned district contains no church or chapel and is distant from its parish church six hundred and fifty yards or thereabouts and is contiguous to the portion of the parish of Saint Oswald aforesaid situate within the Walls.

"That the population of the said united parishes of Saint Bridget and Saint Martin amounts according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one to one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three persons of whom it is estimated that the said district contains one hundred and twenty persons.

"That there is also within the said city of Chester the rectory of Holy Trinity the parish whereof comprises a district the boundaries of which are well known and defined and which is also shown on the plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green.

"That the last-mentioned district contains no church or chapel but adjoins the parish church of Holy Trinity at its south-west corner as by reference to the said plan will more clearly appear.

"That the population of the said parish of Holy Trinity amounts according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one to three thousand and twenty persons of whom it is estimated that the last-mentioned district contains four hundred and fifty persons.

"That there is also within the said city of Chester the rectory and parish of Saint Peter the population whereof amounts according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one to six hundred and twenty-two persons and such population is and has been for some time past decreasing owing to the fact that most of the houses in the said parish which is situate in the centre of the said city are occupied as shops and other places of business the owners and occupiers of which reside in the suburban parishes.

"That the parish church of Saint Peter aforesaid affords accommodation for seven hundred persons.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice of Saint Oswald not reckoning the house of residence as an item is three hundred pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said vicarage of Saint Oswald belongs to the Dean and Chapter of my Cathedral Church of Chester and the Reverend William Henry Lawrence Cogswell Clerk M.A. is now the vicar thereof.

"That the net annual value of the said united benefices of Saint Bridget and Saint Martin not reckoning the house of residence as an item is two hundred and forty pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said united rectories of Saint Bridget and Saint Martin belongs to me as Bishop of the diocese of Chester and the Venerable John Lionel Darby, Clerk M.A. is now the rector thereof.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice of Holy Trinity (there being no house of residence) is two hundred and seventy pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said rectory of Holy Trinity belongs to the Right Honourable Edward Henry Earl of Derby and the Reverend Edward Marston Clerk M.A. is now the rector thereof.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice of Saint Peter (not reckoning the interest allowed to the incumbent by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England on the sum of one thousand five hundred pounds granted by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and held by them as a fund wherewith to provide a house of residence for the said benefice of Saint Peter) is one hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of the said rectory of Saint Peter belongs to me as Bishop of the diocese of Chester and the Reverend Johnston Hamilton Acheson Clerk M.A. is now the rector thereof.

"That the patrons other than myself of the said benefices of Saint Oswald Saint Bridget with Saint Martin Holy Trinity and Saint Peter respectively and the respective incumbents of the same benefices are all consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to me that the district part of the said parish of Saint Oswald known as Saint Oswald within the Walls and coloured blue on the said plan the district part of the said parish of Saint Martin coloured red on the said plan and the district part of the said parish of Holy Trinity coloured green on the said plan may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter 49 be advantageously separated

from the respective parishes to which they belong and be annexed to the said parish of Saint Peter which is also shown on the said plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do submit the same to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this fourteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

And whereas the Scheme and Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"It is proposed to separate from the said parishes of Saint Oswald, Saint Martin and Holy Trinity in the city and diocese of Chester to which they respectively belong the districts respectively coloured blue, red and green on the plan hereunto annexed and described in the schedule hereto and to annex them to the said parish of Saint Peter coloured yellow on the said plan so as to constitute with the said parish of Saint Peter one parish and benefice for ecclesiastical purposes of which the church of Saint Peter aforesaid shall be the parish church.

"That the respective incumbents of the several parishes from which the said districts are separated shall cease to have cure of souls within the said several districts respectively and the rector of the said parish of Saint Peter shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said districts.

"That the inhabitants of the said districts shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the several parish churches of the parishes to which they have respectively belonged or any other church or chapel churches or chapels hereafter to be erected in such parishes respectively but shall be liable as other inhabitants of the said parish of Saint Peter to the repair of the parish church of Saint Peter and that the inhabitants of the said districts shall have the same rights as to pews and performance of all offices and services of the church at the said parish church of Saint Peter and otherwise in relation to the same church and the parish belonging thereto as other inhabitants of the same parish.

"That the fees for such offices and services performed for the inhabitants of the said districts or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the rectory of Saint Peter aforesaid.

"That no change be made by this scheme in regard to any glebe lands or tithe rent-charge or tithes charged or chargeable on land in the said districts or any part or parts thereof nor in the patronage of any of the parishes or churches affected thereby.

"The SCHEDULE above referred to.

"1. The district proposed to be separated from the parish of Saint Oswald in the city of Chester

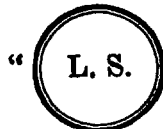
and annexed to the parish of Saint Peter in the same city known as Saint Oswald within the Walls is bounded on the north partly by the city walls and partly by the Cathedral Precincts and the city walls on the south and west by the parishes of Saint John the Baptist and Saint Peter by the district of the parish of Holy Trinity hereinafter described the district of the parish of Saint Martin hereinafter described and other part of the parish of Saint Martin and the city walls in the said city.

"2. The district proposed to be separated from the parish of Saint Martin in the city of Chester and annexed to the parish of Saint Peter in the same city is bounded on the north and east by the last-mentioned district of Saint Oswald within the Walls on the west by the centre of Princess-street and the parish of Holy Trinity in the said city.

"3. The district proposed to be separated from the parish of Holy Trinity in the city of Chester and annexed to the parish of Saint Peter in the same city is bounded on the north and part of the east sides thereof by the first described district on the remainder of the east by the said parish of Saint Peter on the south by the centre of Watergate-street and on the west by the centre of Trinity-street in the said city.

"To the Most Reverend William by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York.

"We the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary in Chester the patrons or the persons entitled to present to the vicarage of Saint Oswald in the city and diocese of Chester in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend William Henry Lawrence Cogswell Clerk M.A. vicar of the said vicarage and I the Right Honourable Edward Henry Earl of Derby the patron or the person entitled to present to the rectory of Holy Trinity in the city and diocese of Chester in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Edward Marston Clerk M.A. Rector of the said rectory and I William by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Chester the patron or the person entitled to present to the united rectories of Saint Bridget and Saint Martin and the rectory of Saint Peter all in the city and diocese of Chester respectively in case the same were now vacant and I the Venerable John Lionel Darby Clerk M.A. Archdeacon of Chester and Rector of the said united rectories of Saint Bridget and Saint Martin and I the Reverend Johnston Hamilton Acheson Clerk M.A. rector of the said rectory of Saint Peter do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the districts shown on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured blue, red and green from the parishes to which they respectively belong and annexing the same to the parish of Saint Peter in the city and diocese of Chester.

certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two which report is in the words and figures following:—

“That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents in writing thereto of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

“The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

“And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty’s reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty’s Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882, or in The Sales in Districts (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1882, Amendment, the provisions contained in those Orders shall, as from the commencement of this Order, no longer apply to the districts described in the Schedule to this Order.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under those Orders, or either of them, before the com-
