PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

An area comprising so much of the township of Heck, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Hull and Barnsley Railway on the west; the Aire and Calder Canal on the south; the Doncaster and Selby Railway on the east; and the Pontefract and Snaith highway on the north.

(2.) An area comprising so much of the township of Soothill, in the West Riding of the county

of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the first milestone on the Dewsbury and Leeds turnpike-road, thence in an easterly direction to the boundary of the townships of Soothill and Ossett in Shaw Cross-lane, thence by the said boundary in a north-easterly direction to a point three hundred and and thirty yards from the west end of Dogloach Wood, thence in a north-westerly direction to the second milestone on the Leeds and Dewsbury turnpike-road, thence in a south-westerly direction to the north-west corner of Butter Hill Wood, thence by a stream of water which runs along the west side of Butter Hill Wood to broad well in the village of Hanging Heaton, thence by the Old School Newgate and Perseverance foot-path to the first milestone on the Dewsbury and Leeds turnpike-road aforesaid.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

(2.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies between the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow, and the brook known as Wigwell Brook, commencing at the point where it crosses the said road near the village of Great Horwood, and continuing thence to the point where it falls into the Wash Brook which separates the township of Great Horwood from the parish of Addington, and also so much of the township of Great Horwood as lies to the eastward of

the said road and is in the occupation of Frederick Denchfield.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Grandborough, in the county of Buckingham.

Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely).—An area comprised within the following limits, that is to say, commencing at Falls Drove on the west and proceeding to Singlesole, thence along Harley Drove to the Old Wryde Drain, thence along such Drain to Gold Dike, thence along such Dike to the Old South Eau to Falls Drove aforesaid, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cheshire.—So much of the township of Over, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Delamere-street, Woodford-lane, Blakeden-lane to Brookes farm, Littler-lane, Catsclough-lane to Grange farm, Grange-lane, and High-street from Grange-lane End.

Cornwall.—(1.) The parish of Mylor, in the county of Cornwall.

(2.) The parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall.

(3.) The parish of Sancreed, in the county of Cornwall.

(4.) The parishes of Gwinear, and Crowan, and those portions of the parish of Camborne which lie to the southward of the Cornwall Railway, in the county of Cornwall.

(5.) All the lands in the borough of Helston which lie within the following limits, that is to say, from the point on the south-west of the highway leading from Helston to the Lizard at the junction of the parishes of Wendron and Mawgan-in-Meneage outside the farm called Content, along the same road in a south-easterly direction to the cross roads at Dodson's Gap, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the highway to Gweek on to the four cross roads between Menehay and Trevenen-in-Wendron, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the dis-turnstile road to Helston through Wendron-street and Coinage-hall-street down by the main road to the river Cober, (excluding the said roads, streets, and highway,) and from thence along the said river and the margin of the Loe Pool (on the Weldron side) to Carminowe creek, and from thence by the boundary line of the said parish of Wendron up to the point first mentioned.

Cumberland.—The parishes of Whicham, and Millom, in the petty sessional division of Bootle, in the county of Cumberland.

Gloucestershire.—The petty sessional division of Lawford's Gate, in the county of Gloucester.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Bramley, in the petty sessional division of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton.

Lancashire.—(1.) The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(2.) The township of Samlesbury, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(3.) The divisions of Low Quarter and Middle Quarter and a portion of Kirkby Moor bounded on the north by the road from Beanthwaite to Garthwaite, in the township of Kirkby Ireleth, in the petty sessional division of Lonsdale North, in the county of Lancaster.

(4.) So much of the township of Atherton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western Railway on the south and west, Bag-lane on the north, and Leigh-road on the east.

(5.) So much of the borough of Bury, and of the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bury and Rooldale Old-road, Makin-lane, Birtle Moor-road, Mouldin-lane, and Elbert-lane.

Lincolnshire (Holland).—The petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire.

Norfolk.—The parishes of East Walton, West-acre, Gaytonthorpe, East Winch, West Bilney, Pentney, Wormegay, and Ashwicken, in the western division of the county of Norfolk.

Northamptonshire.—(1.) The parishes of Hardingstone, Wootton, Weston Favel, and Abington, in the county of Northampton, and the borough of Northampton.

(2.) The parish of Byfield, in the county of Northampton.

(3.) The parish of Hellidon, in the county of Northampton.

(4.) The parish of Norton, in the county of Northampton.

(5.) The parishes of Paulerspury, and Alderton, in the county of Northampton.

(6.) The parish of Rowell, otherwise Rothwell, in the county of Northampton.

Sussex.—All that part of the parish of Willingdon, in the county of Sussex, lying within the following limits, that is to say, a direct line from the sea by the horse-path to the Langney Sewer, thence in a direct line to the north-western corner of the Anthony Hill Tower field, thence in a direct line to the south-eastern front of the Eastbourne Gas Works, and thence in a direct line to the sea.

Yorkshire (East Riding).—The parishes of Middleton, and Sledmere, in the East Riding of the county of York.

Yorkshire (West Riding).—(1.) Certain premises in the township of Elland-cum-Greetland, in the West Riding of the county of York, adjoining the North Dean Railway station of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and bounded by the property of John Maude and John Baldwin on one side, and the river Aire and the Aire and Calder canal on the other sides.

(2.) The whole of Pinch Mill Farm, in the parish of Wickersley, in the West Riding of the county of York, in the occupation of John Styring.

(3.) So much of the townships of Rimmington, and Sawley, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Skinner-brook to Dockber farm, then by occupation-road to Castle Hills, then by the Gisburn and Clitheroe-road to the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway bridge at Gisburn Coates on the north; thence along the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to Stankhill Bridge, then by Rimmington-brook to Holme End, then by Milat-brook to Rimmington-brook; then along Rimmington-brook to Howgill on the

east; thence by the highway to Salem Chapel and Ings End on the south; thence by Twiston-brook to the junction of Swanside-brook, then along Swanside-brook to the river Ribble, across the river to Rathmell (Syke) brook, then along Rathmell (Syke) brook to the Grindleton-road on the west; thence along Grindleton-road to Bolton-lane End, then along Bolton-road to Slip Ing-bridge, then along Slip Ing-brook to the river Ribble on the north-west.
