## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under those circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

#### THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or re-

quired for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Buckinghamshire.**—The whole of the parish of Grandborough, in the county of Buckingham.

**Cheshire.**—So much of the township of Over, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Delamere-street, Woodford-lane, Blaken-lane to Brookes farm, Littler-lane, Catsclough-lane to Grange farm, Grange-lane, and High-street from Grange-lane End.

**Cornwall.**—(1.) The parish of, Mylor, in the county of Cornwall.

(2.) The parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall.

(3.) The parish of Sancreed, in the county of Cornwall.

(4.) The parishes of Gwinear, and Crowan, and those portions of the parish of Camborne which lie to the southward of the Cornwall Railway, in the county of Cornwall.

(5.) All the lands in the borough of Helston which lie within the following limits, that is to say, from the point on the south-west of the highway leading from Helston to the Lizard at the junction of the parishes of Wendron and Mawgan-in-Meneage outside the farm called Content, along the same road in a south-easterly direction to the cross roads at Dodson's Gap, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the highway to Gweek on to the four cross roads between Menehay and Trevenen-in-Wendron, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the dis-turnpiked road to Helston through Wendron-street and Coinage-hall-street down by the main road to the river Cober, (excluding the said roads, streets, and highway,) and from thence along the said river and the margin of the Loe Pool (on the Weldron side) to Carminowe creek, and from thence by the boundary line of the said parish of Wendron up to the point first mentioned.

(6.) So much of the parish of St. Gluvias, in the county of Cornwall, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, by the dis-turnpiked road leading from Treliever in the parish of Mabe to Tremough Lodge Gate in the said parish of St. Gluvias, by lands within an imaginary line drawn from the said gate to such one of the reservoirs of the Falmouth Waterworks Company as lies nearest to the borough of Penryn, by the boundary of all such reservoirs on the Budock side to the bridge crossing the stream under Woodfield in Budock, by the high-road to Tin pits in Mabe, along the same at the back of Tremough to Treliever the point first-mentioned, the said dis-turnpiked road and the high-road from Treliever to the bridge near Woodfield not being included within the area.

**Cumberland.**—The parishes of Whicham, and Millom, in the petty sessional division of Bootle, in the county of Cumberland.

**Gloucestershire.**—The petty sessional division of Lawford's Gate, in the county of Gloucester.

**Hampshire.**—(1.) The whole of the parish of Bramley, in the petty sessional division of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton.

(2.) So much of the parish of Nursling, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Plantation-road leading to Baddesley and Southampton on the east, Redbridge-lane to Yew Tree farm on the west, Upton-lane adjoining the Romsey and Southampton turnpike-road to the

Andover and Redbridge-railway on the north, and Brown Hill-road leading to Redbridge and Millbrook on the south.

**Lancashire.**—(1.) The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(2.) The township of Samlesbury, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(3.) The divisions of Low Quarter and Middle Quarter and a portion of Kirkby Moor bounded on the north by the road from Beanthwaite to Garthwaite, in the township of Kirkby Ireleth, in the petty sessional division of Lonsdale North, in the county of Lancaster.

(4.) So much of the township of Atherton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western Railway on the south and west, Bag-lane on the north, and Leigh-road on the east.

(5.) So much of the borough of Bury, and of the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bury and Rochdale Old-road, Makin-lane, Birtle Moor-road, Mouldin-lane, and Elbert-lane.

(6.) So much of the township of Lower Booths, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Brow Edge on the east, farm buildings known as Newbarn, in the occupation of Samuel Heyworth, on the west, Heightside farm on the north, and Chapel Hill farm on the south.

(7.) So much of the township of Newchurch, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Newchurch and Burnley turnpike-road on the east, Bury and Burnley turnpike-road on the west, Seatnaze Hill on the north, and Haslingden and Todmorden turnpike-road on the south.

(8.) So much of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Manchester and Ashton canal on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire railway on the south, Gravely Hill-lane on the east, and Lumon-lane on the west.

(9.) So much of the township of Higher Booths, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Hill Top Height side on the east, Mr. Brook's reservoir on the west, Kitline plantation to reservoir on the north, and Short Clough plantation to Hill Top on the west.

**Leicestershire.**—So much of the parish of Queeniborough, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mr. Bent's plough fields on the north, the main street of the village of Queeniborough on the south, lands in the occupation of Mr. Hollyoak on the east, and fields and premises occupied by Mr. Sharpe on the west.

**Lincolnshire (Holland).**—The petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire.

**Norfolk.**—(1.) The parishes of East Walton, Westacre, Gaytonthorpe, East Winch, West Bilney, Pentney, Wormegay, and Ashwicken, in the western division of the county of Norfolk.

(2.) Lands in the occupation of Mr. H. J. Waters, at Panxworth, in the county of Norfolk, called Swinly Londs, lands next Car Close, Car Close, and meadows called The Cars in the occupation of Mr. Chapman, towards the north; meadow-lands next Car Close occupied by Mr. Chapman, and meadows and pastures of

Mr. H. J. Waters, towards the east; a foot-path called Hemblington foot-path, towards the south; and arable land in the occupation of Mr. D. Walker called Patter Mill Close, arable land called Mowing Close, and a road next the said fields leading from Panxworth towards Horning Ferry, towards the west.

**Sussex.**—All that part of the parish of Willingdon, in the county of Sussex, lying within the following limits, that is to say, a direct line from the sea by the horse-path to the Langney Sewer, thence in a direct line to the north-western corner of the Anthony Hill Tower field, thence in a direct line to the south-eastern front of the Eastbourne Gas Works, and thence in a direct line to the sea.

**Warwickshire.**—So much of the parish of Elmdon, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Coventry turnpike-road on the north, Olton-road on the south, Elmdon-lane leading to Solihull on the east, and Olton-road leading to the Birmingham and Coventry-road on the west.

**Yorkshire (East Riding).**—So much of the parish of Bishop Burton, in the East Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Beverley and Market Weighton-road on the south; Cherry Burton-lane on the east, from the Beverley and Market Weighton-road to a quickwood fence on the north side of a grass field in the occupation of Ann Harrison; on the west, Bishop Burton-street from the Beverley and Market Weighton-road to a gate adjoining Ann Harrison's house, then by a quickwood fence on the east side of a grass field called Dove-Cotes to a quickwood fence on the north side of a grass field called Brickhills in the occupation of Ann Harrison, and then along the same fence to Cherry Burton-lane aforesaid.

**Yorkshire (West Riding).**—(1.) Certain premises in the township of Elland-cum-Greetland, in the West Riding of the county of York, adjoining the North Dean Railway station of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and bounded by the property of John Maude and John Baldwin on one side, and the river Aire and the Aire and Calder canal on the other sides.

(2.) The whole of Pinch Mill Farm, in the parish of Wickersley, in the West Riding of the county of York, in the occupation of John Styring.

(3.) **QUARANTINE NOTICE.**

The following Notice has been issued by the Health Officer:—

Notice to whom it may concern.

The following order is hereby communicated to

the managers of passenger steamship lines and shipping merchants at the Port of New York:—

1. The object of the following rules and regulations is to prevent the introduction into the United States of "contagious or infectious diseases."

2. The following diseases are recognized as "contagious or infectious diseases" for the purposes of these rules and regulations, viz.:— Asiatic cholera, yellow fever, plague, smallpox, typhus fever, and relapsing fever.

3. An "infected" port or place in the sense of these rules is a port or place at which either Asiatic cholera, yellow fever, plague, smallpox, relapsing fever or typhus fever exists.

4. To secure the "best sanitary condition" of a vessel the following points shall be observed by the owners, agents, or masters of such vessel:—

A. Exclusion from the vessel, as far as possible, of persons or things known or suspected to be infected.

B. Cleanliness, dryness, and ventilation of the vessel both preliminary to loading and during the voyage.

C. Disinfection, that is, the destruction or removal of the causes of disease, which includes measures of cleanliness, ventilation, fumigation, &c.

D. The crew shall not be allowed liberty on shore after nightfall in suspected localities. They shall not be allowed to sleep on deck except under awnings. The fore-castle shall be well ventilated and kept dry. Both in port and at sea the bilge shall be pumped out each morning and evening, or more frequently if necessary. The utmost cleanliness shall be observed at sea as well as in port. Each seaman shall have two suits of under-clothing. The clothing and bedding shall be aired every clear day. In tropical climates the men shall be required to wash their persons and change their underclothing every evening after work while in port, and each working suit shall be washed, dried, and aired after each day's use. These regulations as to clothing, airing of bedding, and ventilation shall, as far as possible, be observed at sea as well as in port.

#### Rules and Regulations.

1. All merchant ships and vessels sailing from a foreign port where contagious or infectious disease exists for any port in the United States, must obtain from the consul, vice consul, or other consular officer of the United States at the port of departure, or from the medical officer, where such officer has been detailed by the President for that purpose, a bill of health in duplicate, which shall set forth the sanitary history of said vessel, and that it has in all respects complied with these rules and regulations.

All vessels arriving at this port will be required to conform to the above "Rules and Regulations."

On the same date, the western (C) of the two red leading lights (C, D) was moved 38 yards to the northward, and is now distant about 459 yards from light D; these lights in line bearing S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. lead just southward of black buoy A of the West Gat.

Entering the West Gat, the green lights (K, L) in line bearing E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. lead through the channel, until the lights (A, B) on the south shore come in line, indicating that the red lights (C, D) should then be brought in line as a leading mark or proceeding.

Also, in order further to mark the south side of the fairway (in connection with the low dam in course of construction), an additional white buoy B (new) has been placed between white buoys A and B (old).

##### RIO DE LA PLATA.

*Unsuccessful Search for Shoal Southward of Lobos Isle.*

THE following account has been received from the Senior Naval Officer on the south-east coast of America of unsuccessful search having been made for a shoal stated to lie south from Lobos Isle, distant 21 miles:—

This shoal (reported as a rock about 9 yards in diameter, with  $3\frac{3}{4}$  fathoms over it, and 15 fathoms, sand, close around, on which an American vessel was said to have struck in 1877) was searched for by H.M.S. "Rifleman" during the greater portion of five days, between 29th July and 3rd August, 1881.

A further search has been made by H.M.S. "Firefly" between 12th and 17th December, 1881. Lieutenant Law, commanding, reports having twice anchored near the reported position, and with a buoy placed as a mark, to have sounded over and round it for the distance of one mile, without finding any indication of shoal water, the depths being 13 to 15 fathoms. Soundings were also taken in the direction of Lobos Isle from the reported position, with regular depths of 14 to 16 fathoms.

The shoal will for the present be retained on the Admiralty charts, but its existence in the position assigned must be considered doubtful.
