Vienna, Novemb. 10. The Lerrers from W. of the 27th past give an account. That atter the Sucrender, of that Castle on the 19th Prince Loun of Baden decamped, from thence, and having passed the Daniel at a place called Vediflan, marched towards Valachia, to ferrile the Winter-Quarters which that Country is required. to furnish for the Imperial Froops. At the samemine General Picestomini was creeting a Magazine at Precopia, and had font a Detachement under the Command of a Prince of Hulftein, to secure the Pass at Lescowa. The news they had of the Turks, was, That the Scraskier lay with the Remains of their Army at Sophia, but that the Troops were in to ill a condition, and under fuch a Discouragement, that the least notice of the Approach of the Imperialists would in all probability disperse them.

Francfort, Nov. 16. We hear from Suifferland, That the Protestane Cantons have unanimoully forbid their Subjects to engage themeselves in the French Service, upon pain of death. Of the Froops of Saxony 5 Regiments are to have their Winter-Quarters in the Bergstrace, and the rest will return home.

After the Expiration of the said eight days, the Magistrates and other Officers shall Visit the Houses, Cellars and Warelandes, of the Junity and Quality of the Wines, &c. that shall be brought in or found, contrary to this Prohibision, shall over and above the sersaid Penalties be shaved and elimined.
