WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein recited have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (which said church and cure are hereinafter called the said benefice) of Ystradffyn in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

“Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Ystradffyn is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession in the Right Honourable John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor.

“And whereas the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Ystradffyn now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Saint David's.

“And whereas the Right Reverend William Basil now Bishop of the said diocese of Saint

David's is willing to accept for himself and his successors in the Bishoprick of Saint David's the said proposed transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts recited in the hereinbefore mentioned Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said William Basil Bishop of Saint David's has executed this scheme as herein-after mentioned.

“And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Ystradffyn which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Ystradffyn (being the parish in or in respect of which the said right of patronage and advowson arises and exists) by rendering the said benefice more eligible than it is at present for augmentation out of funds under our control.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Ystradffyn now vested in the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid shall be transferred from the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns to the said William Basil or other the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's as such Bishop and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Basil or other the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any

of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of St. David's.

"Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession in the Right Honourable John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Saint David's.

hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen (being the parish in or in respect of which the said right of patronage and advowson arises and exists) inasmuch as it will render the said benefice more eligible than it is at present for augmentation out of funds under our control by facilitating an union of the same with the benefice of Llangathen in the said county and diocese which union the Bishop of that diocese is desirous of procuring.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in

the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Hambleton which is situate in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester between that benefice and a certain other benefice namely the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of All Saints Denmead which said last-named benefice is situate in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester.

“Whereas the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting as such Lord High Chancellor on behalf of your Majesty is the patron (in right of the Crown) of the said benefice of Hambleton and also of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead.

“And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of All Saints Denmead is at present insufficiently endowed and that the said benefice of Hambleton has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionments of the same endowments which is hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have become made the said benefice of Hambleton will still be sufficiently endowed.

“And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Harold Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester is of opinion and we are also of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the cure (being a consolidated chapelry) of All Saints Denmead aforesaid by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Hambleton which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas the said benefice of Hambleton is now full, the Reverend Thomas White Doctor of Laws being the vicar or incumbent thereof.

“And whereas the said Thomas White has consented to the said proposed apportionment in so far as the same is proposed to be immediate.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable Roundell Baron Selborne now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting as such patron in right of the Crown as aforesaid of the said benefice of Hambleton and of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead and with the consent of the said Edward Harold Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester acting as such Bishop and with the consent of the said Thomas White acting as such vicar or incumbent of the said benefice of Hambleton aforesaid in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this scheme and sealed the same (the said Bishop sealing the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day on which the same Order shall be so gazetted the following apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Hambleton shall take place that is to say. First. All those the lands and hereditaments situate at Anthill in the parish of Hambleton aforesaid and containing by admeasurement nineteen acres and one pole or thereabouts which are more particularly described in the schedule to this scheme annexed shall be

severed from the said benefice of Hambleton and shall (as from the day aforesaid) together with all that the apportioned tithe rent-charge amounting to one pound two shillings and three pence issuing out of or arising in respect of the same lands and hereditaments or some of them be annexed and belong to the said benefice of All Saints Denmead. And secondly all the glebe lands tithe rent-charges and all (if any) other the endowments which after such annexation as aforesaid shall belong to the said benefice of Hambleton or which may thereafter belong to the same benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead with one clear annual sum or yearly charge of thirty-five pounds, the same annual sum or yearly charge of thirty-five pounds to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the incumbent of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing incumbent of the benefice of All Saints Denmead or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year.

“And we further recommend and propose that as from the day on which from whatsoever cause the said benefice of Hambleton shall be next avoided the following further apportionment of the income of the same benefice shall (without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than as aforesaid) take place that is to say all the glebe lands tithes, rent-charges and other (if any other) the endowments which may then belong or which thereafter may belong to the said benefice of Hambleton shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead with one other clear annual sum or yearly charge of fifty pounds the same to be in addition to and not in substitution for the annual sum or yearly charge of thirty-five pounds hereinbefore mentioned and to be due and payable and to be apportionable and receivable in manner and at the times hereinbefore provided with respect to the said annual sum or yearly charge of thirty-five pounds.

“And we further recommend and propose that the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead shall as to the lands and hereditaments to be annexed to his benefice as hereinbefore mentioned have all such rights and powers of ownership in the same as are now enjoyed by the incumbent of the said benefice of Hambleton, and that as to the said two clear annual-sums or yearly charges of thirty-five pounds and fifty pounds respectively, the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead shall have the following powers for recovering the same two clear annual sums or yearly charges respectively, and each of them, that is to say, power if and whenever any part of either of the said two sums or charges shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-eight days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent-charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all cost and expenses occasioned by the non-payment.

thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutorily exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force. Provided always that none of the powers aforesaid shall be exercised by or on behalf of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Denmead until twenty-one clear days at the least after a written notice demanding payment of the sum then in arrear shall have been left at the last-known residence of the incumbent of the said benefice of Hambledon which written notice nevertheless, the said first-named incumbent shall be at liberty to leave as aforesaid, at any time after the expiration of the first seven days of the twenty-eight days aforesaid.

“And provided also that if at any time the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Hambledon shall by any deed or deeds duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex to the said benefice of All Saints Denmead any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said benefice of Hambledon which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Winchester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said two clear annual sums or yearly charges of thirty-five pounds and fifty pounds respectively hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then both or one (as the case may be) of the same two annual sums or yearly charges shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis,” it is enacted, that in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, burials in any part or parts of the metropolis, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial in the metropolis, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued, subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that, from and after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such part or parts of the metropolis, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of the parishes in which any burial-grounds or places of burial affected by such representation shall be situate, or on some other conspicuous places within the part or parts of the metropolis affected by such representation, one calendar month at the least before such representation is so considered; provided always, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England,” it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk of the parish hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the thirteenth May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, affecting burials in Garrett-lane Cemetery, Wandsworth, in the county of Surrey (therein described as the parish cemetery or additional churchyard of All Saints Wandsworth) should be varied by the omission of the words “members of the families” and by the substitution of the words “widows, widowers,

parents and children," so that the Order should be read as follows viz. :—

ALL SAINTS, WANDSWORTH.—Forthwith wholly in the parish cemetery or additional churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, which can be opened without disturbing soil that has been buried in, and in which each coffin shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except, also, in graves not less than five feet deep which can be opened without disturbing soil within a foot of any previously buried coffin :—and that, interment in the cemetery be further limited to the widows, widowers, parents and children of those who have already been buried therein.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the seventeenth day of April next :

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette ; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of the said parish, or on some conspicuous places within the part or parts of the metropolis affected by such representation, one calendar month at the least before the said seventeenth day of April.

And whereas an Order in Council has been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyard hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Order ; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyard be further postponed :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be further postponed as follows, viz. :

In the churchyard of Great Ayton, in the county of York, to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament] held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England" beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend "the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the under-mentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

WEST DEEPING.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of West Deeping, in the county of Lincoln ; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows : In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

RYHALL.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Ryhall, in the county of Rutland ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows : In such vaults as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

SPEENHAMLAND (SPEEN).—Forthwith and entirely in the crypt beneath the floor of Speenhamland Church, in the parish of Speen, in the county of Berks.

TERRINGTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Terrington, in the county of York ; and also in that part of the churchyard that lies within fifteen yards of the dwelling-house adjoining the south-eastern corner.

ST. JOHN'S, WALSALL WOOD.—Forthwith and entirely in St. John's Church, Walsall Wood, in the parish of Walsall, in the county of Stafford ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.)
