7 HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the

England in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the acts therein recited have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (which said church and cure are hereinafter called the said benefice) of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession in the Right Honourable John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said John Frederick Vaughan 'Earl Cawdor is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Saint David's.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Basil now Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's is willing to accept for himself and his successors in the Bishoprick of Saint David's the said proposed transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts recited in the hereinbefore mentioned Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-'nine or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said William Basil Bishop of Saint David's has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen which is hereinbefore mentioned and bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in

hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen (being the parish in or in respect of which the said right of patronage and advowson arises and exists) inasmuch as it will render the said benefice more eligible than it is at present for augmentation out of funds under our control by facilitating an union of the same with the benefice of Llangathen in the said county and diocese which union the Bishop of that diocese is desirous of procuring.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor(in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llanfihangel Cilfargen otherwise Llanvihangel vach Cilfargen now vested in the said John Frederick Vaughan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid shall be transferred from the said John Frederick Vauhan Earl Cawdor and his heirs and assigns to the said William Basil or other the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's as such Bishop and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Basil or other the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."
