#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

With the view of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease every Local Authority in England and Wales and Scotland shall take all steps necessary for ascertaining whether the regulations of the Privy Council as regards the cleansing and disinfection of railway pens, as also of railway trucks, horse-boxes, guards' vans, or other railway vehicles, and vans, moveable gangways or passage-ways, cages, or other apparatus used or intended for the loading or unloading of animals on or from a railway truck or other railway vehicle, or otherwise used in connexion with the transit of animals on a railway; and of vans when used for moving animals by road; and of landing-places (other than foreign animals wharves or foreign animals quarantine stations or landing-places for foreign animals); are well and efficiently carried into effect within their district.

2. Every Local Authority shall report to the Privy Council at the end of June next as to the manner in which the regulations contained in Chapter 15 (Articles 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, and 69) Chapter 16 (Article 70) and Chapter 17 (Article 71) of The Animals Order have been carried out within their district during the preceding two months, and shall continue to so report to the Privy Council once every subsequent three months (namely),—at the end of

September, December, March, and June in each year, as to the manner in which those regulations have been carried out within their district during the preceding three months.

3. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

**EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).**

WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:—

“The Council of any Borough which is assessed to the county rate of any county by the Justices of such county, and the Commissioners of any Improvement District, may, by order of a Secretary of State made upon the application of such Council

or Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, be declared to be a Local Authority for the purposes of this Act, and thereupon shall become a Local Authority accordingly for such part of their borough or district as is not included in any harbour, to the exclusion of the Justices in Petty Sessions:—

And whereas an application has been made to me by the Council of the borough of Yeovil, to be declared a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act, in accordance with the provision aforesaid.
