

Ashworth-brook on the west; and Knowe Hill-brook on the east.

(5.) So much of the township of Abram, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Warrington-road on the west, Bickershaw lane on the north, Wigan Junction railway on the east, and Wigan Junction Old Tram-Way on the south.

(6.) So much of the township of Read, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the south by the Padiham and Whalley-road commencing at Newtown, thence in a westerly direction to Dunkirk Gate, thence along a fence past Clough Side Wood to Cobkerr Nook, thence along a bye-lane to Newhall Gate, thence along the highway to Wians Quarry, thence by a foot-path to Symonstone Old Toll Bar, and thence by the Padiham and Whalley-road to Newtown aforesaid.

(7.) So much of the township of Higher Booths, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Burnley and Bury highway on the east, Fair Bank and New Barn farms on the west, Love Clough Printworks and Scar Foot farm on the north, and Cranberry Height and Mill Gate farms on the south.

(8.) So much of the township of Butterworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Broadshaw farm on the north, Knott Booth farm on the south, Moorbank farm on the west, and Garside farm on the east.

(9.) So much of the township of Chadderton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the township of Chadderton and the borough of Oldham on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire railway on the west, Oldham Cemetery (Chadderton) on the south, and Brookstreet, Busk, on the east.

(10.) So much of the hamlet of Mossley, in the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Lancaster-street on the north, Market-street on the south, Stamford-road on the east, and Old-road on the west.

(11.) So much of the township of Castleton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Fenn's farm on the north, Broadshaw farm on the south, Mayfield farm on the west, and Higher Moorbank farm on the east.

(12.) At Lytham, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north from the passenger railway station along the Preston and Wyre railway to the junction cabin, east from the junction cabin along East Cliff-street across the beach by Glengarry House to the shore, south from opposite Glengarry House along the shore to Charles Mast, west from Charles Mast along Queen-street, Hastings-place, to the passenger railway station aforesaid.

(13.) So much of the township of Worsley, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north side Green-lane Broad Oak farm, on the west side along Worsley-road Worsley Court House, on the south side along the Bridgewater Canal to Monton Bridge, and on the east side along Worsley-road to the White Horse public-house.

(14.) So much of the township of Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries,

that is to say, a fence dividing the lands in the occupation of Thomas Starkie and John Oddie on the east, a fence dividing the lands in the occupation of Edmund Stafford and Richard Fitton on the west, Dark-lane on the north, and Mokin Brow on the south.

(15.) So much of the township of Edgeworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from the White Horse to Broadhead on the north and east, and by the highway from Hob-lane to Darwen on the south and west.

*Leicestershire.*—(1.) The parishes of Barwell, and Stapleton, in the county of Leicester.

(2.) So much of the parish of Barkstone, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Nottingham to Belvoir Castle on the north, the highway from Newark to Melton Mowbray on the east, the highway from Plungar to Melton Mowbray on the south, and the highway from Granby to Plungar on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Carlton-Curlieu, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Albert Norman's farm on the east, Barnett field and Clump Close on the north, the road leading from Kibworth to Carlton on the west, and the road leading from Tur Langton to Kibworth on the south.

(4.) So much of the parish of Great Bowden, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain fields in the occupation of Messieurs Danby, Walker, Knight, J. Bolton, George Webb, Sedgley, W. Tebbutt, Ashwell, and Smeeton.

(5.) So much of the parish of Carlton-Curlieu, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Merr-road and the extreme boundary of A. Norman's farm.

(6.) So much of the parish of Great Bowden, in the county of Leicester, and of the parish of Little Bowden, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the extreme boundary of John Watson's farm, William Gatty's farm, Sir W. de Capell Brooke's Bridge field, Barber's meadow, Messrs. Bird and Tebbett's fields, the Barn fields, and J. Brown's meadow, all in the parish of Little Bowden, on the south-east, Mr. Fisher's farm, Great Bowden, on the north-east, Clark's and Patrick's fields on the north-west, and the boundary of Market parish on the south-west.

(7.) The whole of the parishes of Goadby, and Keythorpe, and so much of the parish of Tugby as is included within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mr. Kendall's Church Close, Neather Meadow, and Sir A. Hazelrigg's Ploughed Close, and the village of Goadby on the west, Kendall's Baxted Hill, and his ten acres, Harrison's twenty acres, and Berry's Broad Meadow on the north, the Honourable Tyrwhitt Wilson's Bassetts Close on the east, Mr. Kendall's Top Hill and Side Hill fields, and the Honourable Tyrwhitt Wilson's ploughed field on the south.

(8.) The whole of the parish of Medbourne, in the county of Leicester.

(9.) The whole of the parish of Thorpe Langton, in the county of Leicester.

(10.) So much of the parish of Castle Donington, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Midland railway company's line from Trent to
