fence by and including Ridley Hall farm-yard across Ridley Hull-road, thence by and including Ridley farm, thence by fence by and including Mr. Manley's farm Cholmondley, across Whitchurch-road by and including Mr. Anker's farm, thence by fence to Harding's cottage along Nantwich-road to Mr. Hale's farm aforesaid.

(8.) So much of the township of Thingwall, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary fences and stone wall round Arrowe Park on the east, north, and west sides, and the boundary fence between the townships of Thingwall and Landican to the farm in the occupation of Alfred Mackwall, the boundary fence of that farm to Prenton brook, the boundary between the township of Thingwall and the townships of Barnston, Storeton, and Irby to Arrowe Park aforesaid.

(9.) So much of the township of Thingwall, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Prenton brook from Barnston Bridge to Woodchurchroad, Woodchurch-road by Landican to Woodchurch Green, the Chester and Parkgate turnpike-road to Toll-gate, thence by Greasby-road to Arrowe brook, from Arrowe brook to Limbolane, Pensby-road, Irby-lane, Pensby-lane to Woodchurch-road, and by Woodchurch-road to Barnston Bridge aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) In the hamlets of Ambaston, and Thulston, in the parish of Elvaston, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Derwent near Borrowash Mills at the spot where the north-west fence of the Big meadow reaches the said river, thence down the said river until it is joined by New Dyke-brook near the Wiln Mills, thence along the north bank of the said brook until it reaches the three lane ends, and along Cow Lane, leading to Brook meadow by Mr. Robinson's farm, and thence along the north-west fences of Brook meadow and Big meadow until the latter reaches the river Derwent at the point of starting.

(2.) So much of the township of Fernilee, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by a foot-path from the river Goyt to Horwich House, on the east by the foot-path from Horwich House to the London and North-Western Railway bridge, on the south by the Chapel-en-le-Frith and Stockport turnpikeroad from the London and North-Western Railway bridge to Shalleross Hall and the river Goyt to the west, and by the Goyt to the White Hart on the north.

(3.) So much of the township of Glossop, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Hargate Hill-lane on the north, the road from Hargate Hill-lane to Charlesworth Chapel and along the borders

of Coombs Rocks on the east, the new road from Coombs Rocks to Hole House on the south, and the Ludworth and Glossop turnpikeroad from Hole House to Hargate Hill-lane end on the west.

(4.) So much of the township of Linton, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Burton and Measham main-road on the east, from High-cross Banks to Linton Drift, the fence along the boundary of the counties of Leicester and Derby to a point opposite Tilly's Beer House on the south, the main-road through the village of Linton to Brooky-lane on the west, and along Brooky-lane to Higheross Banks on the north.

(5.) So much of the parishes and townships of Measham, Willesley, Oakthorpe, Stretton-enle-Fields, Appleby, and Snarestone, in the counties of Derby and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Gallows Gate along Gallows-lane to junction with the Bosworth-road, to left down Bosworth-road to the bridge over the Snarestone brook, to right along the brook course (the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester) to Pepper Bridge, to the left along the Atherstone and Measham-road by Snarestone Church to point opposite Snarestone railway station, thence to the right under the railway bridge and along the Snarestone-road to Appleby, turning to the right by Black Horse Inn along Stoney-lane to junction with Heath-lane, to the right along lica.h-lane to junction with Measham and Tamworth-road at point opposite Manor House Gate, to the right down Tamworth-road to Measham Tape Mill, thence to the left along the river Mease to the foot-bridge, thence to the right along the Stretton-en-le-Fields and Oakthorpe foot-road to the Burton and Measham main-road, crossing it and up Pickering-lane by Jent's brickyard up the hill by the Shoulder of Mutton Inn, through Oakthorpe Village to the Gin Stable-lane End, thence to the left along Gin Stable-lane crossing the Moira and Measham turnpike-road, along the Oakthorpe Colliery-road and occupation-road by Pastures farm to Willesley-lane, and to the right along Willesley-lane to Gallows Gate aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Overseal, Gresley, and Ashby-de-la-Zouch, in the counties of Leicester and Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, turf and arable land in the occupation of Mr. Mason and also an Occupation-road in the parish of Gresley, in the county of Derby, on the north, turf and arable land in the occupation of Mr. Whitehead on the south, turf and arable land in the occupation of Messrs. Adams and Winterton, ard the Bosworth and Burton-upon-Trent turnpike-road on the west, and grass land in the occupation of Mr. Clamp, in the parish of Ashby-de-la-Zouch, on the east.

(7.) So much of the townships of Tideswell, and Wheston, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Monks Dale brook on the south and south-west from Millers Dale to Wormhill, and Tideswell-road as far as that point where the brook crosses the road at Bramwall Dale, and from thence on the west and north by Bramwall Dale-road to Summer Cross, and roads leading from that place known as Slancote-lane and Naylors-lane to Millers Dale Old-road, and on the east by Millers Dale Old-road to Monks Dale brook at Millers Dale.
