**A**T the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 12th day of *May*, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parish of Ilfracombe, in the county of Devon, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a stream of water opposite Wigmouth farm on the west, the south fence of the new Ilfracombe and Combmartin-road and the south fence of Watermouth-park on the north, the east fence of the Home meadow and Horse park on the east, and the south fence of Lydford farm on the south, and (2.) the parishes of Buckland Monachorum, Meavy, and Walkhampton, in the county of Devon,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the seventh and sixteenth days of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following area (namely),—so much of the parish of Monks Kirby, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the turnpike-road from Lutterworth to Coventry on the north, the parish of Church-over on the south, and Muntilse-lane leading from the Lutterworth and Coventry turnpike-road to the parish of Harborough Magna on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
