#### SCHEDULE.

An area comprising so much of the township of Allerston, in the North Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the Pickering and Scarborough highway commencing at Allerston School and extending to a place one hundred yards east of the Red Houses, on the east a field-road passing on the west side of Dolly Bog Plantation to Penniston-lane, from thence on the south Penniston-lane to Allerston Railway station, and on the west the village-street from Allerston Railway station to Allerston School, and all highways lying within the said boundaries.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The limits of the following place which is declared by order of the Committee acting in and for the Droxford Division, in the county of Southampton, and exercising the power of the Local Authority, dated the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be a place infected with swine-fever (namely),—the premises in the occupation of Thomas Daysh at Yew Tree Cottage, Shirrell Heath, and the adjoining premises in the occupation of John Kerby, Frederick Roe, Thomas Gamblin, Charles Watson, W. G. Lamport, and Herbert Reeves Lamport,—are hereby extended so as to include the place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a place infected with swine-fever.

#### SCHEDULE.

A place at Shirrell Heath, in the petty sessional division of Droxford, in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Shedfield to Frith-lane commencing at Turkey Island, thence along Frith-lane to the turning up to the Cottage Hospital at Shirrell Heath, thence past the Cottage Hospital along Sandy Hill-lane into the high-road from Bishop's Waltham to Wickham, along such road to the four cross roads at Shedfield, and thence to Turkey Island aforesaid.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stafford and Wolverhampton road from Gravelly Way Cross-roads to Standeford Bridge, thence by Saredon brook to the river Penk, by the river Penk to Stone Bridge, thence by the highway to Engleton Cross-roads, and by the highway from there through Crateford to Gravelly Way Cross-roads aforesaid, (2.) Apesford farm in the township of Bradnop, in the county of Stafford, in the occupation of Samuel Bailey, together with the several farms in the occupation of George Tetterton, James Bassett, William Bailey, William Whieldon, John Fearnihough, William Rider, Herbert Eardley, Thomas Robinson, and Thomas Plumb, and all roads and bye-roads passing through such area, and (3.) so much of the parish of Harborne, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the boundary of the borough of Birmingham by Greenfield-road, by the portion of High-street between the western end of that road and Moor Pool-lane, by Moor Pool-lane to the Moor Pool, thence by the brook flowing from that Pool to the boundary of the borough of Birmingham, and by that boundary to Greenfield-road aforesaid,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
