parish of Thorpe-by-Water, and the following roads, that is to say, the road from Liddington to Gretton, Northamptonshire, and the road from Liddington to Thorpe-by-Water.

(3.) So much of the parish of Caldecott, in the county of Rutland, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Welland on the south, the road leading from Thorpe-by-Water to Rockingham railway station on the north and west, and the road from Liddington to Gretton on the east.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Glaston, in

the county of Rutland.

Shropshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Sheriff Hales, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Lodge Wood and private road leading from thence to Lilleshall Abbey and to Lilleshall House, thence His Grace the Duke of Sutherland's drive to Sheriff Hales Manor, and thence to Lodge Wood aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Baschurch, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the water-course from Walford Heath to Fenemere brick-yard, thence the boundary fence which divides T. Slaney Eyton's property to the high-way leading from Merrington Green to Walford Heath water-

course aforesaid.

(3.) So much of the parish of Hinstock, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Lightwood-lane leading from the Woodseaves and Hinstock main-road to the Chester main-road at the Sweet Apple Tree, then the Chester main-road to the footroad at Hinstock Villa, then the foot-road from Hinstock Villa to the Woodseaves and Hinstock main-road, and thence to the end of Lightwood-. . lane at Mount Pleasant.

(4.) So much of the parish of Chetwynd, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the turnpike-road from Blue House to Canal Bridge, Chetwynd End, thence by Water-lane to Vineyard-road, along the boundary of the counties of Stafford and Salop by Meertown brook, thence to Masonsplace, and thence by foot-road to Blue House

aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the parishes of Childs Ercall, and Stoke upon Tern, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from the post office at Childs Ercall to Eaton village, thence the highway from Eaton to Ollerton village, and the highway from Ollerton to the post office at Childs Ercall aforesaid.

Staffordshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stafford and Wolverhampton road from Gravelly Way Cross - roads to Standeford Bridge, thence by Saredon brook to the river Penk, by the river Penk to Stone Bridge, thence by the highway to Engleton Crossroads, and by the highway rom there through Crateford to Gravelly Way Cross-roads afore-

(2.) Apesford farm in the township of Bradnop, in the county of Stafford, in the occupation of Samuel Bailey, together with the several farms in the occupation of George Tetterton, James Bassett, William Bailey, William Whieldon, John Fearnihough, William Rider, Herbert Eardley, Thomas Robinson, and Thomas Plumb, and all roads and bye-roads passing through such area.

(3.) So much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Wolverhampton and Stafford turnpike-road, from where it crosses the boundary of the parish of Brewood at Coven Heath, to the Canal Bridge at Slade Heath; thence by the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal to the boundary of the parish of Brewood at The Laches; and thence by that boundary southward to the aforesaid turnpikeroad at Coven Heath.

(4.) So much of the parish of Harborne, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the boundary of the borough of Birmingham by Greenfield-road, by the portion of High-street between the western end of that road and Moor Pool-lane, by Moor Pool-lane to the Moor Pool, thence by the brook flowing from that Pool to the boundary of the borough of Birmingham, and by that boundary to Greenfield-road afore-

(5.) So much of the parishes of Betley, Audley, and Madeley, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Betley village to Cook's Gate, thence by the highway which passes Heighley Castle to the turnpike-road from Madeley to Betley, and thence by that road to the first-mentioned highway at Betley village aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the parish of Cheddleton, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Basford to Leek as far as Leek brook (the boundary of the parish), thence by Leek brook to the boundary of the township of Bradnop, by that boundary to the road from Ball fields to Cocket Knob, and by that road and its continuation to Ringe Hay and the highway

aforesaid.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Elford, and Croxall, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from the river Tame over the arch and by the school at Elford village to the turnpikeroad from Tamworth to Burton-upon-Trent; thence by that road to Salter's Bridge at Oakley; and thence by the river Tame to the highway

(8.) So much of the parish of Handsworth, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Villaroad, thence by the Hamstead or Old Walsallroad to the Tame Valley canal, thence by that canal to the boundary of the county of Warwick, and thence by that boundary to Villaroad aforesaid.

(9.) So much of the parish of Swinnerton, in the county of Stafford, as lies on the western side of the highway from Millstone Green through Acton village to Whitmore.

(10.) So much of the parish of Rushall, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Walsall to Aldridge from Longwood Locks to Darbys Crossings, thence along Bosty-lane to the Midland Railway bridge near Daw End, thence along the Midland Railway to the Birmingham Canal, and thence along that

Canal to Longwood Locks aforesaid.
(11.) So much of the parish of Whitmore, in the county of Stafford, as lies on the northern side of the road from Shutlanehead by Wood-

houses to Nethersit Hay.

(12.) So much of the township of Weston Jones, and of the parish of High Offley, in the
