REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS by "The Solent Navigation Act, 1891," it is (among other things) enacted that Her Majesty by Order in Council may from time to time, on the joint recommendation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, make Regulations defining any space within the radius of one half mile measured—

(a.) From the north end of Ryde Pier,
 (b.) From any part of the Parade at West Cowes,
 within which it shall not be lawful for vessels, or

for any particular description of vessels, to lie or be moored (and any such space is in the said Act and in this Order referred to as a "prohibited space") :

And whereas it has been made to appear that it is expedient that the Regulation contained in the Schedule hereto annexed should be made :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and on the joint recommendation of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, is pleased to make the Regulation contained in the Schedule hereto annexed.

SCHEDULE.

Regulation with respect to the Navigation of the Solent.

It shall not be lawful for any vessel to lie or be moored within the spaces enclosed within the Buys under-mentioned, that is to say :—

(A) *Ryde.*

Buoy No. 1—Chequered.—600 feet from the angle of the pier under the outer Green light on the pier head in the direction of the right extreme of the Block House at entry of Portsmouth Harbour.

Buoy No. 2—Red.—600 feet from angle of pier under the white light on pier head in the direction of the S.E. middle buoy.

Buoy No. 3—Chequered.—2000 feet N.W. (magnetic) from the inner West corner of pier head or directly away from Nettlesome point, with Trinity Church Spire S. by E., and the angle between that spire and the Spit Fort 93°.

Buoy No. 4—Red.—300 feet N.E. (magnetic) from Buoy No. 3.

Buoy No. 5—Red, with Bell.—2000 feet E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. (magnetic) from the Eastern inner Corner of pier head, or directly towards the Water Tower of Eastney Fort with Apley Tower S. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. Trinity Church Tower S.W. by S., and the angle between it and North Osborne Tower 82°.

Buoy No. 6—Chequered.—400 feet N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. (magnetic) from Buoy No. 5.

(B) *Cowes.*

Buoy No. 1—Red and White Chequered, with Bell.—W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from Prince Consort Buoy 1310 feet with the east extreme of Royal Yacht Club House in line with St. Mary's Church Tower S.W. by S.

Notice Board on Shraps Mud, S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Buoy No. 2—Red.—W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. from No. 1 distant 800 feet—with East extreme of Trinity Church in line with St. Mary's Church Tower S. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

Notice Board on Shraps Mud S.E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. (nearly).

Buoy No. 3—Red and White Chequered,—with No. 4 Buoy W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. distant 310 feet. Also with the North flag staff on the Parade West Cowes in line with the west end of the Chapel, S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

Buoy No. 4—Red.—310 feet from No. 3 W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. with east extreme of the Royal Yacht Club House in line with east extreme of Trinity Church W. by S., and outer face of Pontoon at Fountain Pier S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. (nearly).

Buoy No. 5—Red and White Chequered.—N.E. extreme of Marine Hotel in line with N.E. extreme of Marine Parade.

N.E. angle of Fountain Pier in line with flag staff.

Buoy No. 6—Red.—North flag staff by the

Marine Hotel in line with N.E. extreme of Marine Parade.

East End of Medina Commercial Pier in line with Thetis Tower.

Buoy No. 7—Red and White Chequered.—North end of the barracks at East Cowes on with the South end of the Slatwoods S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. Thetis flag staff on with the East extreme of the Thetis Dock S. by W.

Buoy No. 8—Red.—East end of Medina Commercial Pier in line with Thetis Tower.

WHEREAS the Governing Body of Winchester School, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, did, on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, make certain amendments in Statute XI of the Statutes for the government of that School, approved by Her Majesty in Council on the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three :

And whereas the said amendments have this day been laid before Her Majesty in Council, the same are published in the London Gazette, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act :

And notice is hereby given, that it is lawful for the bodies or persons authorized so to do in that Act, within two months from the date of the publication of this notification, to petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of such amendments of the Statutes.

"We the Governing Body of Winchester School, in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, do hereby make the following amendments in Statute XI of the Statutes for the government of the School approved by Her Majesty in Council on the twentieth November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, that is to say :—

WINCHESTER COLLEGE.

Amendments in Statutes.

STATUTE XI.

To omit the Title "*Tenable at the School.*"

Sect. 2. For "these" (at line 1) to read "the above."

To omit the Title "*Tenable after quitting the School.*"

Sect. 3. To omit from "The proceeds" (at line 4) to the end, and in lieu thereof to add as follows :—

The proceeds of this Fund shall be applied as follows :

(c.) To the creation from time to time of Exhibitions to be given to boys quitting the School, under such conditions as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine. Such Exhibitions shall be limited to purposes of preparation for a future profession, but it shall not be a necessary condition that a holder of such an Exhibition shall proceed to an University.

(d.) To the grant of such Exhibitions (not exceeding two to be holden together at any one time, and of such value, not exceeding £70 per annum), as the Governing Body may from time to time determine, to boys who may be recommended for admission into the School as Exhibitioners by the Delegates or Syndics appointed for Local Examinations by the Universities of

Oxford and Cambridge respectively, in the manner and under the conditions hereinafter mentioned. Such boys shall be recommended in writing by such Delegates or Syndics to the Head Master, as having passed such Local Examinations in a manner so creditable and satisfactory as to make them deserving of assistance at a Public School, for the purpose of qualifying them after receiving the education there afforded to proceed to one of the English Universities; provided that no such boy shall, at the time of being so recommended, be more than fifteen years old. The Head Master, on receiving any such recommendation, shall satisfy himself, by such means as he shall deem expedient, of the fitness of the boy so recommended to be admitted into the School as an Exhibitioner, and also that such arrangements can be made as will enable the boy at a time not later than the commencement of the Michaelmas Term next following to be entered and come into residence as a Commoner of the School. If the Head Master is so satisfied, he may elect such boy to any Exhibition tenable under this sub-section, which may either be then vacant, or be about to become vacant before the time arranged for such boy to be entered and come into residence as aforesaid. Every such election shall be conditional upon such boy being actually entered, and coming into residence within such period as aforesaid. The Exhibition shall commence and become payable from and after the day when he shall be so entered and come into residence; and shall thenceforth be tenable by such boy so long as he shall continue to be a Commoner receiving education in the School, but not further or otherwise.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the township of Chorlton, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Newcastle-road, commencing at the Wybunbury-road at Hough to brook bridge near Weston Hall, then the said brook to the bridge in Weepit-lane, along Weepit-lane to the gateway leading to Mr. Hodgkiss's Gousley farm, then a straight line across fields to Enoch Ellison's farm, Hough Heath, then along the Hough and Wybunbury-road to Newcastle-road aforesaid, and (2.) so much of the township of Torkington, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Goyt on the north, an occupation-road leading to Torkington farm on the south, a plantation terminating near Dom Bank Toll Bar on the east, and by the fence forming the boundary of the township of Offerton

and Bosden on the west,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the twenty-fifth and thirty-first days of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Movement into District) Order of 1881 is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order of 1881 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

Saving for Regulations in force.

2. All regulations made by a Local Authority under The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Movement into District) Order of 1881 and in force at the commencement of this Order shall, as far as the same are not inconsistent with this Order, unless altered or revoked by the Local Authority, remain in force for such time and in such manner as if this Order had not been made.

Regulations by Local Authorities in England and Wales.

3.—(a.) Notwithstanding anything in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, any Local Authority in England or Wales may, with the view of preventing the introduction of foot-and-mouth disease into their district, make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or water of animals into their district from the district of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland:

(b.) Provided, as follows:

- (i.) This Order does not authorize a Local Authority to make a regulation affecting movement of animals into an infected area; and
- (ii.) Any regulation made by a Local Authority under this Order shall not restrict movement of animals by railway through the district of that Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a regulation of a Local Authority thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day

of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

"Ready," and by the Colonial Government. These examinations show that no danger exists so far distant from the land, in the direction reported, and in such deep water (25 to 32 fathoms).

From these examinations, taken in connection with the evidence collected—it is considered that the "Brennus" struck on a shoal not heretofore charted, lying with Batticaloa Flagstaff bearing S. 7° W., distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ cables, situated in the midst of known shoal coral ground.

This new shoal, with a least depth over it of 15 feet, lies $3\frac{1}{4}$ cables N.W. of the 7-foot shoal known as Tower Rock; 6 cables W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. of the 12-foot shoal known as Beacon Rock; and $8\frac{1}{4}$ cables E. by S. of the 19-foot shoal known as Surveyor Rock.

The light (red) is moved outwards as the works progress; it is elevated 45 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.
