1259	1 April, 1882 ...	The whole of the parish of Blaston, and so much of the parish of Holt as lies on the east side of Blaston and bounded by five ploughed fields in the occupation of Mr. Burton, in the county of Leicester.
1266	4 April, 1882 ...	So much of the township of Kibworth-Harcourt, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is say, the road from Kibworth to Wistow on the west, Wistow brook on the north, and the Midland railway on the east and south. The whole of the parish of West Langton, in the county of Leicester.
1272	5 April, 1882 ...	So much of the parish of Noseley, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Noseley-road and brook on the south and east, Rolleston Wood and Village road leading to New Inn and Noseley on the north and west.
1292	11 April, 1882 ...	So much of the parishes of Market Harborough, Great Bowden, and Lubenham, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the Canal and a line drawn therefrom eastward to Highfield House on the road from the railway station to Great Bowden all in the parish of Great Bowden, from Highfield House to the river Welland on the east, on the south by the river Welland, and on the west by a line drawn from the river Welland at Plowman's Nursery Grounds northwards to its junction with the Canal as it circles Hill Crest House, the fields in the west boundary being partly in the parish of Great Bowden and partly in the parish of Lubenham. So much of the parish of Great Bowden, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Bowden to Thorpe Langton on the east, Langton brook on the north, Mr. Walker's big field on the south, and Mr. J. W. Walker's Far Close on the west. So much of the parish of Foston, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the turnpike-road from Countesthorpe to Kilby, the turnpike-road from Leicester to Welford, plough land belonging to and occupied by the Reverend Wing, and the bye-road from Foston to Peatling.
1304	12 April, 1882 ...	So much of the parish of Merevale, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by The Green Lanes, on the south and east by the brook which adjoins Beenhills farm, and on the west by the brook which separates the counties of Leicester and Warwick.
1324	18 April, 1882 ...	So much of the parish of Smeeton, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Kibworth to Smeeton on the north, the road from Gumley to Debdale on the south, the turnpike-road from Debdale to Kibworth on the east, and the road from Gumley to Smeeton on the west.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

SCHEDULE.

An area comprising so much of the townships of Stainforth, Halton Gill, and Malham Moor, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north commencing at a point called Far End of Moor Heads, then by townships boundary fences to the top of Pennyghent Hill at the east end, on the east by the fence adjoining School Allotment to Blishmer Barn, thence by west close fence to the top of Fountains Fell, on the south by fence adjoining Rough lands and Rainscar Fell to Sannett Hall farm at Catterick-road, and on the west by Catterick-road to Silverdale-road, thence by Moor Heads-road to Far End of Moor Heads aforesaid.
