To the QUEEN's Most Excellency Majesty. May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of York, in Council assembled, humbly desire to express to your Majesty our sincere and hearty congratulations upon the happy union of your illustrious son, His Royal Highness Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany, with Her Royal Highness the Princess Hélène of Waldeck and Pyrmont, a union which we fervently pray may prove a source of great happiness both to your Majesty and to their Royal Highnesses, and cement still closer the bonds of friendship between this country and the Netherlands.

We also take this opportunity of again renewing the expressions of our deep attachment to your Majesty's person and Throne; and that your Majesty may long be spared to reign over a loyal and contented people.
