PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the bishop of any diocese, or by the bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it

"shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words following, that is to say:

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Charles John Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol having represented unto us that the rectory of Harnhill, in the county of Gloucester and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol and the vicarage of Driffield in the same county and diocese being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that Henry Andrewes Palmer of Upper Norwood in the county of Surrey Esquire and John Charles Bengough of the Ridge Wotton-under-Edge in the county of Gloucester Esquire being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said rectory of Harnhill the same being now vacant and also being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said vicarage of Driffield if the same were now vacant have respectively signified their consent in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us

the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"As witness our hand this seventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Harnhill situate in the county of Gloucester and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and the vicarage of Driffield situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixty-three duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them which are within one or other of the two Archdeacons of the diocese of Saint Asaph to wit the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph and the Archdeaconry of Montgomery.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Joshua, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said rural deaneries or some of them are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may properly be carried into effect.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Joshua Bishop of Saint Asaph (in testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any

assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph and the Archdeaconry of Montgomery respectively shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries the names of which are set down in order and are numbered consecutively in the first schedule and in the second schedule respectively to this scheme annexed and that the name which in either of the same two schedules is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or other cure the name and quality of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any rural deanery in the first column of the said first schedule or in the first column of the said second schedule shall belong to and be a part of the rural deanery under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean thereof and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other rural dean the intent of this our recommendation and proposal being that as from the day aforesaid the statutory schedule of rural deaneries within the diocese of St. Asaph prepared under the hereinbefore lastly-named Act and dated the fifth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five shall be superseded by the said first and second schedules to this scheme annexed in respect of and to the extent of the changes in the name or in the area of any rural deanery or rural deaneries which in the said first and second schedules respectively appear so that as from the day aforesaid the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph shall comprise and consist of the several rural deaneries which are in that behalf set out and named in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed and every rural deanery within the same archdeaconry shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or other cures which are in that behalf set out and named in the same schedule and so that the Archdeaconry of Montgomery shall comprise and consist of the several rural deaneries which are in that behalf set out and named in the said second schedule to this scheme annexed and every rural deanery within the said last-mentioned archdeaconry shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or other cures which are in that behalf set out and named in the same lastly mentioned schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the

"laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

HADLEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Hadley, in the county of Middlesex; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz. : widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

TOWNSTAL.—Forthwith and entirely in Townstal Church, in the parish of Dartmouth, in the county of Devon; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows : In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

The Tramways Act, 1870.

Bye-laws and Regulations as to the Exeter Tramways, made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city and county of the city of Exeter, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said city and county, under the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. Rate at which Car may be driven.—The driver of every car shall drive the same at a rate not less than four miles and not more than eight miles in the hour upon the average, except in the

case of accident or unavoidable obstruction; and on the curves out of Paris-street into Sidwell-street, and out of East-gate into Longbrook-street, the rate of speed shall not exceed four miles an hour.

2. Distance between Cars.—The driver of every car shall drive the same so that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than one hundred yards along any portion of the line of tramway.

3. Entering or leaving Cars.—The conductor shall be bound to stop the car when requested by any passenger who desires to enter or leave the same, except when the gradients or curves of the route afford a reasonable excuse for his not doing so, or at the crossings of the several streets, or where prevented by the Regulations of the Police.

4. Penalty for Offences.—For every offence against any of the foregoing Bye-laws by any driver or conductor of any car, or other person using the tramways, such driver or conductor or other person shall be liable to a penalty of 40s.

Provided nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made for a breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws and Regulations may, if they think fit, reduce the amount of penalty hereinbefore prescribed as they may deem advisable.
