"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"As witness our hand this seventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Harnhill situate in the county of Gloucester and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and the vicarage of Driffild situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixty-three duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them which are within one or other of the two Archdeacons of the diocese of Saint Asaph to wit the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph and the Archdeaconry of Montgomery.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Joshua, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said rural deaneries or some of them are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may properly be carried into effect.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Joshua Bishop of Saint Asaph (in testimony whereof he hath to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any

assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph and the Archdeaconry of Montgomery respectively shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries the names of which are set down in order and are numbered consecutively in the first schedule and in the second schedule respectively to this scheme annexed and that the name which in either of the same two schedules is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or other cure the name and quality of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any rural deanery in the first column of the said first schedule or in the first column of the said second schedule shall belong to and be a part of the rural deanery under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean thereof and shall not any longer belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other rural dean the intent of this our recommendation and proposal being that as from the day aforesaid the statutory schedule of rural deaneries within the diocese of St. Asaph prepared under the hereinbefore lastly-named Act and dated the fifth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five shall be superseded by the said first and second schedules to this scheme annexed in respect of and to the extent of the changes in the name or in the area of any rural deanery or rural deaneries which in the said first and second schedules respectively appear so that as from the day aforesaid the Archdeaconry of Saint Asaph shall comprise and consist of the several rural deaneries which are in that behalf set out and named in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed and every rural deanery within the same archdeaconry shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or other cures which are in that behalf set out and named in the same schedule and so that the Archdeaconry of Montgomery shall comprise and consist of the several rural deaneries which are in that behalf set out and named in the said second schedule to this scheme annexed and every rural deanery within the said last-mentioned archdeaconry shall comprise and consist of the several parishes or other cures which are in that behalf set out and named in the same lastly mentioned schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The FIRST SCHEDULE to the foregoing Scheme annexed.
