**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 11th day of July, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cheesden-brook on the north; Royds-brook on the south; Ashworth-brook on the west; and Knowe Hill-brook on the east, (2.) so much of the township of Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Park Chapel on the north, Nangreaves on the east, Brookshaw on the west, and Nabs on the south, (3.) so much of the township of Higher Booths, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Sandstone Quarries and Lollywood on the east, the fence-wall on the top of Cribden on the west, Scar Foot and Sandstone Quarries on the north, and Laund farm on the south, (4.) so much of the parish of Royton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Royton and Crompton from Fir-lane to Spring Vale farm on the north, High Barn, High Barn-street, and Pickford-street on the east, High-street, Thorp-road, and Royton Cemetery on the south, and the boundary of the townships of Thornham and Royton from Lark Hill to Fir-lane on the west, and (5.) so much of the parish of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Moss-gate-road and Higher Rushcroft farm on the north, Lower Rushcroft Bardsleys and Cow-lane to Hunger Hill on the east, Scowcroft-lane Cowlishaw and the footpath through the fields to Low Crompton on the south, and Coalpit-lane, Thornham-road to Knowe, and the footpath through the fields to Samuel-lane, and Moss-gate-road on the west,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the twenty-seventh day of February, and the twelfth, sixteenth, eighteenth, and twenty-

second days of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

The following area (namely),—so much of the parish of Baschurch, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the water-course from Walford Heath to Fenemere brick-yard, thence the boundary fence which divides T. Slaney Eyton's property to the highway leading from Merrington Green to Walford Heath water-course aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

## THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

*Cheshire*.—So much of the township of Bredbury, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stockport-road to Bent's-lane End, thence along Bent's-lane to Red House-lane to George-lane, along George-lane to the turn leading to the

Commercial Inn, and along the Hyde-road through Woodley village to the Railway Arch.

*Derbyshire*.—(1.) So much of the parish of Bolsover, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway on the east from Fidlers Bridge to Shuttlewood Four Lane Ends, thence by Buttermilk-lane on the south to Nunnery Plantation, on the west by a fence which divides Walter Henry Cox's and William John Nicholson's farms to Doe Lea brook, and on the north by Doe Lea brook to the Midland Railway, along the railway bank to a stream known as The Goyt, and along The Goyt side to Fidlers Bridge aforesaid.

(2.) At Chinley, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Owler-lane and Hull-lane on the north, from Owler-lane by Brownside-lane to Milton Bridge on the east, thence from Milton Bridge by Hockham brook to Owler brook on the south, and by Owler brook to Owler-lane on the west.

(3.) At Sandiacre, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from a point on the Sandiacre and Stanton main-road known as Orchard Head Hill to a foot-path crossing two fields known as Lady Cross and Freezland in the occupation of William Shaw junior to Forster's house, along the highway to the Derby and Nottingham-road, thence to a foot-path in the parish of Risley opposite Garrat's farm, by the right to Heaton's farm and No Mans-lane, thence by a fence to Stanton Hall sheds taking the fence by the right to the Stanton and Sandiacre main-road at Orchard Head Hill aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parishes or townships of Repton, and Foremark, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from William Waytes house Milton, along Milton-lane to a point opposite Barnett's house Repton, turning to the left over the Brook at Brook End by Paddock Wall, passing the Brook Inn up to Repton Cross, thence to the right by the Church over Old Trent Bridge along Willington-road to Willington Bridge, to the right along the Trent by Twyford Ferry to junction with the back water from Anchor Church, thence to the right along the back water, Anchor Church post, and Brook course to John Goodall's Church Close at Foremark, turning to the left to Pale Close gate, and along the eastern and southern boundary fence of Church Close to the point where the fence intersects the foot-road from Foremark to Milton village, thence to the left along the foot-road to Milton village, turning to the right through a portion of the village to William Waytes house aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the parishes or townships of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall, Castle Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Coton-in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-Trent, and Drakelow, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway Bridge, turning along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Stanton-road, thence to the right along Stanton-road through Stanton village by the Gate Inn to Cadley Hill four cross roads, thence to the right along the road by Cadley Hill farm in the occupation of Robert William Beard to Cauldwell village, turning to the left along the road by Cauldwell Hall to the First Three-lane Ends, thence again to the left up

the lane for Linton by the Square-and-Compass Inn to a point opposite Burton's Old Chapel, thence to the right up the road through the village of Linton by the Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by the fence to the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along the boundary lane to where it intersects the road from Grange Wood to Lullington near the residence of Dr. Barstable, thence to the right along the road by Wood Fields farm to Lullington village, by the Gas Works and to the right along the road for Coton-in-the-Elms, by Grafton House and Little Liverpool to Coton village to a point opposite John Whittingham's farm-house, thence to the left by the Shoulder of Mutton Inn, the Church, and Lads Grave, turning to the left by Catton farm to Catton Lodge kept by Henry Savidge, and along the fence at the southern end of the Large Rylands in the occupation of Sir George W. Horton, Bart., to the river Trent, thence to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

*Essex*.—So much of the parishes of Aveley, Wennington, and Rainham, in the county of Essex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Thames on the south, the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway on the north, the road leading from Purfleet to Aveley on the east, and Rainham Creek on the west.

*Flintshire*.—(1.) The whole of the farm known as The Dee Side House farm, situate in the township of Sealand, in the parish of Hawarden, in the petty sessional division of Hawarden, in the county of Flint, bounded on the south-west by the river Dee, on the north-west and north-east by an embankment known as The Old Bank with a water-course running parallel thereto, and on the south-east by a farm known as Wood farm.

(2.) So much of the parish of Worthenbury, in the county of Flint, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Whitchurch and Wrexham-road to Green-lane on the north, the Bangor and Worthenbury-road to Worthenbury on the north-east, Green-lane to the outer boundary of Emral Park to Pandly Bridge and Halghton Mill on the south-west.

*Lancashire*.—(1.) So much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cheesden-brook on the north; Royds-brook on the south; Ashworth-brook on the west; and Knowe Hill-brook on the east.

(2.) So much of the township of Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Park Chapel on the north, Nangreaves on the east, Brookshaw on the west, and Nabs on the south.

(3.) So much of the township of Higher Booths, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Sandstone Quarries and Lollywood on the east, the fence-wall on the top of Cribden on the west, Scar Foot and Sandstone Quarries on the north, and Laund farm on the south.

(4.) So much of the parish of Royton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Royton and Crompton from Fir-lane to Spring Vale farm on the north, High Barn, High Barn-street, and Pickford-street on the east, High-street, Thorp-road, and Royton Cemetery on the south, and the bound-

dary of the townships of Thornham and Royton from Lark Hill to Fir-lane on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mossgate-road and Higher Rushcroft farm on the north, Lower Rushcroft Bardsleys and Cow-lane to Hunger Hill on the east, Scowcroft-lane Cowlshaw and the footpath through the fields to Low Crompton on the south, and Coalpit-lane, Thornham-road to Knowe, and the footpath through the fields to Samuel-lane, and Mossgate-road on the west.

(6.) So much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Rochdale and Edenfield turnpike-road on the south, Woodhouse-lane and Rooley Moor-road on the west, Catlow-lane Head and the Rochdale borough boundary on the north, and the Rochdale borough boundary to Cut Gate on the east.

(7.) So much of the township of Castleton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Chadwick and Lower-lane on the north, Dean brook, Ginnel farm, and Lords Tenement farm on the south, Dean Houses and Dean farm on the west, and Langfield farm on the east.

(8.) So much of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bunker's Hill-lane on the north, Green Side-lane on the south, Lumb-lane on the east, and Failsworth brook on the west.

(9.) So much of the township of Birtle-cum-Bamford, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the borough of Rochdale on the east, the river Roach on the south, Birtle Chapel on the west, and Dixon Fold on the north.

(10.) So much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary line of Reaps Moss Spotland from Todmorden and Walsden on the north, Old Road farm Troughgate Bacup on the south, Old Home farm and New Hill farm near Under Shore Shawforth on the east, and Dry Corner farm and Hey Head farm Bacup on the west.

(11.) So much of the township of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Crompton and Butterworth from Whitfield Bottoms to Jep Wood on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Jubilee to Smallbrook on the east, the footpath to Lower and Higher Rushcroft on the south, and the footpath by Mossgate and Whitfield Hey to Whitfield Bottoms aforesaid on the west.

(12.) So much of the parish of Butterworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cleggswood-lane and New Barns farm on the north, Hollingworth Lake Bank by Beach Hotel and Cleggswood Hey farm on the south, Fisherman's Hotel and Cleggswood on the east, and Three-lane Ends and Royal Oak Beerhouse on the west.

*Leicestershire.*—(1.) The whole of the parish of Welham, in the county of Leicester.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Slawston, in the county of Leicester.

(3.) So much of the parish of Humberstone, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road

from Belgrave to Humberstone on the north, the turnpike-road from Leicester to Uppingham on the south, the road from the said turnpike-road to Humberstone on the east, and the road from the said turnpike-road past the borough Asylum to the said road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the west.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Gumley, in the county of Leicester.

(5.) So much of the parish of Beeby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Beeby to South Croxton on the north, the road leading from Beeby to Hungarton on the south, a footpath leading from Keyham to South Croxton on the east, and the village of Beeby on the west.

*Lincolnshire (Kesteven).*—(1.) So much of the parish of Bloxholme, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary hedge running between John Mills Frudd's farm and Charles W. Elwood's Hill farm on or towards the south, the boundary hedge between the said two farms running westward to B. P. Coulsen's farm in Brauncewell on or towards the west, a boundary hedge between the farm in the occupation of the said B. P. Coulsen and the said Hill farm to the Springwell drain on or towards the north, the said Springwell drain (running eastwards) to the highway leading from Ashby to Sleaford on or towards the east, and the said highway leading from Ashby through the village of Bloxholme to Sleaford southwards to the first-mentioned boundary hedge.

(2.) At Quarrington, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Sleaford to Grantham on the south, and towards the west to Quarrington Wash Dyke, thence on or towards the north by the Quarrington and Ranceby Beck to Lord Bristol's Top Plantation, and on or towards the north-east by certain fields in the occupation of Frederick Ward and Frederick Rippon to the said Frederick Rippon's farm buildings in the parish of Holdingham, and on or towards the south-east by Rippon's Cottages to William Clark Allen's Bouncing Hill farm, and on or towards the south by an imaginary line to the Sleaford Water Works Engine-house, the Sleaford Water Works Tank, and a certain field in the occupation of John Taylor Marston, to the highway first-mentioned.

(3.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Cuckoo-lane south and towards the west to Birds Plantation, and on or towards the north by the boundary hedge between Robert G. F. Howard's, Atley Barnes, and John Chatterton's, Temple Grange, and on or towards the east by the Blind Bob field and the Garden Close to the Fox Hills Cover, and on or towards the south by the said Fox Hills Cover, and Long Close in the occupation of the said John Chatterton to the Cuckoo-lane aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parish of Leadenham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a public highway leading from Newark to Leadenham on the north, a lane known as The Back-lane and a lane known as Gospel-lane and an imaginary line to the Leadenham and Fulbeck parish boundary on the east, the Leadenham and Fulbeck parish boundary to

the river Brant on the south, and the river Brant to the said first-mentioned highway on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Great Hale, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a public highway leading from Sleaford to Boston on the north, three closes of arable land in the occupation of C. J. B. Parker on the east, four closes of arable land in the occupation of Charles Sharpe on the south, three closes of arable land in the occupation of the said Charles Sharpe one in the occupation of John Brown and one in the occupation of the said C. J. B. Parker on the west, to the said first-mentioned highway.

(6.) So much of the parish of Little Hale, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the parish boundary line or fence running between the parishes of Great Hale and Little Hale on or towards the north and east, in part to the highway leading from Little Hale to Burton Pedwardine, and in other part from the said highway by fields in the occupation of John Hides and Julia Garratt respectively, the boundary line or fence running between Little Hale parish and Helpringham on or towards the south, fields in the occupation of Julia Garratt, Felix Tomlinson, and John Hides to the said highway leading from Little Hale to Burton Pedwardine in part on or towards the west and in other part by fields in the occupation of the said Felix Tomlinson and the said Charles Sharpe to the said first-mentioned boundary line or fence.

(7.) So much of the parish of Billingborough, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the forty-foot drain on the east, the Neslam Drove to William Hardy Swards new buildings on the south, four arable fields in the occupation of William Hardy Swards to the Horbling drain on the west, and the said Horbling drain to the first-mentioned forty-foot drain on the north.

(8.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Navenby to the Green Man farm, and the Green Man plantation on the north, arable fields in the occupation of Henry Bott and John Chatterton on the east, four arable fields in the occupation of John Chatterton on the south, and seven arable fields in the occupation of Henry Bott to Navenby highway on the west.

(9.) In the parish of Horbling, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprising the whole of the village of Horbling and the adjoining fields as far as the South Beck on the south, the Long Plantation, Sandy Gate-lane, and an imaginary line to Swaton-lane End on the east, Swaton-lane and Holland-road on the north, and the Great Northern Railway on the west.

(10.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, arable fields in the occupation of John Chatterton and Henry Bott to the Green Man plantation on the west, the Green Man plantation to William Cartwright's farm buildings, Blankney, on the east, an imaginary line by arable fields in the occupation of William Cartwright, Blankney, and Henry Paddison, Scopwick, to the farm buildings of the said Henry Paddison at Scopwick Lodge on the

west, and Scopwick Lodge-road the Fox Hills to the arable fields first-mentioned on the south.

(11.) So much of the parishes of Caythorpe, and Fulbeck, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Fulbeck-road, the highway leading from Leadenham to Sleaford, and an arable field in the occupation of Richard Bestall, Byards Leap, to the Cranwell Lodge-road on the north the said Cranwell Lodge-road and Gorse-lane on or towards the east, Caythorpe Heath-road to Henry Barnes cottages on the south, and an imaginary line from the said Henry Barnes cottages to the Foreman's house at F. M. Pogson's farm premises, Caythorpe Heath, thence by corn-fields to Henry Burt's farm buildings, Fulbeck, and a grass field to Fulbeck-road aforesaid on the west.

(12.) So much of the parish of Metheringham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Blankney-lane from Blankney cross-roads to the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the south, the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the west, the Metheringham Fen-lane to the Old Carr Dyke on the north, and the said Old Carr Dyke, an arable-field and a corn-field in the occupation of Henry Chaplin, Esquire, M.P., and the Fox Cover plantation and the Metheringham Moor-lane to the Blankney cross-roads aforesaid.

(13.) So much of the parishes of Horbling, Billingborough, and Threckingham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great Northern Railway on the east, Falkingham-road to Madam-lane on the south, Madam-lane to Holland-road on the west, and Holland-road to the Great Northern Railway on the north.

(14.) So much of the parish of Metheringham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Green Man bridle-road to Bloxholm-road on the south, Bloxholm-road to Dunston Heath-lane on the west, Dunston Heath-lane to Lincoln and Sleaford low-road on the north, and Lincoln and Sleaford low-road to Green Man bridle-road aforesaid on the east.

*Nottinghamshire.*—So much of the parish of Holme, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on or towards the north by Langford-lane and Wells-lane leading from the Gainsborough-road to the Trent, on or towards the east by the said Gainsborough-road leading from Winthorpe School to Langford-lane End, on or towards the south by a straight line from Winthorpe School to the river Trent, and on or towards the west by the river Trent.

*Shropshire.*—(1.) So much of the parish of Baschurch, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the water-course from Walford Heath to Fenemere brick-yard, thence the boundary fence which divides T. Slaney Eyton's property to the highway leading from Merrington Green to Walford Heath water-course aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Forton, in the county of Stafford, and of the parish of Newport and the township of Chetwynd Aston, in the county of Salop, as is bounded by the main-road from Coley Mill to Newport, Tau-house-lane, the Shropshire Union Canal, Meer-town brook, Aqualate Meer, and Moreton brook.

(3.) So much of the parishes of Stoke-upon-

Tern, and Hodnet, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Ollerton village to a stream crossing the road between Eaton village and Great Bolas, thence the stream to the river Teen, thence the river Teen to Little Bolas Bridge, thence the highway to Peplow Church, and thence the foot-path to Ollerton village aforesaid.

*Staffordshire.*—(1.) So much of the township of Branstone, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Trent from Drakelow Viaduct to Trent House Branstone, thence by the Flood Embankment to the Midland Railway leading from Burton-upon-Trent to Tamworth at Branstone village, thence by the said railway to Branstone Junction, and thence by the Birmingham Curve and the Burton-upon-Trent and Leicester line of railway to the river Trent at Drakelow Viaduct aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Forton, in the county of Stafford, and of the parish of Newport and the township of Chetwynd Aston, in the county of Salop, as is bounded by the main-road from Coley Mill to Newport, Tan-house-lane, the Shropshire Union Canal, Meer-town brook, Aqualate Meer, and Moreton brook.

(3.) So much of the townships of Dunstall, and Tatenhill, in the county of Stafford, as lies between the main-road from Burton-upon-Trent to Lichfield, the highway from Barton-under-Needwood village to the cross-roads at the southern end of Tatenhill village, and the highway thence to Branstone.

(4.) So much of the parish of Gayton, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Coton by Doglands to Gayton village, the highway thence through Gayton village to Hartley Green, and the road from Hartley Green direct to Fradswell in the township of Fradswell and the parish of Gayton.

*Warwickshire.*—So much of the hamlet of Erdington, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Midland railway on the south, Chester-road on the east, Grange-lane on the north, and the road leading from Bromford to Erdington on the west.

*Wiltshire.*—(1.) At Laverstock and Ford, in the county of Wilts, bounded on the north by a row of elm-trees extending from a pond called Read's pond on the eastern side of the old turnpike-road from Salisbury to Amesbury to a field called Buckle Corner, on the east by a row of elm-trees extending from Buckle Corner to a field called The Sling, on the south by a bank and fence extending from The Sling to a plantation called Rockshill plantation, and thence by the northern boundary of such plantation to the old turnpike-road from Salisbury to Amesbury, and on the west by the eastern boundary of the said turnpike-road.

(2.) NOTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators of the River Thames, in the exercise of the power and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1857 and 1864, the Thames Navigation Act, 1866, the Thames Conservancy Act, 1867, the Thames Navigation Act, 1870, and the Thames Conservancy Act, 1878, and of every other authority then hereunto in any wise enabling, propose to order and direct as follows, that is to say :—

1. All or so many and such part or parts of the rules, ordinances, and bye-laws, which relate to fisheries in the River Thames and the waters of the Medway, or in the River Thames and Isis, as are, or is hereinafter mentioned, namely :—

The rules and ordinances made in pursuance of the Act of the 30th George II., by the Mayor and Aldermen of the city of London, on the 4th day of October, 1785, and duly approved and confirmed on the 22nd and 24th days of the same month, and by the Conservators of the River Thames, in pursuance of the same Act, on the 23rd day of January, 1860, and duly approved

and confirmed on the 28th day of the same month.

The bye-laws or sections numbered 7 to 13 inclusive of the rules and bye-laws for the preservation and regulation of the fisheries, from the City Stone, near Staines, to Cricklade, made on the 14th day of June, 1869, and duly allowed by Her Majesty in Council on the 11th day of November following. The rules and bye-laws made by the Conservators of the River Thames on the 7th day of July, 1873, and duly allowed by Her Majesty in Council on the 30th day of September following.

The rules and bye-laws made by the said Conservators, and duly allowed by Her Majesty in Council, on the 28th day of October, 1879. And all other (if any) of the rules, ordinances, and bye-laws hereafter made by the Conservators of the River Thames, which are now in force for protecting, preserving, or regulating the fisheries of the River Thames, shall, after these present bye-laws shall have been allowed by order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, be and the same are hereby repealed.

#### *Short Title.*

2. These bye-laws may be cited as the Thames Fishery Bye-Laws, 1882.

#### *Commencement.*

3. These bye-laws shall come into operation the day after the same are allowed by order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

#### *Application.*

4. These bye-laws extend and apply to the River Thames and Isis, hereinafter called the River Thames, from Cricklade, in the county of Wilts, to Yantlet Creek, in the county of Kent, save and except where the application thereof is expressly limited to any particular part of the said river, or to any particular and specified class of fish, and to that extent only.

#### *Definition of Terms.*

5. In these bye-laws, unless there is something inconsistent in the context, the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have respectively the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

"Person" shall include any body of persons, corporate or incorporate.

"Court" shall include two or more magistrates assembled in petty sessions.

"Fishery" shall include oysters and shell-fish, and the term

"Fish" shall include oysters and shell-fish, and also the spawn, brood, or fry of fish, oysters, and shell-fish.

"Vessel" shall include ships, lighter, keel, barge, boat, punt, wherry, raft, or craft, or any other kind of vessel whatever, whether navigated by steam or otherwise.

6. Subject to the reservation of rights in these bye-laws contained, every net or engine, or apparatus for taking or attempting to take fish, which is not expressly authorised by these bye-laws, shall be deemed to be a prohibited net or engine or apparatus within the same, that is to say :— The nets and engines described in the following sub-sections, numbered 1 to 8 inclusive, may be used for the purposes following in that part of the River Thames between Richmond Bridge and Yantlet Creek, and not elsewhere :—

(1) For pike, jack, perch, roach, dace, chub, and barbel—A flew or stream net of a mesh not less than three inches throughout when wet, and not more than sixteen fathoms long (to be used only in the river below Richmond Bridge).



- (2) For flounders and soles—A net of a mesh not less than two and a half inches throughout when wet, and not more than sixteen fathoms long.
- (3) For roach and dace—A single blay net of a mesh not less than two inches and a quarter when wet, and not more than thirteen fathoms long; to fleet with the stream with a boat and buoy attached to it (to be used only in the river below Richmond Bridge).
- (4) For eels—Grig weels, to be used only in the river below Richmond Bridge.
- (5) For Smelts.—A net of not less than one inch and a quarter in the mesh when wet, and not more than sixteen fathoms long, except in the middle of the net where a space of six fathoms long shall be one inch in the mesh when wet: to be worked by fleet with the stream, with a boat and buoy attached to it.
- (6) For Shrimps.—A trawl net of a mesh not less than one inch, when wet, except near the cod end, where it may be, but not smaller than half an inch mesh when wet; or a Trim-tram net, with a mesh of not less than half an inch when wet, and a weighted beam of 21 feet in length.
- (7) For Sprats.—A stow-boat net not less than one inch in the mesh when wet.
- (8) For Whitebait.—A stow-boat net not less than half an inch in the mesh when wet.

The nets described in the following sub-sections, 9 to 12 inclusive, may be used in the River Thames generally, for the purposes herein mentioned:—

- (9) For Minnows.—A round drop minnow net not exceeding three feet in diameter.
- (10) A small landing net for securing fish taken in angling.
- (11) For general use.—A hand or well net, to be

used for removing fish from the well of a boat, or for carrying or preserving fish after capture.

- (12) A casting or bait net, not exceeding 20 feet in circumference, to be used only in obtaining bait to be employed in angling, the sack or purse thereof not being more than 14 inches in depth when extended to the utmost.

Provided—That a trawl-net shall not be used in any part of the river except between Greenhithe and Yantlet Creek, in the county of Kent.

7. No fish of the species hereinafter mentioned shall be taken in or out of the River Thames, or having been thence taken, shall be had in possession, or exposed for sale on the River Thames, or on the shore thereof, of less than the respective sizes and dimensions following:—(This section shall not apply to any person who takes such fish accidentally, and forthwith returns the same to the water with the least possible injury.)

Pike or Jack .... Extreme length 18 inches.

Perch ..... " " 8 "

Chub ..... " " 10 "

Roach ..... " " 7 "

Dace ..... " " 6 "

Barbel ..... " " 13 "

Trout ..... " " 14 "

Grayling ..... " " 9 "

Carp ..... " " 10 "

8. The times and seasons for fishing in the River Thames, and for taking the following fish therein, and the Close, or Fence Seasons, when such fish shall not be fished for or taken therein, are as follows:—

Nothing in this section shall apply to any person who shall during the period between the 11th day of September and the 31st day of March following, both days inclusive, take, or attempt to take minnows or gudgeon for use as bait for trout by means only of a round drop minnow net, not exceeding three feet in diameter.

9. The places hereinafter mentioned are the preserves staked and marked by the Conservators for the preservation of the Fishery, and no person shall take up or remove any stake, burr, boat, punt, or any other thing placed for the purpose of impeding fishing, or wilfully disturb the said preserves or spawning beds in any way, and no person shall fish or attempt to take fish in any of the said places, except by angling with rod and line:—

Richmond.—From Richmond Bridge to the Duke of Buccleuch's grounds—a distance of 700 yards in length, or thereabouts.

Twickenham.—From the Upper end of the Lawn at Pope's Villa to the Island, being 400 yards in length.

Kingston.—From Mr. Park's lawn at Teddington through the backwater (the Crowlock) up to the Lower Malthouse at Hampton Wick, being 1,960 yards in length.

Thames Ditton.—From Lord Henry Fitzgerald's—Eastward, 512 yards in length.

Hampton.—From Mousley Lock to Garrick's Lawn, Hampton, being 1,514 yards in length, or thereabouts.

Sunbury.—From Sunbury Weir—688 yards in length, to the Eastward.

Walton.—Walton Sale—250 yards in length.

Shepperton.—Upper Deep—240 yards Eastward of Creek rails.

Lower Deep—200 yards Eastward of the Public Drain.

Weybridge.—From Shepperton Lock round the course of the River to the Weir—830 yards in length.

Chertsey.—From the Weir at to 80 yards below the Bridge, being 445 yards in length.

Penton Hook.—From the Weir at round the Island and up to the Lock at Penton Hook, being 1,150 yards in length.

Staines.—From the City Stone to a point 210 yards below the Road bridge at Staines.

10.—No person shall do the following things, that is to say:—

(a.) Fish with, use, trawl, lay or set a prohibited net or engine, or apparatus.

(b.) Have in his possession while on the river or on the shore thereof, a prohibited net or engine unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he had not the same in his possession with intent at the time of such possession to fish with, use, trawl, lay or set the same in the river.

(c.) Fish for or take, or attempt to take any fish by using, baited or unbaited hooks, or wire or snare, or any other engine for the purpose of foul hooking commonly called snatching or snaring.

(d.) Fish for or take, or attempt to take above Richmond Bridge any fish except in the day time, that is to say between the beginning of the last hour before sunrise, and the end of the first hour after sunset.

(e.) Fish for or take, or attempt to take any fish within the fence season for the same.

(f.) Buy, sell, or expose for sale or have in his possession any fish that has been caught or taken within the fence season for the same, in the River Thames.

(g.) Take or attempt to take, or disturb any fish when spawning.

(h.) Take, destroy, or spoil any spawn, fry or brood of fish or spat of oysters.

(i.) Use doubled walled net or nets with false or double bottoms, with cod or pouse.

(j.) Use eel spears commonly so called for the purpose of taking fish.

(k.) Attach any net, engine or other device to

any anchor, or fix the same in any manner so as to cross any part of the River Thames.

(l.) Lay night hooks or night lines of any description whatever, or any fixed hooks or lines by night or day.

11. On and after the 1st day of January, 1883, every person following the business of a fisherman on the River Thames, or who shall keep to be let for hire for fishing in the River Thames any boat, punt, or vessel, shall cause his name and place of abode to be duly registered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary to the Conservators of the River Thames, at their office in London, which is now situate at 41, Trinity-square, Tower-hill, and every such person shall pay one shilling for every registry of each boat, punt, or vessel, and on every registry the Secretary to the said Conservators shall deliver a number for each boat, punt, or vessel to such person, and such person shall cause to be painted and kept in legible characters of not less than two inches long and broad in proportion on the stern, and on each bow of each boat, punt, or vessel such number, together with his name and place of abode, so as to be plainly seen in the day-time, and if such person shall neglect to cause such boat, punt, or vessel to be duly registered, or such number, together with his name and place of abode to be painted and preserved in legible characters as aforesaid, or shall wilfully suffer the same to be altered or defaced, and if not renewed he shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these bye-laws, and it shall not be lawful for any person following the business of a fisherman on the River Thames, and having a boat, punt, or vessel for that purpose, or who shall keep a boat or boats, punts or vessels, to be let for hire for fishing, to use or let for hire for fishing any boat, punt, or vessel without having the same registered and his name and place of abode legibly painted thereon as hereinafter mentioned.

12. No person shall put down in the River Thames, at the mouth of any creek, river, or backwater communicating with the River Thames, or running into the said river, or at any mill or sluice, any net or device whatever to stop, catch, or hinder the fish, or spawn, or fry of fish from coming into the said River Thames.

When a prohibited net, or engine, or other apparatus is seized under the provisions of the Acts in such case made or either of them, or these bye-laws, the same may be burnt or otherwise destroyed by the order of the justices before whom the same is brought without prejudice to the infliction of a penalty on, or other remedy against the person offending, or relating to the net, engine, or apparatus.

13. Nothing in these bye-laws shall prevent any person, provided he has the previous consent of the Conservators in writing under their common seal, from obtaining fish for the purposes of artificial propagation or scientific purposes, or from having in his possession Salmon Roe or Trout Roe for any of those purposes, or for taking or attempting to take Salmon or Trout when spawning, or near the spawning beds.

14. Nothing in these bye-laws, except the provisions relative to the fence season, shall take away, or abridge any right of the owner or occupier of a private fishery, or any person having authority in writing from any such owner or occupier to fish for, or to take or attempt to take fish and eels by means of nets commonly called cast nets and crayfish nets, or by grig or ground wheels for eels, or by night lines, or by means of eel bucks or stages, so far only as such eel bucks or stages can be legally used.

Provided that on a special license being obtained from the Conservators in writing, under their Common Seal, and not otherwise, such owners or occupiers, or persons having authority as aforesaid, may take fish by means of a net commonly called a hoop net, having a mesh of not less than 2 inches from knot to knot when wet, or 8 inches all round, and not being more than 6 yards long, or by means of a net commonly called a drag net, and having a mesh of not less than 2 inches from knot to knot when wet, or 8 inches all round.

15. Any person committing any breach of or in any way infringing any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of, and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding 5*l.* for every such breach or infringement, which said penalty shall be recovered and enforced pursuant to the provisions of the statutes in such case made and provided, and such penalty shall be applied according to the provisions of "The Thames Acts, 1857 to 1878."
