

(2.) So much of the parish of Hunmanby, in the Dickering petty sessional division, in the East Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Hunmanby to Rudston on the east, certain quickwood fences dividing tillage fields from the grass field known as Cowpasture, in the occupation of Hannah Lowish, on the north, south, and west.

Yorkshire (West Riding).—(1.) So much of the township of Stansfield, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, East Lee-road on the south and east, Great House-road on the north, and East Lee Clough or Beck on the west until it joins East Lee-road aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the township of Erringden, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Calder on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway on the south, the fence dividing Stocks Hall farm from the farm of Robert Ashworth on the east, and the fence dividing Stocks Hall farm from the farm of Lewis Sutcliffe on the west.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

SAINT NEOTS FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices acting in and for the Petty Sessional Division of Toseland, in the county of Huntingdon, that a Fair has been annually held, on the 17th day of December, at Saint Neots, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the day for the holding of such Fair should be altered, and that the Fair hitherto held at Saint Neots, on the 17th day of December, in each year, should cease to be held on that day, and should, in future, be held, instead, on the Thursday preceding the 17th day of December in each year :

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly given to the Earl of Sandwich, as Owner, and otherwise published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873 :"

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the day for the holding of the said Fair should be altered as proposed :

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the day shall be altered for the holding of the Fair which has been annually held at Saint Neots, in the county of Huntingdon, and that the Fair, hitherto held at Saint Neots, in the said county, on the 17th day of December in each year, shall, in future, be held instead on the Thursday preceding the 17th day of December in each year.
