INSTRUMENT substituting the New Church of the Holy Trinity, within the Parish of Hautbois Magna, for the Old Church of Saint Theobald, within the same Parish, in the County of Norfolk, and Diocese of Norwich.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting :

WHEREAS a new church has been built within the parish of Hautbois Magna, in the county of Norfolk, and in the diocese of Norwich, and has been consecrated and dedicated to the Holy Trinity.

And whereas the Honourable and Right Reverend John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, and the Reverend John Colk Girling, Clerk in Holy Orders, who is both the patron and the Rector or Incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Hautbois Magna, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Hautbois Magna, that the said new church of the Holy Trinity, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church dedicated to Saint Theobald of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instrument under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich and of the said John Colk Girling, hereby declare that the said new church of the Holy Trinity, situate in the said parish of Hautbois Magna, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby substituted for, the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Theobald as aforesaid), of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Hautbois Magna in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Theobald, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of the Holy Trinity so hereby substituted had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church, dedicated to Saint Theobald as aforesaid, of the said parish of Hautbois

Magna, or to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of the Holy Trinity (now being, by virtue of these presents, the parish church of the said parish of Hautbois Magna), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said John Colk Girling, has set his hands and affixed his seal, this twenty-second day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

INSTRUMENT assigning a Particular District to the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Portsea, in the County of Southampton, and Diocese of Winchester.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and the Right Reverend Edward Harold, Bishop of the Diocese of Winchester, send greeting :

WHEREAS a church has lately been built at Portsea, within the original limits of the parish of Saint Mary, Portsea, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, by and at the expense of certain well disposed persons, who have, with the approbation of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and of the said Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, secured to the said new church an endowment and a repair fund in accordance with the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or of some of them and particularly of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-seven.

And whereas under the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts or in some of them, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, with the consent of the said Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, by an instrument bearing date on or about the twenty-first day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, declared that the perpetual right of patronage of, and of nominating a minister to serve, the said new church from time to time and at all times whenever it should be requisite to nominate a minister to serve the same should, from and after the consecration of such church, be vested in, and be exercised by, and belong to the Lord Bishop of Winchester and his successors, or other the Bishop for the time being of the diocese in which the said new church is or from time to time may be situate.

And whereas the said church has since been consecrated and is called "The Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Portsea."

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England deem it expedient that a particular district, to comprise certain portions of the said parish of Saint Mary, Portsea, of the new parish of Saint Luke, Portsea, in the said county of Southampton, and in the said diocese
