**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) NO. 8 ORDER OF 1882.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August,

one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

#### Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

#### Movement from Northumberland, Cumberland, Westmorland, or Berwick-upon-Tweed.

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the counties of Northumberland or Cumberland or Westmorland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a place or area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, to a farm or premises in Scotland, with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved, which licence shall not be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

- (i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and
- (ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and
- (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

#### Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) An area comprising so much of the parish of Elford, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Tame from Fisherwick Bridge to Salters Bridge, thence along the Burton turnpike-road to Fisherwick Bridge aforesaid.

#### THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within

those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Cheshire.**—So much of the township of Bredbury, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stockport-road to Bent's-lane End, thence along Bent's-lane to Red House-lane to George-lane, along George-lane to the turn leading to the Commercial Inn, and along the Hyde-road through Woodley village to the Railway Arch.

**Derbyshire.**—(1.) At Sandiacre, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from a point on the Sandiacre and Stanton main-road known as Orchard Head Hill to a foot-path crossing two fields known as Lady Cross and Freezland in the occupation of William Shaw junior to Forster's house, along the highway to the Derby and Nottingham-road, thence to a foot-path in the parish of Risley opposite Garrat's farm, by the right to Heaton's farm and No Mans-lane, thence by a fence to Stanton Hall sheds taking the fence by the right to the Stanton and Sandiacre main-road at Orchard Head Hill aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parishes or townships of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall, Castle Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Cotton-in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-Trent, Drakelow, and Croxall, in the county of Derby, and of the parish of Edingale, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway Bridge, turning along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Stanton-road, thence to the right along Stanton-road through Stanton village by the Gate Inn to Cadley Hill four cross roads, thence to the right along the road by Cadley Hill farm in the occupation of Robert William Beard to Cauldwell village, turning to the left along the road by Cauldwell Hall to the First Three-lane Ends, thence again to the left up the lane for Linton by the Square-and-Compass Inn to a point opposite Burton's Old Chapel, thence to the right up the road through the village of Linton by the Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by the fence to the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along the boundary fence to where it intersects the road from Grange Wood to Lullington near the residence of Dr. Barstable, thence to the right along the road by Wood Fields farm to Lullington village, by the Gas Works, to the left by Lullington Church, to the right down the lane for Edingale by Westbrook farm Edingale fields to Edingale village, through the village by Holly Bush and Black Horse Inns and Kinson's shop to Edingale School, then along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to and along the river Mease to its junction with the Trent, and turning to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

**Essex.**—So much of the parishes of Aveley, Wennington, and Rainham, in the county of Essex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Thames on the south, the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway on the north, the road leading from Purfleet to Aveley on the east, and Rainham Creek on the west.

**Flintshire.**—(1.) The whole of the farm known as The Dee Side House farm, situate in the town-

ship of Sealand, in the parish of Hawarden, in the petty sessional division of Hawarden, in the county of Flint, bounded on the south-west by the river Dee, on the north-west and north-east by an embankment known as The Old Bank with a water-course running parallel thereto, and on the south-east by a farm known as Wood farm.

(2.) So much of the parish of Worthenbury, in the county of Flint, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Whitechurch and Wrexham-road to Green-lane on the north, the Bangor and Worthenbury-road to Worthenbury on the north-east, Green-lane to the outer boundary of Emral Park to Pandly Bridge and Halghton Mill on the south-west.

*Lancashire.*—(1.) So much of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bunker's Hill-lane on the north, Green Side-lane on the south, Lumb-lane on the east, and Failsworth brook on the west.

(2.) So much of the township of Birtle-cum-Bamford, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the borough of Rochdale on the east, the river Roach on the south, Birtle Chapel on the west, and Dixon Fold on the north.

(3.) So much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary line of Reaps Moss Spotland from Todmorden and Walsden on the north, Old Road farm Troughgate Bacup on the south, Old Home farm and New Hill farm near Under Shore Shawforth on the east, and Dry Corner farm and Hey Head farm Bacup on the west.

(4.) So much of the township of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Crompton and Butterworth from Whitfield Bottoms to Jep Wood on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Jubilee to Smallbrook on the east, the footpath to Lower and Higher Rushcroft on the south, and the footpath by Mossgate and Whitfield Hey to Whitfield Bottoms aforesaid on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Butterworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cleggswood-lane and New Barns farm on the north, Hollingworth Lake Bank by Beach Hotel and Cleggswood Hey farm on the south, Fisherman's Hotel and Cleggswood on the east, and Three-lane Ends and Royal Oak Beerhouse on the west.

*Leicestershire.*—(1.) The whole of the parish of Welham, in the county of Leicester.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Slawston, in the county of Leicester.

(3.) So much of the parish of Humberstone, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the north, the turnpike-road from Leicester to Uppingham on the south, the road from the said turnpike-road to Humberstone on the east, and the road from the said turnpike-road past the borough Asylum to the said road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the west.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Gumley, in the county of Leicester.

(5.) So much of the parish of Beeby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading

from Beeby to South Croxton on the north, the road leading from Beeby to Hungarton on the south, a footpath leading from Keyham to South Croxton on the east, and the village of Beeby on the west.

(6.) So much of the parish of Gaddesby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain arable and pasture land in the occupation of E. H. Cheney on the north and east, certain arable and pasture land in the occupation of E. H. Cheney, J. Smith, and William Walpole on the west, and Gaddesby brook on the south.

(7.) So much of the parish of Barkby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Ridgemere-road on the north, the road leading from Barkby village to Beeby village on the south, the road leading from Beeby village to South Croxton village on the east, and a fence, and certain fields in the occupation of Mr. Talbot on the west.

*Lincolnshire (Kesteven).*—(1.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Cuckoo-lane south and towards the west to Birds Plantation, and on or towards the north by the boundary hedge between Robert G. F. Howard's, Atley Barnes, and John Chatterton's, Temple Grange, and on or towards the east by the Blind Bob field and the Garden Close to the Fox Hills Cover, and on or towards the south by the said Fox Hills Cover, and Long Close in the occupation of the said John Chatterton to the Cuckoo-lane aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Leadenham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a public highway leading from Newark to Leadenham on the north, a lane known as The Back-lane and a lane known as Gospel-lane and an imaginary line to the Leadenham and Fulbeck parish boundary on the east, the Leadenham and Fulbeck parish boundary to the river Brant on the south, and the river Brant to the said first-mentioned highway on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Billingborough, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the forty-foot drain on the east, the Neslam Drove to William Hardy Swards new buildings on the south, four arable fields in the occupation of William Hardy Swards to the Horbling drain on the west, and the said Horbling drain to the first-mentioned forty-foot drain on the north.

(4.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Navenby to the Green Man farm, and the Green Man plantation on the north, arable fields in the occupation of Henry Bott and John Chatterton on the east, four arable fields in the occupation of John Chatterton on the south, and seven arable fields in the occupation of Henry Bott to Navenby highway on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Temple Bruer, in the parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, arable fields in the occupation of John Chatterton and Henry Bott to the Green Man plantation on the west, the Green Man plantation to William Cartwright's farm buildings, Blankney, on the east, an imaginary line by

arable fields in the occupation of William Cartwright, Blankney, and Henry Paddison, Scopwick, to the farm buildings of the said Henry Paddison at Scopwick Lodge on the west, and Scopwick Lodge-road the Fox Hills to the arable fields first-mentioned on the south.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Caythorpe, and Fulbeck, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Fulbeck-road, the highway leading from Leadenham to Sleaford, and an arable field in the occupation of Richard Bestall, Byards Leap, to the Cranwell Lodge-road on the north, the said Cranwell Lodge-road and Gorse-lane on or towards the east, Caythorpe Heath-road to Henry Barnes cottages on the south, and an imaginary line from the said Henry Barnes cottages to the Foreman's house at F. M. Pogson's farm premises, Caythorpe Heath, thence by corn-fields to Henry Burt's farm buildings, Fulbeck, and a grass field to Fulbeck-road aforesaid on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Metheringham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Blankney-lane from Blankney cross-roads to the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the south, the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the west, the Metheringham Fen-lane to the Old Carr Dyke on the north, and the said Old Carr Dyke, an arable-field and a corn-field in the occupation of Henry Chaplin, Esquire, M.P., and the Fox Cover plantation and the Metheringham Moor-lane to the Blankney cross-roads aforesaid.

(8.) So much of the parishes of Horbling, Billingborough, and Threckingham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great Northern Railway on the east, Falkingham-road to Madam-lane on the south, Madam-lane to Holland-road on the west, and Holland-road to the Great Northern Railway on the north.

(9.) So much of the parish of Metheringham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Green Man bridge-road to Bloxholm-road on the south, Bloxholm-road to Dunston Heath-lane on the west, Dunston Heath-lane to Lincoln and Sleaford low-road on the north, and Lincoln and Sleaford low-road to Green Man bridge-road aforesaid on the east.

*Nottinghamshire.*—So much of the parish of Holme, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on or towards the north by Langford-lane and Wells-lane leading from the Gainsborough-road to the Trent, on or towards the east by the said Gainsborough-road leading from Winthorpe School to Langford-lane End, on or towards the south by a straight line from Winthorpe School to the river Trent, and on or towards the west by the river Trent.

*Staffordshire.*—(1.) So much of the parishes or townships of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall, Castle Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Coton-in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-Trent, Drakelow, and Croxall, in the county of Derby, and of the parish of Edingale, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway Bridge, turning along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Stanton-road, thence to the right

along Stanton-road through Stanton village by the Gate Inn to Cadley Hill four cross roads, thence to the right along the road by Cadley Hill farm in the occupation of Robert William Beard to Cauldwell village, turning to the left along the road by Cauldwell Hall to the First Three-lane Ends, thence again to the left up the lane for Linton by the Square-and-Compass Inn to a point opposite Burton's Old Chapel, thence to the right up the road through the village of Linton by the Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by the fence to the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along the boundary fence to where it intersects the road from Grange Wood to Lullington near the residence of Dr. Barstable, thence to the right along the road by Wood Fields farm to Lullington village, by the Gas Works, to the left by Lullington Church, to the right down the lane for Edingale by Westbrook farm Edingale fields to Edingale village, through the village by Holly Bush and Black Horse Inns and Kinson's shop to Edingale School, then along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to and along the river Mease to its junction with the Trent, and turning to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

*Alterations in Tidal Signals at Calais.*

THE French Government has given notice, dated 21st June, 1882, that on 15th July, 1882, the following alterations will be made in the tidal signals at Calais:—

Tidal lights of the fifth order will be exhibited from the top of an iron tower, 19 feet high, painted white, and situated at the outer extremity of the eastern pier of Calais Harbour.

These lights are elevated 27 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The depths above low water will be indicated by these lights, as follows:—

A fixed red light will indicate less than  $6\frac{1}{2}$  feet, but tide rising.

A fixed green light will indicate less than  $6\frac{1}{2}$  feet, but tide falling.

A fixed white light will indicate depths of from  $6\frac{1}{2}$  to  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet.

A fixed white light varied by groups of red and green flashes will indicate depths of more than  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet.

NOTE.—The groups of flashes will be separated by intervals of five minutes, and the flashes in each group by intervals of eighty seconds; each red flash will indicate an additional rise of  $3\frac{1}{4}$  feet, and each green flash an additional rise of three-quarters of a foot.

While the tide is rising the fixed light (of each colour) will be eclipsed for a short interval every eighty seconds, and when the tide is falling, it will be eclipsed twice in quick succession every eighty seconds: these eclipses will occur nearly in the middle of the intervals separating groups of flashes. No eclipse will take place at or about high water.

On the same date on which the above night signals will be exhibited, the day tidal signals will be shown when there is a depth of more than  $6\frac{1}{2}$  feet in the channel, and will indicate whether the tide is rising or falling, and also, changes of three-quarters of a foot in the depth.

THE French Government has given notice, dated 15th June, 1882, that two leading lights have been established on the left bank of La Vilaine River, near Trehiguier, and exhibited from square towers of masonry, recently constructed.

The western of these lights is a fixed white light, elevated 25 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles; it is situated on the extremity of Seal Point.

The eastern light is a fixed red light, situated 480 yards distant from the western light: it is elevated 68 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by means of reflectors.

These lights are in line when bearing S.  $49^{\circ}$  E., and indicate the course to be pursued; the eastern light is only visible over an arc of 28 degrees, or from S.  $35^{\circ}$  E. to S.  $63^{\circ}$  E.

(2.) *Alteration in Character of Penlan Point Light.*

Also, that the present light shown at Penlan Point, entrance of La Vilaine River, will be discontinued, and replaced by a light exhibited from the top of a square tower, constructed of masonry, standing close to the former light tower.
