THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected*
with *Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-

mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within
those areas as far as those lines are used or re-
quired for the transit of animals through those
areas, without untrucking):—

Cheshire.—So much of the township of Newton, in
the county of Chester, as lies within the follow-
ing boundaries, that is to say, Hoole-road to
Kilmorey-road, along Browns fence to Brook
lane, along the brook to James Dickson and
Son's boundary fence, to Well-lane, to Newton
Hall, and along Barnes fence and Cinder-road
to Hoole-road aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) At Sandiacre, in the county of
Derby, comprised within the following bounda-
ries, that is to say, from a point on the Sandi-
acre and Stanton main-road known as Orchard
Head Hill to a foot-path crossing two fields
known as Lady Cross and Freezland in the
occupation of William Sław junior to Forster's
house, along the highway to the Derby and
Nottingham-road, thence to a foot-path in the
parish of Risley opposite Garrat's farm, by the
right to Heaton's farm and No Mans-lane,
thence by a fence to Stanton Hall sheds taking
the fence by the right to the Stanton and Sandi-
acre main-road at Orchard Head Hill aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parishes or townships
of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall, Castle
Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Coton-
in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-
Trent, Drakelow, and Croxall, in the county of
Derby, and of the parish of Edingale, in the
county of Stafford, as lies within the following
boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow
Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch
of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway
Bridge, turning along the boundary of the
borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Stanton-road,
thence to the right along Stanton-road through
Stanton village by the Gate Inn to Cadley Hill
four cross roads, thence to the right along the
road by Cadley Hill farm in the occupation of
Robert William Beard to Cauldwell village,
turning to the left along the road by Cauldwell
Hall to the First Three-lane Ends, thence
again to the left up the lane for Linton by the
Square-and-Compass Inn to a point opposite
Burton's Old Chapel, thence to the right up
the road through the village of Linton by the
Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by
the fence to the boundary of the counties of
Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along
the boundary fence to where it intersects the
road from Grange Wood to Lullington near
the residence of Dr. Barstable, thence to the
right along the road by Wood Fields farm to
Lullington village, by the Gas Works, to the
left by Lullington Church, to the right down
the lane for Edingale by Westbrook farm
Edingale fields to Edingale village, through
the village by Holly Bush and Black Horse
Inns and Kinson's shop to Edingale School,
then along the boundary of the counties of
Derby and Stafford to and along the river
Mease to its junction with the Trent, and
turning to the right along the river Trent to
Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

Flintshire.—The whole of the farm known as
The Dee Side House farm, situate in the town-
ship of Sealand, in the parish of Hawarden, in
the petty sessional division of Hawarden, in the
county of Flint, bounded on the south-west by
the river Dee, on the north-west and north-
east by an embankment known as The Old
Bank with a water-course running parallel

thereto, and on the south-east by a farm known as Wood farm.

Lancashire.—(1.) So much of the township of Spotland, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary line of Reaps Moss Spotland from Todmorden and Walsden on the north, Old Road farm Troughgate Bacup on the south, Old Home farm and New Hill farm near Under Shore Shawforth on the east, and Dry Corner farm and Hey Head farm Bacup on the west.

(2.) So much of the township of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Crompton and Butterworth from Whitfield Bottoms to Jep Wood on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Jubilee to Smallbrook on the east, the footpath to Lower and Higher Rushcroft on the south, and the footpath by Mossgate and Whitfield Hey to Whitfield Bottoms aforesaid on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Butterworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cleggswood-lane and New Barns farm on the north, Hollingworth Lake Bank by Beach Hotel and Cleggswood Hey farm on the south, Fisherman's Hotel and Cleggswood on the east, and Three-lane Ends and Royal Oak Beerhouse on the west.

Leicestershire.—(1.) The whole of the parish of Welham, in the county of Leicester.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Slawston, in the county of Leicester.

(3.) So much of the parish of Humberstone, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the north, the turnpike-road from Leicester to Uppingham on the south, the road from the said turnpike-road to Humberstone on the east, and the road from the said turnpike-road past the borough Asylum to the said road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the west.

(4.) So much of the parish of Beeby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Beeby to South Croxton on the north, the road leading from Beeby to Hungarton on the south, a footpath leading from Keyham to South Croxton on the east, and the village of Beeby on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Gaddesby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain arable and pasture land in the occupation of E. H. Cheney on the north and east, certain arable and pasture land in the occupation of E. H. Cheney, J. Smith, and William Walpole on the west, and Gaddesby brook on the south.

(6.) So much of the parish of Barkby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Ridgemere-road on the north, the road leading from Barkby village to Beeby village on the south, the road leading from Beeby village to South Croxton village on the east, and a fence, and certain fields in the occupation of Mr. Talbot on the west.

Lincolnshire (Kesteven).—(1.) So much of the parishes of Caythorpe, and Fulbeck, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Fulbeck-road, the highway leading from Leadenham to Sleaford, and an arable field in the occupation of Richard Bestall, Byards Leap, to the Cranwell

Lodge-road on the north, the said Cranwell Lodge-road and Gorse-lane on or towards the east, Caythorpe Heath-road to Henry Barnes cottages on the south, and an imaginary line from the said Henry Barnes cottages to the Foreman's house at F. M. Pogson's farm premises, Caythorpe Heath, thence by corn-fields to Henry Burt's farm buildings, Fulbeck, and a grass field to Fulbeck-road aforesaid on the west.

(2.) 2. All such Reply Post Cards as are hereinbefore referred to shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions contained in the schedule hereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS, Conditions, Prohibitions, and Restrictions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of Reply Post Cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by Post within the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man.

1. Reply Post Cards with an impressed stamp of one halfpenny on each half thereof shall be issued by the Postmaster-General, and the Cards so issued, and no others, shall be deemed to be

Reply Post Cards within the meaning of this Warrant.

2. The address, and nothing else, shall, after the issue of a Reply Post Card, be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on that side of either half thereof which bears the impressed stamp, and no part of the address shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed across such stamp.

3. Anything (including a letter or communication in the nature of a letter) may be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on that side of each half of a Reply Post Card which does not bear the impressed stamp.

4. Nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a Reply Post Card, nor shall a Reply Post Card after the issue thereof be cut or folded or otherwise altered, except that that half of a Reply Post Card which is intended to be used for the purpose of a Reply (in these Regulations referred to as "the Return half"), may be severed from the other half thereof.

5. If any Reply Post Card or the Return half thereof is sent by Post otherwise than in conformity with these Regulations it shall be enclosed in a sealed cover and forwarded to its destination charged on delivery with postage as an insufficiently paid letter of the same weight.

6. In the case of the re-direction of a Reply Post Card, or the Return half thereof, made by an Officer of the Post Office to a place within the same free delivery as the original address, no re-direction postage shall be charged.

7. In any case (not within the last preceding Regulation) of the re-direction of a Reply Post Card, or the Return half thereof, a re-direction postage shall be charged and paid of one half-penny, and such postage may be either prepaid by an adhesive Stamp or may be collected on the delivery of the Reply Post Card or the Return half thereof.

8. Where the despatch or delivery from a Post Office of letters would be delayed by the despatch or delivery therefrom at the same time of Reply Post Cards or the Return halves thereof, the same or any of them may be detained in the Post Office until the despatch or delivery next following that by which they would ordinarily be despatched or delivered.

9. There shall not be sent or forwarded by post any Reply Post Card or Return half thereof having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character, and if any Reply Post Card or Return half thereof shall be posted which shall *prima facie* fall within the aforesaid prohibition, it shall be stopped and submitted at the General Post Office to the inspection of an Officer duly authorized in that behalf by the Postmaster-General.
