IT is hereby notified that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Note from the Government of the Republic of Honduras, dated the 30th of April, 1882, of which the following is a translation:—

*Ministry of Foreign Affairs,
Republic of Honduras,
Valle de Angeles, April 30, 1882.*

M. LE MINISTRE,

MY Government finding itself in an exceptional position with regard to the Consular Agents accredited to your Excellency's Government before 1876, and being desirous of putting the Consular Service in order, has been obliged to issue the following Decree of the same date as this letter which I now have the honour to communicate to your Excellency.

*" Secretary of State's Office,
" Department of Foreign Affairs,
" Valle de Angeles, April 30, 1882.*

" WHEREAS the greater part of the documents dated before August 27, 1876, forming the National Archives, were lost during the political disturbances; whereas through that loss the present Government has been unable to find a register of the Diplomatic and Consular Agents accredited to Foreign Governments; whereas documents expressing the concurrence (of Foreign Governments), in such appointments have likewise not been found; whereas the Government has long hoped to receive communications from the Consuls it supposes to have been appointed, which communications would enable it to consider such persons as Consuls, and enter their names in the proper register; and whereas during so long a period of time no such communications have been received, although the Government has private though vague information of the existence of Consular Agents abroad, whose names it does not however know:

" Now, therefore, the President decrees:—1st. The appointments of all the Consuls of the Republic, bearing date before the 27th of August, 1876, are cancelled, with the exception of those of the few Consular Agents whose appointments may have been registered in the Department of Foreign Affairs; and 2nd. The Secretary for Foreign Affairs shall make the necessary communication to the Ministers of State abroad, in such manner that this Decree shall be officially transmitted to them, and also have given to it the greatest possible publicity abroad,

" so that Consuls holding appointments who are not in communication with this Government may have full knowledge of the withdrawal of their letters of appointment, and so that foreigners and citizens of Honduras living abroad may equally know it.

" To be communicated and registered under the hand of the President. " ROSA."

As the exceptional circumstances of the case preclude the possibility of this department addressing itself officially to the Consuls appointed before 1876, I venture to request your Excellency to withdraw the exequaturs of such Consular Agents, and further,—if there is no objection to so doing,—to order the publication of the Decree I have communicated to you in the official and semi-official papers of your country, so that every one, whether a citizen of Honduras or a foreigner having any interest in the Consular service of Honduras, may know what to do in regard to the resolution adopted by my Government, and so that every mistake which might arise and cause damage to private individuals, and even bring responsibility on the Republic, may be avoided.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

An area comprising so much of the parishes or townships of Newton Solney, Bretby, and Wins-hill, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Unicorn Inn Newton Solney up Newton-lane by Mr. Spooner's farm to the top, thence to the right

along Bretby-lane by wheelwright's shop to the point where it intersects the boundary line of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent near Moat Bank House, thence to the right along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent at Winshill to the river Trent, to the right along the river Trent to a point opposite Smedley House at Newton Solney, thence to the right in a straight line from that point to Smedley's-lane, and up that lane by the Plough Inn and blacksmith's shop to the Unicorn Inn aforesaid.

Stafford and Warwick and the boundary of the borough of Tamworth to the starting point,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

1. The limits of the following Areas which are declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—(1.) the petty sessional division of Elford, except the portion of the parish of Edingale which lies on the northern side of the highway from Lullington through Edingale village to Croxall; (2.) the townships of Dunstall, Barton-under-Needwood, and Wichnor, and the parishes of Yoxall, King's Bromley, and Armitage, in the county of Stafford; (3.) the whole of the township of Branstone, in the county of Stafford, except such part thereof as is within the borough of Burton-upon-Trent; (4.) the whole of the borough of Lichfield, in the county of Stafford; (5.) the parishes of Mavesyn Ridware, Pipe Ridware, and Hamstall Ridware, in the county of Stafford; (6.) the townships of Tatenhill, and Scropton, and so much of the townships of Rolleston, and Anslow, and of the parishes of Hanbury, and Tutbury, as lies to the east of the turnpike-road from Yoxall to Sudbury, to the west of the highway from Tatenhill village to Anslow, and to the south of the highway from Anslow to Hanbury Wood End, and thence to Newborough, all in the county of Stafford; and (7.) the parishes of Farewell, Longdon, Rugeley, and

King's Bromley Hays, the townships of Burntwood (including Edial and Woodhouses), and Curborough and Elmhurst, and so much of the parish of Cannock as lies on the eastern side of the highway from the boundary of the parish of Rugeley near Hednesford Pool through Hednesford and Heath Hays to Norton Common, all in the county of Stafford;—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the township of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Crompton and Butterworth from Whitfield Bottoms to Jep Wood on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Jubilee to Smallbrook on the east, the footpath to Lower and Higher Rushcroft on the south, and the footpath by Mossgate and Whitfield Hey to Whitfield Bottoms aforesaid on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Alexandria, stating that in consequence of the occurrence of cases of cholera at Aden and Cameran, on board of a vessel from Bombay, the Sanitary Board have decided to impose quarantine against arrivals from Bombay, and provisionally against Aden, pending further details; the quarantine to be seven days for infected vessels to be undergone at Tor, and in other cases according to a fixed scale, and to be undergone at Moses' Wells. Vessels eight days out to undergo only six days' quarantine, nine days out five days, and so on. Vessels taking thirteen days or upwards only to undergo twenty-four hours' observation.
