for the old parish church, also dedicated to Saint

Mary the Virgin, of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nincteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-two, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instrument under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, of the said George Cubitt, and of the said William Alexander Keith, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Mary the Virgin, situate within the said parish of Burham, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Mary the Virgin as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Burham, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Mary the Virgin, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church, dedicated to Saint Mary the Virgin as aforesaid, of the said parish of Burham, or to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Mary the Virgin

(now being, by virtue of these presents, the parish church of the said parish of Burham), and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said George Cubitt and William Alexander Keith have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals, this twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
